- 1. Enter the service you are proposing to provide. These are the services which are currently approved in the park: Commercial Tours with Interpretive Guide and Photography/Painting Workshops.
- 2. Respond "No" or list other parks where you will be providing this service.
- 3. Enter the legal name of your business. If you have a secondary name under which you are doing business (d.b.a.), please enter that name also.
- 4. Give the name(s) of persons designated as Authorized Agents for your business. This may include the on-site general manager responsible for day to day operations.
- Provide contact information for both the main season and the off-season. Over the term of your authorization, it may be
 necessary to contact you to obtain or share information. Your contact information may also be published in the NPS
 Commercial Services Directory.
- 6. Check the box that identifies your type of business.
- 7. If the state in which you operate or the state where your business is domiciled requires a state business license, provide the license number and year of expiration.
- 8. Provide your Employer Identification Number (EIN). The Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 requires us to collect an EIN or Social Security Number (SSN). The NPS will not collect SSNs, only EINs. The EIN is issued by the Internal Revenue Service. You may receive a free EIN at http://www.irs.gov/Businesses/Small-Businesses-&-Self-Employed/How-to-Apply-for-an-EIN. We will use the EIN that you provide as needed to collect debts.
- 9. Provide proof of General Liability Insurance naming the United States of America, as additional insured in the amounts designated in the application. Provide proof of vehicle/vessel/aircraft liability insurance, if required by law, or if visitors are transported by vehicle/vessel/aircraft within the park, or if vehicle/vessel/aircraft are engaged in providing the service (i.e., hauling horses used in the activity). Insurance companies must be rated at least A- by the most recent edition of A.M. Best's Key Insurance Reports (Property-Casualty edition) or similar insurance rating companies (Moody's, Standard and Poor's, or Fitch). Refer to "Attachment B".
- 10. Provide a description of and registration number of each vehicle/vessel/aircraft you will utilize during the course of the proposed commercial service.
- 11. Provide copies of all licenses, vehicle/vessel registration, and certificates of training as required by "Attachment A".
- 12. NPS Management Policy prohibits employees of the NPS and their spouses and minor children from acquiring or retaining any authorization for conducting commercial services in a park area.
- 13. If your business or business owners or current employees or proposed employees have been convicted or are currently under charges for violation of State, Federal, or local law or regulation in the last 5 years, please give details (does not include minor traffic tickets).
- 14. Include payment of the Application/Administrative Fee (see "Attachment C" Fee Schedule and Payment Information).
- 15. Please sign and date your application. If the person SIGNING this application is an Authorized Agent for the business, proof of signing authority must accompany this application.

Additional Information: The National Park Service has terms and conditions on all commercial service agreements. The following terms and conditions will apply to all Commercial Use Authorizations. There may be additional terms and conditions based on the services provided. These may include but are not limited to limits on locations, times, group size, and employee licenses and certifications and providing such information to the park superintendent for approval.

CONDITIONS OF THIS AUTHORIZATION

1. False Information: The holder is prohibited from knowingly giving false information. To do so will be considered a breach of conditions and be grounds for revocation: [RE: 36 CFR 2.32(a) (3)].

- 2. Legal Compliance: The holder shall exercise this privilege subject to the supervision of the park area Superintendent. The holder shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations of the area and terms and conditions of the authorization. The holder must acquire all permits or licenses of State or local government, as applicable, necessary to provide the services described above, and, must operate in compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws and regulations, including, without limitation, all applicable park area policies, procedures and regulations.
- 3. Rates: The holder shall provide commercial services under this authorization to visitors at reasonable rates and under operating conditions satisfactory to the area Superintendent.
- 4. Liabilities and Claims: This authorization is issued upon the express condition that the United States, its agents and employees shall be free from all liabilities and claims for damages and/or suits for or by reason of any injury, injuries, or death to any person or persons or property of any kind whatsoever, whether to the person or property of the holder, its agents or employees, or third parties, from any cause or causes whatsoever while in or upon said premises or any part thereof during the term of this authorization or occasioned by any occupancy or use of said premises or any activity carried on by the holder in connection herewith, and the holder hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless the United States, its agents, and employees from all liabilities, charges, expenses and costs on account of or by reason of any such injuries, deaths, liabilities, claims, suits or losses however occurring or damages growing out of the same.
- 5. Insurance: Holder agrees to carry general liability insurance against claims occasioned by the action or omissions of the holder, its agents and employees in carrying out activities and operations under this authorization. The policy shall name the United States of America as additional insured. Holder agrees to have on file with the park copies of the above insurance with the proper endorsements.
- 6. Fees: Holder shall reimburse the park for all costs incurred by the park as a result of accepting and processing the application and managing and monitoring the authorization activity. Administrative costs for the application process must be paid when the application is submitted. Monitoring fees and any additional costs incurred by the park to support the commercial activity will be paid annually.
- 7. **Benefit:** No member of, or delegate to, Congress, or Resident Commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this authorization or to any benefit that may arise from this authorization. This restriction shall not be construed to extend to this Contract if made with a corporation or company for its general benefit.
- 8. Transfer: This authorization may not be transferred or assigned without the written consent of the park area Superintendent.
- 9. Termination: This authorization may be terminated upon breach of any of the conditions herein or at the discretion of the park area Superintendent.
- **10. Preference or Exclusivity:** The holder is not entitled to any preference to renewal of this authorization except to the extent otherwise expressly provided by law. This authorization is not exclusive and is not a concession contract.
- **11. Construction:** The holder shall not construct any structures, fixtures or improvements in the park area. The holder shall not engage in any groundbreaking activities without the express, written approval of the park area Superintendent.
- 12. Reporting: The holder is to provide the park area Superintendent upon request (and, in any event, immediately after expiration of this authorization) a statement of its gross receipts from its activities under this authorization and any other specific information related to the holder's operations that the park area superintendent may request, including but not limited to, visitor use statistics, and resource impact assessments.
- 13. Accounting: The holder is to maintain an accounting system under which its accounts can be readily identified within its system of accounts classification. This accounting system must be capable of providing the information required by this authorization. The holder grants the United States of America access to its books and records at any time for the purpose of determining compliance with the terms and conditions of this authorization.
- **14. Minimum Wage:** The holder is required to adhere to Executive Order 13658 Establishing a Minimum Wage for Contractors, as applicable. The <u>implementing regulations</u>, including the applicable authorization clause, are incorporated by reference into this contract as if fully set forth in this contract and available at https://federalregister.gov/a/2014-23533.

15. Visitor Acknowledgment of Risks (VAR): The holder is not permitted to require clients to sign a waiver of liability statement or form, insurance disclaimer, and/or indemnification agreement waiving the client's right to hold the CUA holder responsible for accidents or injury occurring on NPS property. The holder is permitted to request or require a client to sign a form or statement acknowledging risk and/or indicating that certain prerequisite skills may be needed to participate in the commercial activity. The holder must provide the park with the current copy of all forms and/or statements used for this purpose and obtain written approval by the park. A sample Acknowledgment of Risk form may be obtained by contacting the CUA office at (505) 334-6174 x228 or by going to the park CUA webpage.

- 16. Intellectual Property of the National Park Service: Except with the written authorization of the Director of the National Park Service, the Holder shall not assert any legal claim that the Holder or any related entity holds a trademark, tradename, servicemark or other ownership interest in the words "National Park Service", the initials "NPS", or official name of any unit or part thereof, including but not limited to any facility, logo, distinctive natural, archaeological, cultural, or historic site, within the National Park System, or any colorable likeness thereof, or the likeness of a National Park Service official uniform, badge, logo, or insignia.
- **17. Nondiscrimination:** The holder must comply with Applicable Laws relating to nondiscrimination in providing visitor services to the public and with all equal employment opportunity provisions of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended.

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

Authority: The authority to collect information on the attached form is derived from 16 U.S.C. 5966, Commercial Use Authorizations.

Purpose: The purposes of the system are (1) to assist NPS employees in managing the National Park Service Commercial Services program allowing commercial uses within a unit of the National Park System to ensure that business activities are conducted in a manner that complies with Federal laws and regulations; (2) to monitor resources that are or may be affected by the authorized commercial uses within a unit of the National Park System; (3) to track applicants and holders of commercial use authorizations who are planning to conduct or are conducting business within units of the National Park System; and (4) to provide to the public the description and contact information for businesses that provide services in national parks.

Routine Uses: In addition to those disclosures generally permitted under 5 U.S.C.552a(b) of the Privacy Act, records or information contained in this system may be disclosed outside the National Park Service as a routine use pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552a(b)(3) to other Federal, State, territorial, local, tribal, or foreign agencies and other authorized organizations and individuals based on an authorized routine use when the disclosure is compatible with the purpose for which the records were compiled as described under the system of records notice for this system.

We estimate that it will take approximately 2.5 hours to prepare an application, including time to review instructions, gather and maintain data, and complete and review the proposal. SPECIAL PARK CONDITIONS COMMERCIAL USE AUTHORIZATION

1. Operational Requirements:

All vehicles must be kept on established paved roadways, and there shall be no interference with pedestrians or other traffic in the park.

Protection of Park Resources: Alteration of any park features (to allow set-up of equipment, enhance setting, etc.) is strictly prohibited. Littering is prohibited. Participants are to leave as little evidence of their visit as possible and properly dispose of refuse. The permittee shall be liable for any damages to property of the United States resulting from the activities authorized hereunder.

2. Closures and Public Use Limits:

Workshops may set up at the designated picnic area including the shade shelters. They may not set up behind the administrative offices, in the maintenance area, behind locked gates, near water tanks, beyond fences, on service roads, or in construction areas.

Permitted groups are sharing visitor facilities with the general public. This permit does not convey any priority use of trails. Permittees should advise clients to stay on trails, walk single file, and allow the public to pass.

3. Accidents and Incidents:

All accidents or medical incidents are to be reported to the visitor center as soon as possible.

4. Workshop Instructors:

Workshop instructors shall be certified in CPR and first-aid care, as well as fully acquainted with park regulations and support compliance with said regulations.

5. Safety Notice:

Permittee shall make available to all participants a general safety notice addressing all aspects of safety during their visit. Walking tours must include a warning on low doorways, short sections of stairs, and a reminder to stay on the trail for resource protection. Workshop participants should be advised to drink lots of water, eat snacks, and wear hats and sunscreen to minimize sun exposure. The safety notice shall include that information on the park, including safety information, is available at the visitor center during normal working hours. The National Park Service reserves the right to review safety information.

6. Camping:

No camping is available or permitted within the boundaries of Aztec Ruins National Monument.

7. Monitoring:

The superintendent shall have the right to monitor permittee's activity for compliance with all aspects of this permit. Instructors shall carry a copy of the approved CUA and present it to any park official upon request. **Monitoring costs may be charged.** These costs start when the permittee arrives in the area to perform the permitted use and ends when the permitted use is over and the permittee leaves the area. This includes all costs for personnel and material, as well as all follow-up needed in returning the area to its original condition. Monitoring costs would vary depending on park staff involved. A Park Ranger would cost approximately \$50.00 per hour. Monitoring fees are not charged if the permittees remain in public use areas during regular open hours and adhere to the conditions in this attachment.

8. Resource Protection Message:

All permittees are required to communicate the following messages to clients receiving interpretive service:

- a. Collecting or removing from the park any natural or cultural resource, or damaging or defacing any natural or cultural resource is prohibited.
- b. Stay on the trail in order to protect delicate vegetation and soils.
- c. Take only pictures leave no evidence of your visit.
- d. No food or beverage other than water is allowed in the archeological site.
- e. Smoking is only allowed in the designated area (west side of parking lot).
- f. Vehicles must not idle their engines when parked. Vehicles that sit with engines idling create unacceptable amounts of noise and air pollution within Aztec Ruins National Monument.

9. Cultural Resources:

Participants should avoid harming cultural resources by refraining from touching or placing any material on archeological features, such as walls.

10. Vegetation:

Participants should be made aware of the values and sensitivities of cryptobiotic crust soils and avoid trampling on them. Participants should also respect signs or other obvious indications that an area is being revegetated or restored by staying on designated pathways or areas already impacted by human use.

11. Wildlife:

Participants should be made aware that approaching or enticing wildlife is illegal and dangerous. Participants should respect wildlife at a distance and avoid harassing the wildlife.

12. No Right of Renewal:

No right of renewal attaches hereto. Upon expiration of this permit, the viability of this service inside the park shall be reviewed and the superintendent shall determine if authorization of this service shall continue under an Incidental Business Permit. If a determination is made to continue the service under this type of authorization, permittee may then apply for a new permit.

13. Driver & Guide Responsibilities:

It is the responsibility of the permittee to ensure that all employees are informed of, understand, and abide by the conditions of the permit. Any permit condition violations can result in punitive action (fine, revocation of permit and or arrest) against both the representative (guide), and the permittee. The individual designated as the leader shall be certified in CPR and First Aid.

14. Visitation and Review Survey:

The permittee is required to provide an accurate accounting of visitation and revenue earned within Aztec Ruins National Monument at the end of each visit.

15. Photographs:

Photographs taken by the permittee for advertising or sales purposes may not involve activities that interfere with other visitors and may not depict activities that are illegal, unsafe, or result in damage to natural or cultural resources.

ATTACHMENT B CUA Insurance Requirements

Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance

Liability insurance is required for all CUA holders under the terms of the authorization. Such insurance should be of sufficient scope to cover all potential risks and in an amount to cover claims that can reasonably be expected in the event of serious injury or death. The minimum liability insurance is \$1,000,000.00. Liability insurance policies must name the United States of America as additional insured. The business or person that is providing the service must be the named insured (policy holder).

Automobile Liability Insurance

If a CUA holder transports passengers or uses a vehicle in the performance of the service in the park, they are required to have Automobile Liability insurance. The auto liability insurance must include coverage of "owned, leased, rented or hired" vehicles if the CUA holder rents or leases vehicles. The minimum commercial auto liability insurance for passenger transport is reflected in the following table:

Commercial Vehicle Insurance – Passenger Transport	Minimum per Occurrence Liability

7 – 15 passengers	\$1,500,000

^{*} Indicated minimum per occurrence liability limit or minimum State liability requirement (for intrastate operations only).

Commercial auto insurance provides:

- Liability insurance, which includes coverage for bodily injury, property damage, uninsured motorists, and underinsured motorists;
- 2. Physical damage insurance, which includes collision insurance; and;
- 3. Other coverage, which includes medical payments, towing and labor, rental reimbursement, and auto loan coverage.

Taxis that do not provide tour services are only required to have Auto Liability insurance. The Commercial General Liability covers out of vehicle activities and taxis do not provide out of vehicle activities.

Insurance Company Minimum Standards

The NPS has established the following minimum insurance company requirements. All insurance companies must meet the following minimum standards. These standards apply to foreign insurance companies as well as domestic companies.

- 1. All insurers for all coverages must be rated no lower than A- by the most recent edition of Best's Key Rating Guide (Property-Casualty edition), or similar insurance rating companies (Moody's, Standard and Poor's, or Fitch), unless otherwise authorized by the Service.
- 2. All insurers for all coverages must have Best's Financial Size Category of at least VII according to the most recent edition of Best's Key Rating Guide (Property-Casualty edition), or similar insurance rating companies (Moody's, Standard and Poor's, or Fitch), unless otherwise authorized by the Service
- 3. The insurance ratings must be submitted with the CUA Application. The rating companies do not issue certificates. We require the insurance broker to note this rating in the Certificate. If the rating does not appear on the certificate, the insurance broker must provide it in another document.

Proof of Insurance Submission

Applicants must submit proof of insurance with the CUA Application. The proof of insurance must:

- 1. Be written in English with monetary amounts reflected in USD
- 2. Reflect that insurance coverage is effective at time of CUA Application submission
- 3. Name as insured the business or person that is providing the service
- 4. Name the United States as additionally insured
- 5. Reflect a General Commercial Liability Policy with the minimum coverage amount required in the CUA Application
- 6. Reflect required additional insurances (commercial vehicle, vessel, aircraft, etc.) with the minimum coverage amount required in the CUA Application
- 7. Include insurance provider rating or provide in separate document

ATTACHMENT C Fee Schedule and Payment Information

Fee Schedule: Each Commercial Use Authorization is valid for one year from the date of authorization. To avoid a lapse in authorized park use, plan to submit the "Commercial Use Authorization application" at least two weeks before the previous authorization expires.

Additional Fees:

- Application Fee (included with this information packet): \$100. This nonrefundable fee covers all expenses to process the
 application.
- Administration Fee(s): In addition to the application fee, additional administration fees may be required for permits. Generally
 speaking, simple permits will not require an additional administration fee, but more complicated and complex permits will be
 charged the additional administration fees in the amount of \$50/hr of NPS staff time spent on the permit and working with the
 permittee.
- Monitoring/Ranger Escort Fee(s): In addition to the application and administration fees there may be additional fees required if
 the permit requires the escort or monitoring by NPS staff.
 - For Commercial Tours, an annual monitoring audit will be scheduled, with associated fee of \$50/hr. The park reserves the right to request additional audits as needed to ensure that CUA requirements are being met.
 - For Photography/Painting Workshops, a monitoring fee at the rate of \$50/hr will be required. Workshops may not necessitate a full hour of monitoring.
 - For additional types of commercial use activities, or for complex activities, the minimum monitoring/escort fee is \$150/day which covers ranger fees for up to 3 hours. Time required for monitoring or escort beyond 3 hours will be charged at \$50/hour.
 - For commercial use activities that are off-trail or where resource protection needs are indicated, NEPA monitoring may be required. NEPA administration fees are estimated to be \$200, with an additional NEPA monitoring fee of \$50/hr.
- Cancellation/Schedule Change Fee(s): Permits that involve NPS staff supervision and administration will be charged a \$200 cancellation or schedule change fee when the permittee cancels or requests a schedule change less than 36 hours prior to the scheduled permit. This is applicable for each instance when the permittee cancels or changes the permit schedule.
