Big Bend National Park

Annual Visitation, 1944-2007

Big Bend has long been considered one of the most remote and least visited of the national parks in the continental United States. Established during World War Two, travel to the park was initially limited both by gas rationing and limited facilities. The park's isolated location, far from urban centers and interstate highways, continues to play an important role in annual visitation.

In modern years visitation is busiest from November through April, with March generally being the busiest month.
