**January 24 “Mister Roberts”** - This hilarious  
and heartfelt military comedy-drama stars Henry  
Fonda as an officer who’s yearning for battle, but is  
stuck in the backwaters of World War II on a  
noncommissioned Navy ship run by the bullying  
Capt. Morton (James Cagney). Featuring Jack  
Lemmon in a star-making role, and William Powell  
in his last screen appearance.



**January 31 “The Great Ships”** - Witness the  
terror that sailors felt after spotting a skull-and-  
crossbones flag in this fascinating look at piracy in  
the late 17th and early 18th centuries. Sneaky and  
deadly dangerous, renegade sailors ruined the  
careers and lives of many law-abiding mariners.



**February 7 “Endurance”** - In 1914, Sir Ernest  
Shackleton set sail on the *Endurance* with 27 men  
aboard, aiming to cross the Antarctic continent on  
foot. But when the vessel becomes stranded in  
frigid waters, the crew begins a battle of the human  
spirit, testing the very limits of their strength.

Miraculously, they succeed, even capturing the experience in pictures  
and on film as they fight to overcome debilitating setbacks.



**February 14 “Fly Away Home”** - Inspired by a  
true story, this movie serves up thrills and adventure  
along with messages about family ties and independ-  
ence. Thirteen-year-old Amy adopts a flock of  
orphaned Canada geese, and sets out to teach them  
survival skills. Before long, Amy and her inventor dad  
take to the skies in a homemade ultralight aircraft to  
help the gaggle migrate 500 miles to freedom.



**February 21 “The Caine Mutiny”** - Captain  
Queeg: madman or misunderstood taskmaster?  
That’s the dilemma facing the first officer of the  
*U.S.S. Caine* when its stern new captain (Humphrey  
Bogart) drives the crew to the brink of mutiny. Part sea-going adventure,  
part courtroom drama, *The Caine Mutiny* is a tale that is both thrilling  
and thought-provoking. Bogart shines in one of his last roles.



**February 28 “March of the Penguins”** -  
Award-winning photographer Luc Jacquet’s  
stunning documentary provides an insider’s look at  
the life of emperor penguins living in one of the  
harshest climates on the planet. The product of  
more than a year of filming on the Antarctic ice,  
this Oscar-winning documentary reveals never-  
before-captured footage of the penguins’ underwater life and explores  
their steadfast quest for monogamy.
