Field Trip Behavioral Expectations

Leave what you find. Please leave all plants, rocks, animals, and historical artifacts where they are.

Reasons:

- collecting is illegal at all National Park Service sites
- flowers/cones contain seeds for new plants
- rocks provide homes for animals
- animals cannot survive away from their home
- if you leave it, others can enjoy it later

Pack it in, pack it out. Please take all trash (including food) out with you, and dispose of it properly.

Reasons:

- litter can kill animals if they eat it
- if you leave it, others will have to clean up after you
- it can take decades for your litter to break down

Stay on the trail. Please follow your leader and walk single file on trails or rocks. Stay away from edges.

Reasons:

- our soil is alive, and if you step on it you will kill the organisms living in it
- you will be less likely to scare wildlife
- you will not trample plants

Respect all wildlife. Please keep a safe distance from all wildlife and do not feed any animals.

Reasons:

- Colorado National Monument is their home, we need to be good guests
- if animals get used to being fed, they will not be able to fend for themselves
- human food can make animals sick
- the animals here are wild, and their behavior is unpredictable

Respect other visitors. Do not throw rocks. Use quiet voices. *Let nature's sounds be heard.*

Reasons:

- we are not the only visitors in the park, and we want everyone to have a good experience here

Teachers/Leaders should all remember to bring:

- Nametags for each student

- List of students in class and their emergency numbers
- Students' medical information and any medications needed (especially allergies, epipens, etc.)
- Your filled water bottle and extra water for students
- Telephone number of the school

Each student should bring/wear:

- Water Bottle and plenty of water
- Backpack
- Sunscreen
- A Pen or pencil (If planning to journal)
- Clothes to be outside
(appropriate for the weather and to get dirty)
- CLOSED TOED shoes (not even hiking sandals)
