### Leave No Trace

### **Durable Surface Map**

#### Background:

Leave No Trace is a framework for interacting with the natural environment in a sustainable way. The 7 principles of Leave No Trace can be found at: <u>https://lnt.org/why/7-principles/</u>.

This activity supports the development of principle two; Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces.

#### Materials:

- Laminated Surface Cards
- A group meeting space

### Activity:

- 1. Spread out the Surface Cards in an 8x3 rectangle. Make sure the cards are face up.
- 2. Have children walk from one end of the rectangle to the other by only stepping on durable surfaces.
- 3. The game ends when all classmates have made it from one end to the other by only stepping on durable surfaces.

### **Extensions and Modifications:**

- Have the class sort the cards into durable and non-durable. Discuss why each surface is durable or non-durable.
- The Surface Cards can also be used as a memory game. You can have children find exact matches or have them match durable with durable and non-durable with non-durable surfaces.
- For added challenge, limit the number of cards the student can step on.
- To work on listening and communication, have students work in pairs. Partner 1 will be blindfolded and partner 2 will give directions to student number 1. Then have the students switch roles.
