### **Founding Members of Two Local Bands Featured at House Concert**

*Series Finale includes optional tour of unique Hines Hill Campus architecture*

**Brecksville, Ohio** – On Sunday, May 22, 2011, Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP) and the Conservancy for Cuyahoga Valley National Park host their final house concert of the season. The series features former CVNP Artist-in-Residence Ed Caner who serves as both musician and host. Concerts highlight local guest performers and different styles of music in the intimate setting of a restored bank barn on the Hines Hill Campus.

Concerts start at 7 p.m. Doors open at 6:30 p.m. Admission: \$8 adults, \$6 Conservancy members.

Violinist/Fiddler Ed Caner has been labeled by the Cleveland *Plain Dealer* as, "One of the most versatile musicians on the planet." During the past 15 years, he has performed as a sideman for over 50 major acts. Joining Ed this month are accordion player Jen Maurer, leader of the zydeco band *Mo' Mojo*, and singer and guitarist Paul Kovac, founder of *Hillbilly IDOL*.
