Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area

Camp Ken-Etiwa-Pec

1938-1972 515 acres 275 scouts

Orange Mountain Council: scouts from the Oranges, Livingston, Maplewood, Milburn, Short Hills.

Ken-etiwa-pec was thought to mean long pine pond.



Camp Mohican

1926-1976 1,656 acres 288 scouts

Newark Area Council/Robert Treat Council, Newark, New Jersey: scouts from Newark, Elizabeth, and surrounding areas The council moved from an earlier Camp Mohican in the Palisades area of New Jersey.

The council was named for Robert Treat, a founder of the city of Newark in the 1600s.



Camp Cowaw

Chester A. Case Scout Reservation 1940-1969 341 acres 225 scouts

Raritan Council: scouts from northern Middlesex County, Cartaret, Edison, Perth Amboy, Sayreville, South Amboy, Woodbridge. *Cowaw* was thought to mean *little pine tree*.

Case was a scout benefactor.



Camp Pahaquarra

1925-1965/69 742 acres 275 scouts

Trenton and Mercer Council/Trenton, Mercer and Warren Area Council/George Washington Council, Trenton: scouts from Mercer County north to Warren County along the Delaware River.

Pahaquarra was thought to be the Shawnee word for the Gap.



Camp Weygadt Camp Minsi

1921-1969 1,105 acres 270 scouts

Delaware Valley Council: scouts from Easton, Phillipsburg, Wind Gap, Nazareth, the Stroudsburgs. Weygadt was originally two separate camps.

Both camp names honored local geography of the Water Gap.




Patches of Other Camps Nearby
