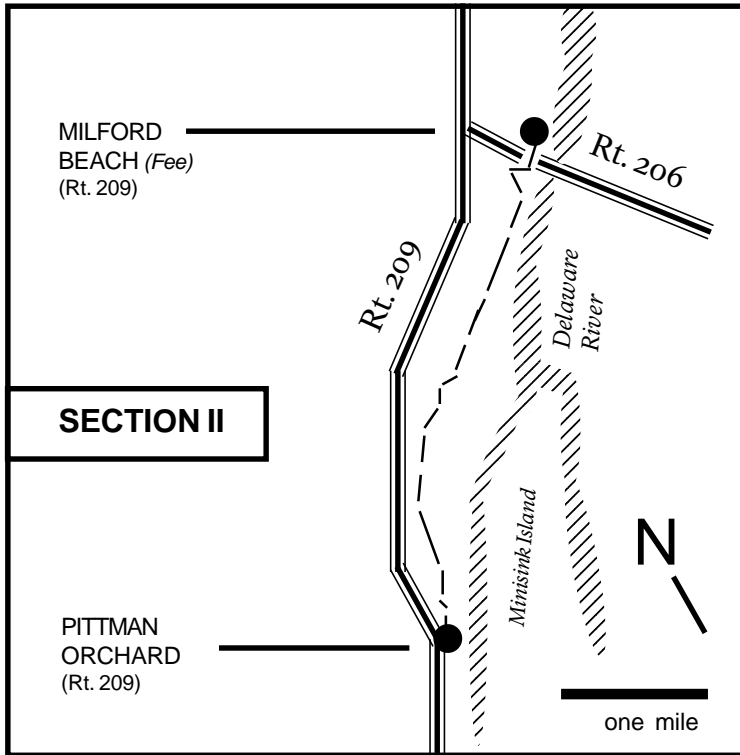




McDade Trail *for biking, hiking, and crosscountry skiing*



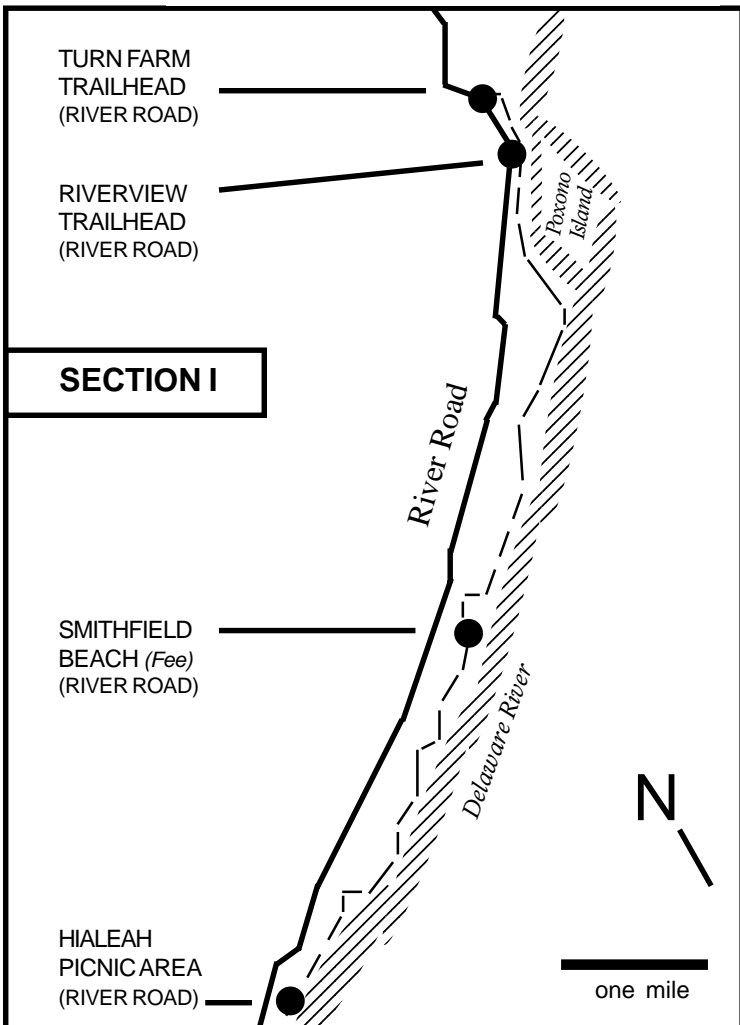
Joseph M. McDade Recreational Trail is a planned recreational trail which, when completed, will extend for 37 miles on the Pennsylvania side of the park. The trail is open to hiking, biking, and crosscountry skiing.

STATUS AS OF SUMMER 2009

Two sections are presently completed and open. *These sections do not interconnect.*

Section I: A section along River Road PA from Hialeah Picnic Area PA to Turn Farm Trailhead PA. This section has a few steep short hills but mostly rises gently northward past fields and through forested sections with footbridges over small creeks. Summer wildflowers are abundant. Restrooms and water in season at Hialeah Picnic area and Smithfield Beach. *(5 miles)*

Section II: A section from Milford Beach PA to Pittman Orchard PA at Rt. 209. *(No parking area at Pittman Orchard.* This section has a steep short hill southbound at Milford Beach but after that is mostly flat, passing fields and an old silo. Restrooms and water in season at Milford Beach. *(2.7 miles)*



Rules of the Road

- Speed limit 15 m.p.h.
- Bikers must yield to hikers!

Pets

- Pets must be on a 6-ft. leash.
- Pets are not permitted from a point 1/4 miles north of the boat launch at the north end of Smithfield Beach, to the first footbridge south of the canoe launch at the south end of Smithfield Beach, from June 1 to September 8 yearly. At other times of the year, pets may pass through Smithfield Beach
