Effigy Mounds National Monument continues the 46th annual Winter Film Festival on Saturday, January 10th, with “Land of the Eagle-Into the Shining Mountains.” Show times for the film are 10:00, 11:00 a.m., 12 noon, 1:00, 2:00, and 3:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday, January 10th and 11th. There will also be a 1:00 p.m. showing on Monday, January 12th.

Each month the festival will feature a selection from the amazing BBC series “Land of the Eagle”. The films were produced as part of the “Atlas of the Natural World” and document the rich history and fascinating events that unfolded during the conquering of the North American continent. This story is told through two sets of eyes, American Indian and European. Spectacular wildlife and scenery are brought to life with engaging stories, period music and history throughout these provoking films.

The festival continues the tradition of displaying art work and crafts in the Monument’s visitor center. This week’s display will be “Birds of the Upper Midwest” and will showcase the wide range of bird species found in the area. Recently designated as an Important Bird Area (IBA) by the Audubon Society, Effigy Mounds National Monument is a perfect place to view the variety of birds in this area of the country. *Admission to the festival is free.*
