In 1869 Ulysses S. Grant was sworn in as the 18th president of the United States. He left office in 1877 after serving two terms. This time period also marked the downfall of the Northern Plains Tribes.

Discussion will involve Grant's Peace Policy, perspectives of the Indians and army, The battle of Little Big Horn and the final defeat of the Indians in 1877. This event will be conducted in the visitor center.
