



Highline Trail

Trail Description

This popular trail follows the Continental Divide below the sawtoothed Garden Wall. Above treeline for most of its length, the route provides dramatic views of the power of glaciers to sculpt the land. Walk a short distance, hike to the meadows of Granite Park, or further on connecting trails. Whatever length of time you spend on the Highline Trail will be time well spent.

Hiker Risks and Responsibilities

Glacier National Park is wild country. Snow, water, and other hazards exist. Obtain current trail information.

Bears, mountain lions, goats, and other wildlife are potentially dangerous. Enjoy them from a safe distance. Make noise to alert bears to your presence and never hike alone. Feeding wildlife is prohibited.

It is your responsibility to know and respect park regulations.

- No pets on trails
- No bikes or wheeled vehicles on trails
- No hunting

A permit is required for backcountry camping.

Leave No Trace

- Plan ahead and prepare.
- Travel and camp on durable surfaces.
- Properly dispose of waste.
- Leave what you find.

- Minimize campfire impacts.
- Respect wildlife
- Be considerate of others.
