In accordance with regulations and the delegated authority provided in Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations (36 CFR), Chapter 1, Parts 1-7, authorized by Title 16 United States Code, Section 3, the following regulatory provisions are established for the proper management, protection, and public use of those portions of Glen Canyon National Recreation Area (NRA) and Rainbow Bridge National Monument (NM) under the jurisdiction of the National Park Service (NPS). Unless otherwise stated, these regulatory provisions apply in addition to the requirements contained in 36 CFR, Chapter 1, Parts 1-7.

The Compendium must be read in conjunction with Title 36 CFR, Chapter 1, Parts 1-7. It cannot be read as a stand alone document. Title 36 CFR can be located at www.gpoaccess.gov/ecfr

In addition to these regulations, the following are also provided:

Written determinations, which explain the reasoning behind the Superintendent's use of discretionary authority, are required by Section 1.5(c) and are located in Appendix A. Appendix A documents are available for review in the Chief Ranger's Office.

As required by 1.7(b), these regulations, permit requirement and written determinations shall be updated annually and made available to the public upon request.

The following is an addendum to the signed Superintendent's Compendium dated May 27, 2009. It changes the Zebra Mussel Interdiction requirements listed under 36 CFR 1.5 (a)(1) and makes an addition to 36 CFR 1.5 (a)(2) regarding launch ramp closures.

TITLE 36 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS

PART 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.5 Closures and public use limits

(a)(1) Visiting hours, public use limits, closures

Zebra Mussel Interdiction: Vessels that have been used within 30 days in states infested with zebra mussels as identified in park information materials will not be allowed on park waters until completion of the prescribed abatement process by Glen Canyon NRA.

The following is required:

- Operators of vehicles towing boat trailers parked within the NRA are required to display on the dashboard of their vehicle a “clean boat” inspection certificate issued by the NPS or authorized inspection service at the following areas:
 - Wahweap
 - Stateline
 - Lone Rock
 - Antelope Point
 - Bullfrog
 - Halls Crossing (May through October)
 - Stanton Creek

- Operators of vehicles towing boat trailers parked within the NRA are required to display on the dashboard of their vehicle a “clean boat” inspection certificate issued by the self certification process, by the NPS or authorized inspection service at the following areas:
 - Hite
 - Halls Crossing (November through April)
 - Lees Ferry
 - All other remote launching areas of the park not indicated above

(a)(2) Designated areas for specific use or activity or conditions

See specific sections in this document for additional information regarding designated areas and conditions for engaging in certain activities.

Launch Ramps:

Unless otherwise posted, the following areas are closed to launching vessels from 5:00 pm to 7:00 am Mountain Standard Time (6:00 pm – 8:00 am Mountain Daylight Savings Time) November through April:

- Wahweap Launch Ramp
- Bullfrog Launch Ramp
- Halls Crossing
