Battle of Harlem Heights

Saturday, Sept. 14, 2013 • 11:30am & 2:30 pm

Learn about this often forgotten - but important - American victory, and how the battle relates to General Washington's early efforts to protect New York City.

A National Park Service ranger will present a 30-minute illustrated presentation in the Media Room at Hamilton Grange. Two presentations will be offered, one at 11:30 a.m. and again at 2:30 p.m. Seating is limited to 25.

Hamilton Grange National Memorial is a dedicated to Alexander Hamilton, who participated in the Battle the Harlem Heights as a young Revolutionary War officer. Years later, would built his home, "The Grange", in the area.

Admission is free!

Plan Your Visit

Hamilton Grange National Memorial, located in St. Nicholas Park on 141st Street between St. Nicholas and Convent avenues, is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Wednesday through Sunday. The visitor center (bookstore, exhibits, restrooms) is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Visitation to the historically furnished floor is limited to 15 visitors at any time. Ranger-led and self-guided options are available.
