Momi is a native Hawaiian practitioner of lomilomi, Hawaiian massage, kapa making, bark cloth, and lā'au lapa'au, medicinal plants. Her focus is Hawaiian ethnobotany, the use of plants by native people. She creates natural herbal products to help the Hawaiian community. Momi's goal is to create a renewed awareness, understanding and use of traditional Hawaiian plants for healing.
