To establish the Herbert Hoover National Historical Site in the State of Iowa.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That, in order to Herbert Hoover preserve in public ownership historically significant properties asso- National Hisciated with the life of Herbert Hoover, the Secretary of the Interior toric Site, Iom may acquire the necessary acres of land or interests in land (including Establishment. scenic easements) in or near West Branch, Iowa, by donation, purchase with donated or appropriated funds, transfer from a Federal agency, or otherwise. Such property shall be known as the Herbert Hoover National Historic Site.

Sec. 2. The Secretary of the Interior and the Administrator of General Services may enter into agreements which provide for the—
(1) transfer of lands and other property, except the Herbert

Hoover Library building, from the administrative control of the Administrator to that of the Secretary without transfer of funds; and

(2) use by the Administrator of portions of facilities con-

structed by the Secretary.
SEC. 3. The Secretary shall administer the Herbert Hoover National Historic Site in accordance with the Act approved August 25, 1916 (39 Stat. 535), as amended and supplemented, and the Act approved

August 21, 1935 (49 Stat. 666).

Sec. 4. There are authorized to be appropriated not more than Appropriation.

\$1,650,000 for land acquisition and development in connection with the Herbert Hoover National Historic Site as provided in this Act.
