

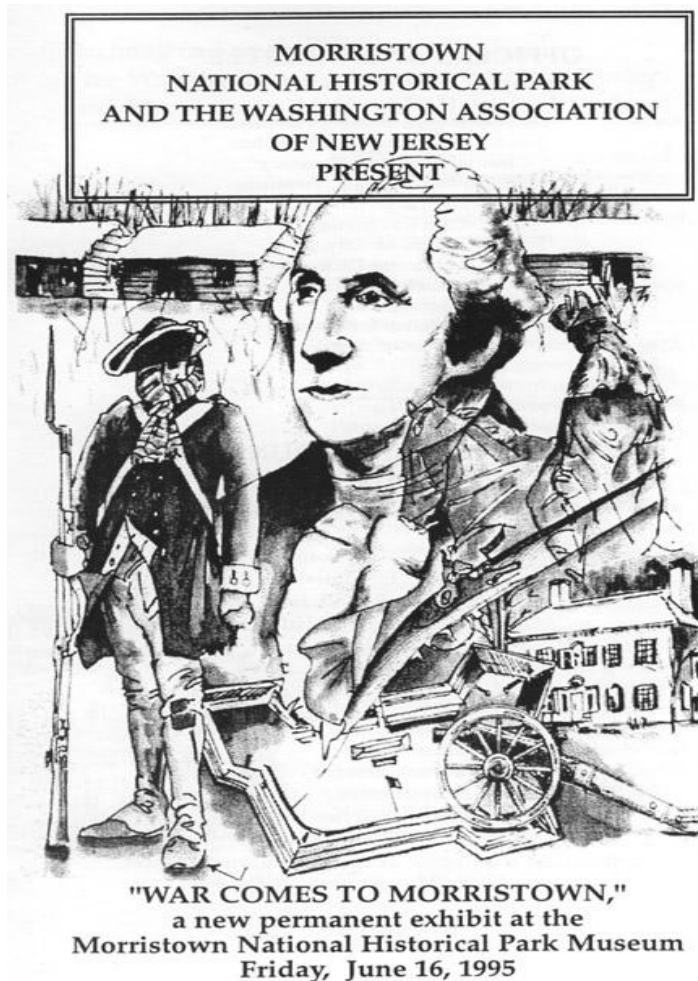

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PREFACE

This document, the *Finding Aid for the Morristown National Historical Park Resource Management Records, 1767-2005* describes records created by National Park Service staff in performance of the daily administration and operation of the Morristown National Historical Park. This finding aid was issued in September 2011 and is the result of a cataloging project carried out by the Northeast Museum Services Center during the summer and fall of 2011. The June 2009 draft finding aid is obsolete with the release of the current document.

The catalogers would like to express their gratitude towards staff at Morristown National Historical Park for their assistance in carrying out this work. In particular, thanks must go to Jude Pfister, Chief, Cultural Resource Stewardship and Joni Rowe, Museum Specialist for their help these many years.

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INTRODUCTION

This document, the *Finding Aid for the Morristown National Historical Park, 1767-1994 [bulk dates 1933-1970]*, is the result of work by the Northeast Museum Services Center. It describes the three phases of a multi-phase backlog cataloging project of the *Morristown National Historical Park Resource Management Records*. The records described here were created during the administration and operation of Morristown National Historical Park (MORR). It should be noted that the initial inclusive date of the collection (1767) is the result of historical research and transcriptions of eighteenth-century deeds and correspondence. This document replaces those aids created in the two earlier phases.

First Phase, Fiscal Year 2005

Between December 2004 and April 2005 the parks collections were rehoused and relocated to Crozier Fine Arts Storage in Newark, N.J. due to the rehabilitation and expansion of the headquarters museum. In June 2005, Teri DeYoung, Museum Specialist and Margaret Welch, Archivist assembled the records for the current project and transferred them to the Northeast Museum Services Center in Charlestown, Massachusetts for processing. Due to the difficulty in locating and retrieving the records, the original scope of the project was adjusted to reflect fewer linear feet (25 lf to 16 lf). From June through September 2005, Teri DeYoung, processed and cataloged the records. The project was carried out under the guidance of David Vecchioli, Regional Archivist, Northeast Museum Services Center. During this project the Northeast Museum Services Center was administered by Sara Wolf, Director and Giles Parker, Deputy Director. The work was done at the Northeast Museum Services Center with fiscal year 2005 Backlog Catalog funds.

A survey of the records was conducted in June 2005 by Teri DeYoung. The cataloger determined, in coordination with the Regional Archivist, that the Historians Files comprised a complete series. The Historic Note Files were removed from the Central Files and placed, based on provenance, within the Historians Files. All the records were then examined to determine an arrangement order. The Historic Note Files retained their biographical, topical and chronological order. The Historic Site File, arranged alphabetically by subject, also retained original order. Similarly, The National Historic Land Mark Files and the National Registers Files are arranged alphabetically by site beginning with general information folders. Research Project 33 was also arranged alphabetically and retained original order. The Reference Files begin with general information folders followed by copies of records from manuscript collections held at the park and finally publications.

During processing two series were created: III., Historians Files and IV., Oversize Material. Within Series III., Historians Files, eight sub-series were created: A. History Note File, B. Historic Sites File, C. National Historic Landmark Files, D. National Register Files, E. Research Projects, F. Reference Files, and G. Education.

A small amount of post-1987 material was processed with these records in order to retain their historical context.

The materials described here were cataloged into the Automated National Catalog System Plus (ANCS+) in a single record in the Collections Management Module for submission to the National Catalog.

Second Phase, Fiscal Year 2009

In October 2008 Museum Specialist Teri DeYoung, and Regional Archivist David Vecchioli, traveled to Morristown National Historical Park to pick up 25 linear feet of resource management records (PMIS 79949B). During scoping DeYoung and Vecchioli determined that the park's Central Files and the remaining Historians Files (those that could not be located during fiscal year 2005 at the Crozier storage facility) would be completed as part of the second phase.

The resource management records were initially organized in 1993 by Park Librarian, Alan Stein. Stein wrote in his finding aid, *Morristown National Historical Park CRM Archives*, that "historical file material had been interfiled with central classified file materials to such an extent that it would not be possible to reconstruct the two original files."¹ A survey conducted in November by DeYoung confirmed Stein's results that the central files and the historians files had been comingled. Once provenance was determined, the historians files were separated from the central files. The central file records were arranged following existing NPS filing classifications schemes; many retaining the in-box arrangement order created by Stein. Central file records created prior to 1953 were arranged based on a numeric decimal system (i.e. 620). Whereas records created after 1953 were arranged following an alphanumeric system (H22). The hierarchy developed for the historians' files during fiscal year 2005 was expanded to include records from the current phase. Given that a portion of Series III., Historians Files and Series IV., Oversize Material were processed prior to Series I., Central Files, box numbers within the finding aid are not chronological. During processing Series I., Central Files was created. Series III., Historians Files and Series IV., Oversize Material was expanded to incorporate records from phase two.

During processing, materials were refoldered in acid-free folders and original folder titles were transcribed to new folders. Some of the folders had information written on the cover. During refolding, photocopies of this information were made onto acid free paper and placed in the new acid free folder. Photographs were rehoused in archival enclosures.

The records contained folded oversize materials (larger than 8-1/2" x 14"). The oversize items were removed, unfolded and rehoused in archival folders and flat boxes or map folders. Each item was replaced with an acid-free separation sheet indicating the original storage location. A copy of the separation sheet was placed with the oversized item to cross-reference the materials.

The materials were processed according to NPS, NMSC and park standards including removing staples and fasteners and rehousing records in acid-free buffered enclosures. Photosensitive materials, such as blueprints, were interleaved with pH neutral archival quality material. Where existing titles did not accurately describe or reflect the contents of the box or folder, additional content information was added to the folder title and was shown enclosed in square brackets.

Third Phase, Fiscal Year 2011

In May 2011 Museum Specialist Teri DeYoung and Archivist Margaret Welch picked up additional resource management records from the park. These records continued the Central Files series cataloged in the previous phase. The November 1999 survey made for the 2001 Collection Management Plan describes this continuation of central files labeled “case files” by former MORR administrative staff. By 1999 MORR staff had gathered these files from storage in several buildings. A small amount of files from Superintendent Francis Ronalds, identified in the earlier phase, was processed. The research files transferred in 2005 by the historian who researched the park’s administrative history were also cataloged. The historian also transferred his files related to the Integrated Cultural Resources Report and the National Register nomination for the Warren property at Jockey Hollow.

This phase’s materials were treated as an addendum to the first two phases, and the boxes are numbered and labeled accordingly. NMSC staffer Welch continued to use the same rehousing and processing procedures adopted by DeYoung in the first two phases. Brackets indicate where folder titles were added for greater clarity.

The Integrated Catalog System (ICMS) record, MORR 12130, in the Collections Management Module was amended to include information from the current project. This finding aid was created including a description of the collection and a collection listing.

Description: The Morristown National Historical Park Resource Management Records were created by National Park Service staff in performance of the daily administration and operation of Morristown National Historical Park.

The central files hold records related to all park divisions documenting the administrative and decision making processes of staff from daily activities to complex projects. Subjects include land acquisitions, celebrations of park anniversaries, and activities including compliance regarding historic buildings and landscapes.

Records of the Historians Division represent extensive research chronicling the events of the Revolutionary War in and around Morristown, New Jersey with particular emphasis on the Continental Army and General George Washington. The records include research and reference material, newspaper clippings, photographs, maps and drawings, site reports and project documentation. The materials consist of originals and photocopies.

Other series include the Superintendents Files and Research Projects.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

I. Central Files

This series holds the administrative and decision making records of the park. The series includes correspondence, monthly reports, project reports and associated documentation and title abstracts. The records are arranged following existing NPS classifications systems. The only known existing complete copy of the pre-1953 NPS filing code system, *Filing Scheme of the National Park Service*, is located within the series in Box 33, Folder 9. A portion of post-1953 files termed “case files” were added as an addendum in phase three. The researcher should check both sets of files for post-1953 topics as they overlap in subject matter.

II. Superintendents Files

A. Francis S. Ronalds

Most of this section of the Superintendents Files was previously intermingled in the “H” [History] division of the Central Files. These folders, probably only a small portion of the original files, resided in the office of Dr. Francis Ronalds, Superintendent from 1940 to 1967. They relate to his activities as Coordinating Superintendent involved in historic sites outside of his park. These files show him visiting National Historic Landmarks as a representative of the NPS, answering questions about historic architecture surveys, and offering advice about historic houses. A trained historian who participated in the founding of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, Ronalds was well acquainted with leaders of the historic preservation movement including Louisa Dupont Crowninshield and Kenneth Chorley, longtime Colonial Williamsburg administrator. A small amount of correspondence with these individuals has survived.

This series also holds copies of correspondence and park status reports Ronalds wrote for the Washington Association of New Jersey, the longtime friends’ group for MORR. These files also contain carbon copies of the speeches given by noted historians at the Washington Birthday annual luncheon.³

III. Historians Files

A. History Note File

This sub-series contains extensive historical research regarding the Revolutionary War in and around Morristown, New Jersey. The research was undertaken by park historians primarily between 1933 and 1965. The comprehensive research is arranged categorically. The research note card file developed by Historian Melvin Weig supersedes the lengthy handwritten or typed notes.

B. Historic Sites File

This sub-series contains historical research about significant sites in and around Morristown during the Revolutionary War. This sub-series is arranged alphabetically by site.

C. National Historic Landmark Files

This sub-series contains site reports, correspondence and general research documenting National Historic Landmark sites visited annually by designated park staff. In order to foster historic preservation, National Park Service sites assumed volunteer liaison responsibilities to provide technical advice and guidance on methods of funding. This sub-series is arranged alphabetically by site.

D. National Register Files

This sub-series contains National Register Nominations for sites in and around New Jersey and is arranged alphabetically by site.

E. Research Projects

This sub-series contains research projects undertaken by the Historians division. The sub-series currently holds the records for Project 33. Researchers completed title searches and collected data on deeds, mortgages, roads, property lines and structures for park-owned land.

F. Reference File

This sub-series contains reference data, park publications and copies of planning documents.

G. Education

This sub-series contains correspondence, a teacher survey questionnaire and newspaper clippings detailing park events.

H. Historical and Archeological Projects

This sub-series holds correspondence regarding archeological excavations at the park between 1935 and 1942, manuscript and newspaper inventories, and an inventory of the Lidgerwood collection.

I. Research and Survey

Items in this sub-series include research correspondence, Ford family biographical data, an index of bibliographic references and extensive research on park sites and buildings.

J. Library Records

This sub-series holds inventories of the park manuscript collection and the Lidgerwood and Lloyd W. Smith collections. A 1940 report confirming the authenticity of the Washington Commission is also located here.

Series VI. Oversize Materials

Items in this series are grouped together because of their common size. All items are intellectually associated with the legal size materials in Series I. (Addendum) and Series III., but are too large to be stored in the legal size folders and archives boxes. Therefore, these items were removed to flat boxes and map folders and cross-referenced with acid-free separation sheets.

Series V. Curatorial Files

This series holds the Museum Curators copy of the park manuscript collection transcribed by Works Progress Administration (WPA) workers in 1941.

Series VI. Research Projects

This series is closely related to the Research Projects subseries of the Historians Files. The research files from Larry Lowenthal, a former NPS historian who was hired to write an administrative history of the park, combine annotated photocopies from primary and secondary sources with original notes. (The final edition of the administrative history is expected to be released in 2012.) Lowenthal also integrated files from the project's first historian, Christine Arato. The project documents and research from two other projects Lowenthal worked on – the 2001 Cultural Resources Report and the 1999 National Register Determination of the Warren Property (Mount Kemble) – are also included.

PART 2:

HISTORICAL NOTE

A Brief History of Morristown National Historical Park

Morristown National Historical Park encompasses over 1,600 acres and includes the Ford Mansion, Jockey Hollow, the New Jersey Brigade Encampment Site and Fort Nonsense. Together these sites comprise the largest assemblage of resources relating to the American Continental Army.⁴

During the harsh winters of 1777 and 1779-1780 the Continental Army established encampments in and around Morristown, New Jersey. Strategically situated, the swamps and hills surrounding Morristown provided protection from surprise attacks and raids.⁵ Moreover, Morristown was “nearly equidistant from the British posts of Newark, Perth Amboy, and New Brunswick and guarded the vital inland communication line through the Hudson Highlands to New England.”⁶ It was from this location that Washington held his beleaguered army together and kept the revolution alive.

After the war, Morristown returned to agrarian pursuits. The Ford Mansion, which had served as Washington’s headquarters, remained in the Ford family until June 25, 1873 when it was purchased by a small group of concerned citizens who later founded the Washington Association of New Jersey. Fort Nonsense remained in private hands until 1914 when it was purchased by the town. In 1929, Washington Association member, Lloyd W. Smith, purchased 1,000 acres in Jockey Hollow with the intent to preserve and protect it for future generations.⁷ By the early 1930s, economic depression settled over the entire country. Morristown Mayor, Clyde Potts, seeking to stimulate the local economy, petitioned the Federal Government to create a National Park to preserve and protect the sites that were so vital during the Revolution and the struggle for American liberty. On March 2, 1933 President Hoover approved a bill establishing Morristown National Historical Park. The park was officially dedicated on July 4, 1933.

Historic preservation has had a long history at Morristown National Historical Park. The Historians Division played a key role in the development of preservation techniques used in the park and around the northeast region. As the nation’s first Historical Park, Morristown “was one of the places where the NPS developed techniques of research, planning, and preservation of historic resources.”⁸ In 1935 the Eastern Museum Laboratory was established at the park. This museum services laboratory provided exhibit development and historical research for eight park units. Although short-lived, this extension-type of service would continue at the park in the form of outreach for other National Park sites as well as National Historic Landmark sites.

As with many parks, Morristown benefited from New Deal work programs such as the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) and the Public Works Administrations (PWA). The park's historical technicians along with CCC and PWA workers "began a systematic campaign to gather baseline historical data ... [that] laid a foundation for future investigation and built an infrastructure that served the park for decades afterward."⁹ Melvin Weig, the park's second historical technician left an indelible mark on the park's history program. Under Weig, technicians translated, transcribed and indexed manuscript collections, traced land records and maintained research note files. These records, now known as the History Note File, Historic Site Files and the Research Project files form the basis of Series III., Historians Files, and serve as the core for the ongoing research program at the park.

Weig left Morristown to become Superintendent of the newly established Edison National Historic Site only to return as the superintendent of both NPS units in 1967.¹⁰ Due to funding difficulties in the 1950s and subsequent decades, the history research program built up by Weig diminished over the years and by 1980 the historian's position had been eliminated. The challenges presented by the forests of Jockey Hollow and the New Jersey Brigade led to the park playing a leadership role regarding natural resources in the Northeast Region. The park participated in investigations of gypsy moth infestation and deer management and in significant studies regarding invasive plants species. By 2000 the park had a full-time staff biologist.

The Mission 66 and Bicentennial initiatives of the 1960s and 1970s brought physical improvements to the park. In this same time period, various real estate projects in this area increasingly regarded a suburb of New York City threatened the viewsheds from Jockey Hollow and Fort Necessity, a trend that would continue. The biggest intrusion was the construction of Interstate 287 near the Ford Mansion in the face of opposition from the Secretary of the Interior, the NPS, and the community. Congress looked at this project before the passage of the 1966 National Historic Preservation Act which mandates reviews of federally sponsored projects such as highways impacting historic resources.¹¹

Despite the trend of diminished funding continuing into the 1980s and 1990s, the park was able to acquire important tracts of land linking the New Jersey Brigade Encampment to Jockey Hollow and several properties surrounding the Ford Mansion. The founding organization, the Washington Association, contributed funding for the rehabilitation of Fort Nonsense which was rededicated in 1991. The Association also raised funds for the early 21st century renovation of the Museum and Library building complete with new exhibits, echoes of the early Eastern Museum Laboratory.
