Journey back to the prehistoric era and witness how people lived and played nearly 2,000 years ago!

Hopewell Culture National Historical Park  
is hosting a *Free* day of discovery for the whole family.

Rediscover the prehistoric past as park rangers and members of the archaeological community lead guided tours of Mound City Group earthworks, help identify artifacts and fossils, present current archaeological research, and discuss new archaeological discoveries!

Visitors can also experience what it was like to live thousands of years ago by observing how stone tools are crafted using flint knapping techniques, learning how to hunt using spears during atlatl throwing demonstrations, gathering information about plants and animals at nature displays, expressing artistic talents through pottery making and a variety of hands-on prehistoric crafts, taking part in the park’s junior ranger program, and *more!*

Kids and adults can even earn a Junior Archeologist badge by participating in Hopewell Culture National Historical Park’s *New Junior Archeologist Program*.
