Personal Watercraft (PWC)

Your safety in and around the waters of Lake Roosevelt is important to us. In order for you to be safe, you need to make sure that you have specific equipment on your watercraft any time you are on Lake Roosevelt. We have developed this checklist to help you prepare for a safe and enjoyable day on the Lake. When operating a PWC at Lake Roosevelt, please remember the following rules:

- PWC's cannot be operated at night
- All persons are required to wear a USCG approved life jacket.
- You must be 14 years and older to operate a PWC
- You must be 16 years and older to rent a PWC
- You must use the safety lanyard whenever you are operating a PWC
