

HISTORY

The Billings Family Collection of Printed Material was accumulated by the Billings, French and Rockefeller families during their occupancies of the Mansion in Woodstock, Vermont. The Billings family resided in Woodstock from 1869-1914; the French family from 1914-1954, and the Rockefellers from 1955-1998. The collection of pamphlets, periodicals and newspapers contain information about the family's personal and professional interests, and the charities and causes they supported. The bulk of the printed material dates from the Billings family era.

The collection is part of the original accession of items donated by Laurance and Mary Rockefeller. The original context of the collection is unknown; the collection was assembled by the Rockefeller's former curator and was found stored with library material.

DESCRIPTION The Billings Family Collection of Printed Material consists

of historic printed and published writings. The collection contains pamphlets, periodicals, and newspapers produced by business, social, religious, charitable, and educational institutions. Most were published in the United States; there are also foreign publications. The collection represents the

Billings, French and Rockefeller family's social and religious lives; their interests and philanthropic activities.

PROVENANCE The publications were collected by various members of the

Billings, French and Rockefeller families during their time at the Billings Mansion. The material was donated to the National Park Service by Mary French Rockefeller,

Frederick Billings' granddaughter, and her husband Laurance S. Rockefeller as part of the historical artifacts and archives housed in the residential complex of the Marsh-

Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park.

SERIES I: PAMPHLETS, 1832-1986

Arranged into eight subseries by subject.

A. SUBSERIES: BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES AND MEMORIALS, 1838-1984 (bulk dates: Circa 1870-1910)

Arranged alphabetically by surname.

Contains short biographical essays, eulogies, and tributes regarding well-known individuals, family members, and others who may have been acquainted with Billings or French family members.

B. SUBSERIES: BUSINESS, 1860-1973 (bulk dates: Circa 1860-1890)

Arranged alphabetically by the following subjects: Corporations, Legal, Nicaragua Canal, and Railroads; most of which concern the Northern Pacific Railroad; chronologically within subject.

Contains pamphlets relating to business institutions and business activities; includes annual reports, status reports, and legal summations. Many of the legal pamphlets relate to the Mariposa estate.

C. SUBSERIES: CLUBS AND SOCIETIES, 1850-1978 (bulk dates: Circa 1880-1900)

Arranged alphabetically by the following subjects: African American, California, Charitable, Cultural, Financial, Heritage, Scholarly, Political, Woodstock, VT., and the YMCA and YWCA, and chronologically within subject.

Consists of pamphlets relating to social, political and benevolent organizations. Contains printed speeches, meeting proceedings, and annual reports.

D. SUBSERIES: EDUCATION AND EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 1834-1994 (bulk dates: Circa 1880-1900)

Arranged into two subjects: General Education, arranged chronologically, and Educational Institutions, arranged alphabetically by institution name.

Contains pamphlets about or published by colleges, universities, seminaries, secondary schools and industrial schools. Most are American; some relate to foreign institutions. The publications include annual reports, newsletters, yearbooks, class lists, and bulletins. Several schools are represented; the collection includes many from Amherst College, Dartmouth College, University of California, and the University of Vermont.

E. SUBSERIES: HISTORY, 1855-1985 (bulk dates: Circa 1880-1920)

Arranged alphabetically by the following subjects: Art, California, Dedication of Buildings and Monuments; Disasters, Foreign, Political, U.S. and Vermont History; arranged chronologically within subject.

History related publications include exhibit catalogs, essays, speeches; souvenir booklets and programs. Several Spanish publications concerning Mexico.

F. SUBSERIES: RELIGION, 1832-1951 (bulk dates: Circa 1870-1895)

Arranged alphabetically by the following subjects: Church Publications, Mission Publications; arranged chronologically within subject, and Sermons and Religious Readings; this last group is arranged alphabetically by author.

Includes annual reports and meeting minutes; dedication programs, orations, bible and other religious writings. Several religious organizations are represented including Congregational, Evangelical, and Presbyterian. The Missions represented include domestic and foreign.

G. SUBSERIES: SCIENCE AND NATURE, 1867-1944 (bulk dates: Circa 1880-1930)

Arranged alphabetically by subject: Animals and Plants; Geology, Medical, and General; chronologically within subject.

Contains pamphlets of a scientific nature; includes club bulletins, compilations and lists of species, field guides, and catalogs.

H. SUBSERIES: TRAVEL AND LEISURE, 1843-1986 (bulk dates: Circa 1880-1900)

Arranged alphabetically by the following subjects: Hobbies, Literature, Sports and Recreation, and Travel; the literature pamphlets are arranged alphabetically by author, the others are arranged chronologically.

Pamphlets relate to leisure activities and foreign and domestic travel. Contains catalogs and instruction manuals; essays, poems and short stories; travel brochures and a map of Hong Kong from 1896.

SERIES II. PERIODICALS, 1830-1991

The periodicals are arranged alphabetically by title of publication.

This series consists of periodicals, journals and newspapers related to business, religious, historical, philanthropic, and social activities. Several contain articles about Frederick Billings or another member of the Billings Family. Several are inscribed or stamped with the names of family members or family friends, and several newspapers contain the obituaries of family members or friends.
