

## Civil Rights in America, 1964:

A Crossroads of Then and Now

November 21, 1963 was three months after the historic 1963 March on Washington for Jobs & Freedom, one day before President John F. Kennedy's assassination on November 22, 1963 and eight months prior to the historic legislative passing of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 on July 2, 1964.



The National Park Service presents: "16 Trailblazers Breaking Barriers For Jobs & Freedom" this program commemorates the 50 year anniversary of the courageous acts of 16 African American men who integrated the Atlanta Fire Department with particular emphasis on the November 21, 1963 integration of Historic Fire Station No. six which served the historic Sweet Auburn community from 1894-1991.
