* The **Mu'uputs Canyon hike** is an easy 2 miles round trip and focuses on the history and lifeways of the Kaibab Paiute Indians. Participants will also visit two fascinating petroglyph sites. The hikes will be limited to 20 visitors; please call Pipe Spring National Monument to make reservations (928-643-7105). There will be a \$ 5.00 per person tribal fee for the hike. For hikers wishing to also visit Pipe Spring National Monument, the entrance free is \$5.00 per person (Interagency Annual, Senior, and Access passes are accepted for entrance).

As always, ranger guided tours of the historic Winsor Castle occur daily, every hour and half-hour from 8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Pipe Spring National Monument is 14 miles west of Fredonia, Arizona on AZ 389, or 44 miles east of Hurricane, Utah on UT 59 and AZ 389.
