Overview

The nesting portion of the snowy plover breeding season has reached the half way point for 2013. Nesting activity has been high this year compared to the same time last year. Unfortunately, the hatch success this year has been limited. There have been two nests so far in the 2011 Restoration Area, a great sign that the plovers are utilizing that area and have more space to nest.

Current stats:

- 3 nesting pairs
- 9 nests, 24 eggs
 - o 1 hatched
 - o 3 currently incubating
 - 7 failed due to wind, predators, tide, and infertility
- 3 chicks
