Fire Update – September 12, 2020

We were beginning to think we would never see the sun again but yesterday it peaked it's head out for the afternoon. We should see less smoke for the next couple of days but there will still be fog until the marine layer lifts.

Lower temperatures and higher humidity tend to keep fire activity to a minimum.

Crews worked at mopping up hotspots, securing the line that has already established and patrolling looking for any issues that could impact the fire area. They started removing water hose from the areas where they find little or no heat. Today's plan is pretty much the same.

Poison oak and yellow jackets have been an exceptionally irritating hazard for the firefighters. They have little choice but to endure both hazards if the fire leads them there.

While there are parts of the park that has reopened not all the park is open and will not be until all fire is gone, probably when it gets substantial rain. Check out the Point Reyes National Seashore facebook page for any park closure changes.

Please stay out of the fire area. Be vigilant while you are driving. Watch out for firefighter vehicles and equipment. Slow down, be patient and drive safely.
