NATIONAL PARK WEEK

Saturday, April 16 **Volunteer Day** 9 AM – 11 AM

Join Park Ranger Charles Hua with a clean-up project in the park. You must complete a Volunteer Form and you will receive a Volunteer water bottle. Please be prepared with good walking shoes, a hat, and wear sunscreen.

Monday, April 18 **1871 Trail Guided Walk** 9:30 AM – 10:30 AM

Join Park Ranger Rae Godden for a mile and a half long round trip walk out on the 1871 Trail to Alahaka Ramp and Keanae'e Cliffs and then return along the coastal trail. Please be prepared with good walking shoes, a hat, and wear sunscreen.

Tuesday, April 19 **Cultural Demonstrations** throughout the day

Watch Charlie Grace refurbish "Nā 'Ōpio, a hand carved koa canoe built in 1970-71.

Watch Kalehua demonstrate the craft of 'Ahu La'i, or Ti-leaf Rain Cape.

Weds, April 20 **Hawaiian Arts & Crafts** 9 AM – 11 AM

Learn to make a fish or bird through the ancient craft of 'Ulana Niu (coconut leaf weaving) with practitioners Taro Fujimori and Ed "Bear" Cochran.

Create a bookmark with the ancient art of 'Ohe Kāpala (Bamboo Stamping) with traditional designs with practitioners Keeki Place and Chantal Chung.

Evening Program in the Amphitheatre 6 PM – 7 PM

Come and listen to Sara Peck from the UH Sea Grant College Program Coastal Resources Extension. Her presentation will be "Coral Spawning This Spring – The Life of the Reef".

- Thursday, April 21 **Tide Pool Walk 10 AM – 11 AM**
Join Park Guide Joon So in exploring the tide pools in the pu'uhonua to see how many "honu" or Hawaiian Green Sea Turtles, we can spot.
- Friday, April 22 **Hawaiian Games 9 AM – 11 AM**
Test your physical and mental skills through playing ancient Hawaiian games with park staff. 'Ulu maika (bowling), Kōnane (checkers), Moa pahe'e (sliding darts), and Hū (spinning tops) are some of the challenging games available.
- Saturday, April 23 **Junior Ranger Day all day long**
We encourage children ages 7 – 12 to participate in park's Junior Ranger program and earn a park badge.
