



## Fees and Passes 2010

### Individual Entrance Fees

**Automobile:** \$20 - Valid for seven consecutive days, including date of purchase. **Pedestrians, bicycles, motorcycles and mopeds:** \$10 per person, not to exceed \$20 per vehicle. Valid for seven consecutive days, including date of purchase.

### Passes

(Identification may be requested to verify proper use)

#### Rocky Mountain National Park Annual Pass--

A \$40 pass which provides unlimited entry to this park for one year from the date of purchase.

#### Rocky Mountain NP/Arapaho NRA Annual Pass--

A \$50 pass which provides unlimited entry to both areas for one year from the date of purchase.

#### America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Annual Pass--

An \$80 pass available to everyone which provides access to, and use of, Federal recreation sites that charge an entrance or standard amenity fee for one year from the date of purchase.

#### America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Senior Pass--

A \$10 lifetime pass for U.S. citizens or permanent residents age 62 or over.

#### America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Access Pass--

A free lifetime pass for U.S. citizens or permanent residents with a permanent disability.

#### America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Volunteer Pass--

A free pass for NPS and/or Federal Recreational Lands Volunteers who have acquired 500 service hours on a cumulative basis. Good for one year.

### Commercial Tours

A fee will be assessed commercial tour vehicles based on passenger capacity.

**This means the total seating capacity, not the actual number of people.**

#### Passenger

Capacity	Fees
1-6	\$25
7-15	\$75
16-25	\$100
26 & over	\$200

**Annual passes may not be used to pay for commercial tours.**

### Groups & Organizations

Members of non-profit groups and organizations (church, school, public service, etc.), arriving in vehicles with capacities of 15 or more and not qualifying for educational fee waivers, are charged \$10 per person over 15 years of age (no charge for the vehicle driver) for entrance into Rocky Mountain National Park. **Annual or lifetime passes cover the entrance fees for the passport holder and others, as defined on the back of the pass. If the vehicle capacity is 14 or fewer the group is charged \$20, the individual automobile fee.**

### Educational Fee Waivers

An entrance fee waiver may be granted to institutions conducting educational or scientific study related to the resources of the park. Make requests by email, fax or letter at least two weeks ahead to:

- Entrance fees and passes, except for Senior and Access Passes, may be purchased by phone, with a credit card. Call (970)586-1206 for information.
- Visitors 15 years of age and under, including non-citizens, are admitted free.
- Payment for fees and passes must be by U.S. currency, coin, check (payable to NPS) or AmEx, Visa, MC and Discover credit cards.
- Unlimited re-entry is allowed within the specified time frame of the fee or pass.
- Senior and Access Passes entitle holders to 50% discounts on frontcountry camping fees.

## Frontcountry Camping

- Checkout time in all campgrounds is noon.
- Camping is limited to seven nights parkwide from June 1 through September 30.
- An additional 14 nights is permitted from October 1 through May 31.
- Limits are on a park basis rather than on a per campground basis.
- Senior and Access Pass holders receive a 50% discount on camping fees.
- One vehicle and one tent, tent trailer, or RV per campsite.

## Reservation Campgrounds

Campground reservations for summer camping at Moraine Park (May 26-October 4, 2010), Aspenglen (May 26-September 25, 2010), and Glacier Basin Loops C & D (May 26-September 6) may be made up to six months in advance. Make reservations by phone at (877)444-6777 or on line at [www.recreation.gov](http://www.recreation.gov).

Fees for summer 2010 are \$20 per site per night while water is turned on. When the water is shut off for fall/winter 2010-2011, fees are \$14 per site per night.

### First-Come, First-Served Campgrounds (no reservations)

Glacier Basin Loops A and B, Longs Peak and Timber Creek campgrounds: Fees for summer 2010 are \$20 per site per night while water is turned on. When the water is shut off for fall/winter 2010-2011 fees are \$14 per site per night. Longs Peak Campground is open year-round. **Longs Peak Campground is for tents only; no trailers.**

**NOTE:** The recent mountain pine beetle outbreak has resulted in the removal of most trees in Glacier Basin and Timber Creek Campgrounds so there is little or no shade

### Group Camping

Summer at Glacier Basin - 13 sites, tents only (no RVs), no set limit on the number of tents per site. Reservations taken for May 26-September 6, 2010; sites may be reserved up to one year in advance. Make reservations by phone at (877)444-6777 or on line at [www.recreation.gov](http://www.recreation.gov).

**Fees:** \$3 per person per night

Small sites: 9-15 people  
Medium sites: 16-25 people  
Large sites: 26-40 people

Winter at Moraine Park - first come, first served (no reservations). Tents and RVs are allowed.

## Backcountry Camping

There are 219 established backcountry sites and 48 crosscountry zone sites in Rocky Mountain National Park. Pets and bicycles are not allowed in the park's backcountry or on any trail. Backpackers must obtain a permit from the park's Backcountry Office. View information on line at <http://www.nps.gov/romo/planyourvisit/backcountry.htm> or call (970)586-1242 for more information.

A \$20 administrative fee is charged during the peak season for each backcountry permit issued.

**Backcountry permit holders must also pay park entrance fees.**

## Special Park Uses (Administrative Fees)

Special Park Uses are activities that require a permit and may be subject to fees. These activities include the following:

Weddings  
Commercial Filming & Still Photography  
Special Events  
Commercial Use Authorizations  
Spreading of Human Remains  
First Amendment Activities  
Distribution of printed material  
Demonstrations
