Welcome to Longs Peak Campground. Campsites here are for tents only. Remember that you are sharing this space with plants, animals, and other campers. The following information is provided to enhance your enjoyment and to assist with preservation and protection of your national park.

Campsites

Checkout is 12:00 noon. Each campsite is equipped with a picnic table, fire grate, tent pad, and parking for 1 vehicle. Campsites are limited to 6 people and two tents. All tents must be placed on a tent pad. Respect the area by not trenching or putting nails in trees.

Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am. Camping is limited to 3 days Memorial Day through September. The camping limit for all campgrounds in Rocky Mountain National Park during this time is a total of 7 days.

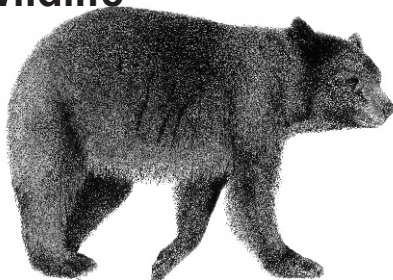
Campfires



Fires are only allowed in the metal fire grates provided. Never leave fires or coals unattended. Fires must be extinguished completely before leaving the campsite or

retiring for the evening. Gathering of firewood and fire-starting materials is prohibited. Firewood is available during the summer months for a fee.

Food Storage & Wildlife



This is Bear Country. Deer, elk, raccoons, and skunks are also year-round residents. Store your food, pet food, cooking utensils, and other scented items in your vehicle or in the food storage boxes located in the campground. These items should remain stored when not in use.

Remember, it is illegal to feed or approach wildlife! Bird feeders of any type are not allowed. All plants, animals, artifacts, and other natural resources are protected by law in national parks. The use of fireworks and firearms are prohibited in the park

Sanitation



If dishes are washed at your site, the waste/gray water must be disposed of in restroom sinks.

There are no shower or laundry facilities at the campground. Portable showers are prohibited.

Pets

When outside of a vehicle or camping unit, **pets must be leashed** on a lead no longer than 6'. Do not leave pets unattended and please clean up after them.

Pets are not allowed on trails or away from roadsides. Store pet food in vehicle when not in use. Kennels are available in communities bordering the park.

Recreation

Commercial horseback riding is available near by. Hiking trails begin at or near the campground.







Inquire at the ranger station for further information and schedules.

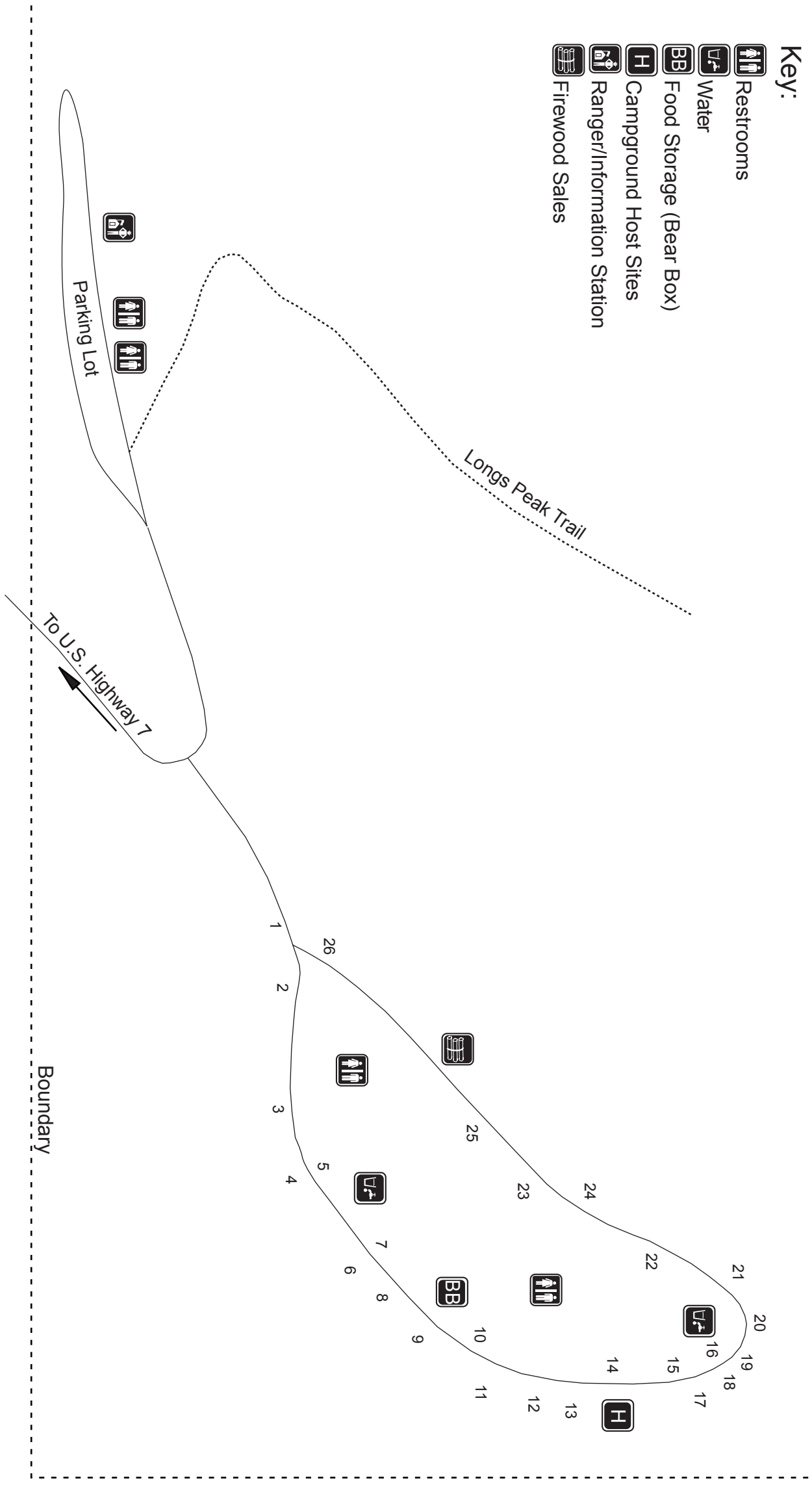
Emergencies
