The results of this study will incorporate routes and opportunities identified as preferred by the surrounding community members and partner organizations through an open civic engagement process.

The study area incorporates a five-mile area around the San Antonio River between two specific locations -- Mission San Francisco de las Espada (Mission Espada) in San Antonio, TX and Rancho de las Cabras (Rancho) in Floresville, TX.

Since June 2011, the project team and community advisors have been studying and identifying resources and potential route alternatives within the study area. Areas studied include: planned paddling trails along the San Antonio River; Municipal, County, and San Antonio River Authority managed park lands and canoe launches; preferred bike routes; potential corridors for new trails; areas of historical significance and existing historical markers; and Spanish Colonial sites significant to the time period of El Camino Real de los Texas National Historic Trail and San Antonio Missions National Historical Park.
