Fee-based activities:

\$5.00 for adults, \$3.00 for children age 6-16 and seniors 62+. Children under six are free. Purchase tickets at the Orientation Center (H).

Home from the Sea:

Visit the home of a seventeenth-century tradesman and an eighteenth century mansion. 1 hour, limit 8 people. Sign up and meet at the Orientation Center (H).

Market Watch:

Tall-masted ships bring luxury goods to Salem from all over the world. That smells good! Where is it from? Will it sell? 30 minutes, limit 25 people. Sign up and meet at the Orientation Center (H).

Tars, Trade Goods, and Taxes:

Tour Salem's Custom House. 1 hour, limit 20 people. Sign up and meet at the Orientation Center (H).

Free Activities:

Dead Reckoning: Try your hand at navigation as it was done in the early nineteenth century. Meet in front of the Orientation Center.

True Weight of Taxation:

A tall ship like *Friendship* can carry three tractor-trailer loads, and in the 19th century the entire cargo would have to be weighed and measured by hand! Learn how to use scales and other tools to determine custom duties. On Pedricks Store House deck (J).

Become a Junior Ranger. Get Junior Ranger packets at the Visitor Center, the Orientation Center (H).

Visit the interactive exhibits on Derby Wharf.
