## Program Descriptions

**Bird Walk:** Come to the Powder Can Picnic Area at Hume Lake to help Forest Service Wildlife Biologist Jeff Cordes count birds returning from their winter vacations. First-timers and experienced birders welcome. Bring a field guide and binoculars if you have them. 1 ½ hours.

**Birding 101:** Do you dream of being the next John James Audubon or Roger Tory Peterson, but you can't figure out where to start? This 1-hour program, which meets in the lobby of the John Muir Lodge, will give you the tools you need to start identifying and appreciating the birds with whom we share the world.

**A Giant's Life:** If we could live as long as the giant sequoias, what historic events would we have witnessed? Take a trip through time in this 45-minute talk and slide show in the lobby of the John Muir Lodge.

**Grant Tree Walk:** Why have people been coming to see the giant sequoias for over 100 years? Join a ranger for an easy walk through the Grant Grove to learn about the big trees. Meet in the Grant Tree parking lot. 1 hour, 3/8 mile.

**Tree ID:** There's more to this forest than just Giant Sequoias. By the end of this ½-hour program, you will be an expert in the identification of half a dozen Sierran trees. Meet in front of the Kings Canyon Visitor Center. Up to ¼ mile walk.
