Considerations

- Many of the trails that lead out of the valley are impacted by snow and ice. Check at the Ranger Station for updates or try the self-guided Nature Trail that begins in Cold Springs Campground.
- River currents are powerful. Do not swim and use caution while crossing streams.
- Marmots gnaw on vehicle insulation under the hood, hoses and wires. Check at the Ranger Station for more information before parking at trailheads in the valley.
