Thursday, June 18

- 8:00pm **Special Program: Cowboy Songs**

1 hour / Silver City Resort

20 minute talk / Meet at the Ranger Station Campfire Circle

An American Black Bear uses its nose to discover the world around it. They have developed a powerful and sensitive sense of smell that they use as we would our eyes. Learn how this knowledge can keep you and Sequoia's bears safe.

20 minute talk / Meet at the Ranger Station Campfire Circle

Saturday, June 20

- 1:00pm **The Mystery of Winter**

2 hour walk / Meet at the Mineral King Ranger Station

Bring a hat, walking shoes, water, and sunscreen, or a rain jacket. Join Ranger Alysia Schmidt for a lovely walk through the Mineral King Valley. Find clues along the way that divulge winter's influence on this glorious landscape and its inhabitants. Be sure to prepare for the weather.
