APPLICATION FOR RELIEF BY MAIMED SOLDIERS.

Bowling who, being duly sworn, deposeth [sic] and saith that he was a citizen of this State at the time he rendered the Military Service hereinafter referred to; that he was at the time of the passage of "An Act for the relief of Maimed Soldiers," approved March 1st, 1881, and is now, a resident of said State. Applicant further deposeth [sic] and saith, that he was a member of Company A of 32 Regiment of Alabama Volunteers in the Military Service of the Confederates States, and while in such service, and in the discharge of his duty, he was on the 31st day of December 1863 at Murfreesboro in the State of Tennessee wounded. In consequence of which wound he has been materially disabled by a qunshot wound in left arm rendering it useless. The bones from wrist to elb [sic] shivered and one near wrist all take out applicant further deposeth [sic] and saith that he has [STATE WHAT HE HAS RECEIVED] not received the benefit of former Acts for the relief of maimed soldiers, as passed by the several Legislatures of this State, and that he is entitled to the relief provided for under the Act "For the relief of Maimed Soldiers," approved March 1st, 1881. And that he is now engaged in business as a Farmer in the State of Alabama.
