Declaration for Original Invalid Pension.

On this sixth day of July AD, 1906, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public within and for the County and State aforesaid, William H. Busbey aged 67 years, who being duly sworn according to maw, declares that he is the identical man who under the name of William H Busbey was enrolled at Springfield, Ohio on the 30 day of April A.D. 1861 as Sergeant in C Co. First Regt. Infty. [sic] reg. Vol. Was honorably discharged on the 18 day of June 1864 I did not enlist or serve in the military marine or naval service of the U.S. at any time prior to the 30 day of April 1861. Was subsequent to the 18 day of June 1864

That he never served otherwise or in any other Company or Regiment in the U.S. Army or Navy in the war of 1861, or at any other time. That he has not been engaged, or received pay in the U.S. Army or Navy in the war since he was honorably discharged on the 18 day of June A.D. 1864 He makes this declaration to secure pension under Act of Congress approved 27th June, 1890. That he is unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of the following disabilities:

Gun shot wound below right ankle and Gun shot wound of left theigh [sic]. Shell wound of right cheek with hemorrhage and adhesion all reced [sic] at Stone [sic] River Tenn. and Injury to right Knee reced [sic] at same time and place. Disease of Kidneys and bladder. I was born on the 24th day of February 1839 Disabilaties [sic] permanent and not due to vicious habits. Entirely disabled.

That he has not applied for pension under Application No. [blank]

[stamp: CONGRESSIONAL us [illegible] OF PENSIONS. JUL 9 1906]

That he is pensioner under Certificate No. [blank]

That said disabilities are not due to his vicious habits, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief permanent. That he hereby constitutes and appoints E.S. WEEDRN, of Chicago, Illinois, his Attorney to prosecute this claim, and to receive a fee of \$10.00 when said pension is allowed and paid.
