He was from the town of Chester in the county of Windsor in the state of Vermont. He joined the service on July 1, 1861 Ashley III [sic] and was enlisted by W. J. Stevenson for a period of 3 years. He was mustered in on September 13, 1861 in Chicago, Illinois by Captain Rucketts. His place of residence was Ashley in Washington County in Illinois. He was killed in action at Stones River on December 31, 1862. All the other columns on the table are empty.
