The 45th Regiment Tennessee Infantry was organized in the latter part of 1861 and was re-organized in May, 1862. In the latter part of 1863 it was consolidated with the 23d Battalion Tennessee Infantry, and the 26th Regiment Tennessee Infantry appears to have been added to the above consolidation at a later date, but each company of the various organizations was mustered separately and under its original designation during the period covered by these consolidations.

About April 9, 1865, the 2d, 3d, 10th, 15th, 18th, 20th, 26th, 30th, 32d, 37th and 45th Regiments and the 23d Battalion Tennessee Infantry were consolidated and formed the 4th Consolidated Regiment Tennessee Infantry, which was parolled at Greensboro, N.C., May 1, 1865.
