



North Unit Off-Season Activities

Park Hours and Fees

The park is open year-round, 7 days/week, 24 hours/day. Entrance fees are charged all year. **Road construction has temporarily closed the west half of the North Unit Scenic Drive. During construction entrance fees will not be charged.** Once construction is completed, the road will be reopened. If the Scenic Drive becomes snow-covered or icy the last 7 miles of the road may be closed and entrance fees will not be charged.

Camping

Juniper Campground is open year-round and is located 5 miles from the North Unit Visitor Center. Camping fees are charged all year and are paid at the campground using a self-registration system. The off-season camping fee is \$5.00 per site per night. Camping is primitive; no hookups or dump station.

Visitor Center

Due to limited staffing, the North Unit Visitor Center is open only on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. CT from early November through mid-April. Natural history exhibits in the center focus on badlands plants and animals. A sales area operated by Theodore Roosevelt Nature and History Association offers a wide variety of books, postcards, posters, and other items.

“An Ever Changing Land,” a free 10-minute film, is shown on request. The film features seasonal scenes and focuses on exploration in the North Unit.
