



## North Unit Off-Season Activities

### Park Hours and Fees

The park is open year-round, 7 days/week, 24 hours/day. Entrance fees are charged all year. If the Scenic Drive becomes snow-covered or icy the last 7 miles of the road may be closed and entrance fees will not be charged.

### Camping

Juniper Campground is open year-round and is located 5 miles from the North Unit Visitor Center. Camping fees are charged all year and are paid at the campground using a self-registration system. The off-season camping fee is \$5.00 per site per night. Camping is primitive; no hookups or dump station.

### Visitor Center

The North Unit Visitor Center is open Friday, Saturday, and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. CT November 11 through April 1. The visitor center may be open additional days as staffing allows. Contact the visitor center for the latest information. Natural history exhibits in the center focus on badlands plants and animals. A sales area operated by Theodore Roosevelt Nature and History Association offers a wide variety of books, postcards, posters, and other items.

“An Ever Changing Land,” a free 12-minute film, is shown on request. Released in the fall of 2008, the film describes the geological, natural and cultural history of the North Unit.
