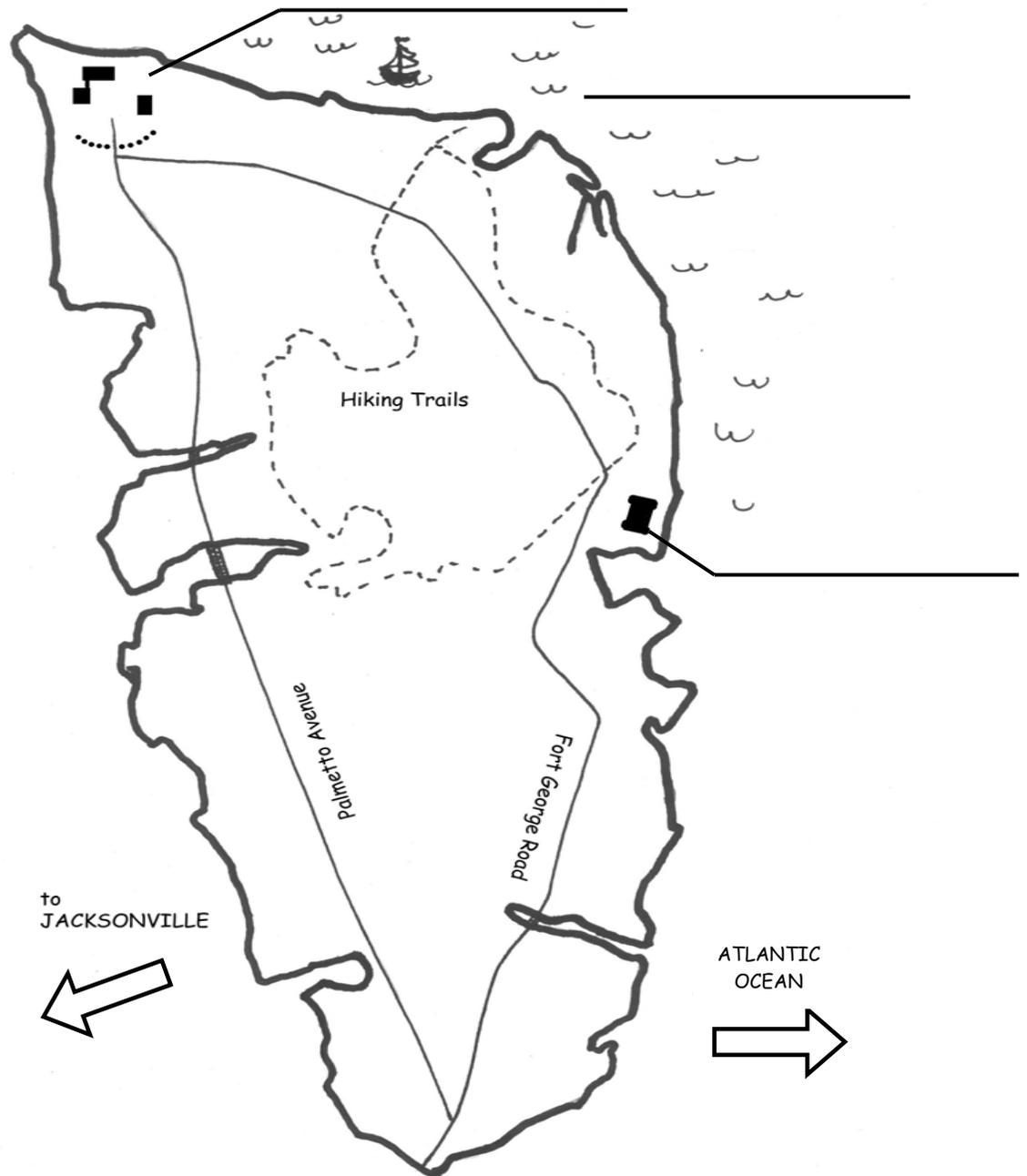


Explore the parks on Fort George Island! Complete four activities from each site to earn your Junior Ranger badge.

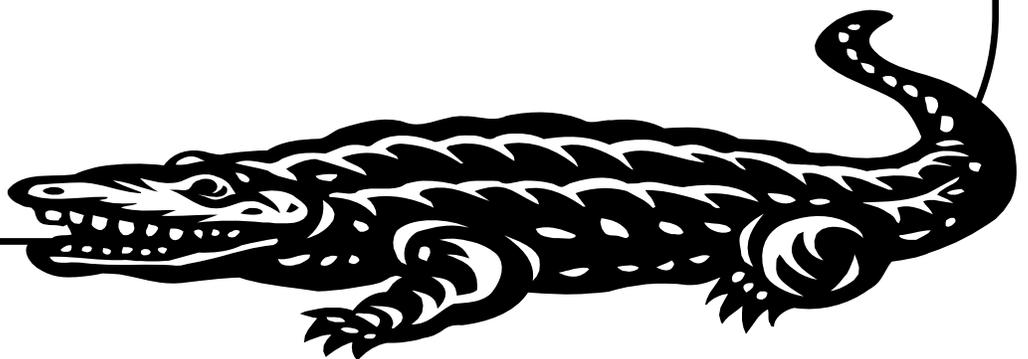

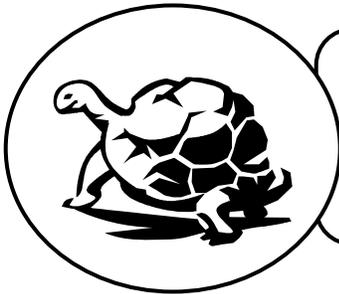
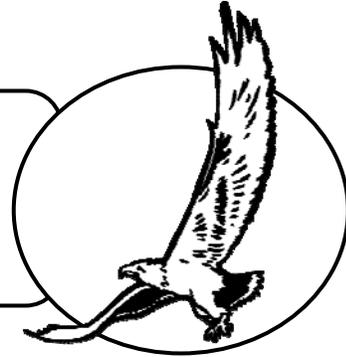


RC What else lives on Fort George Island?

I sleekly soar through the sky.

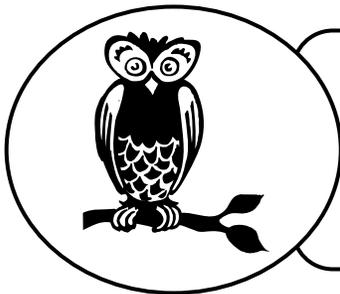
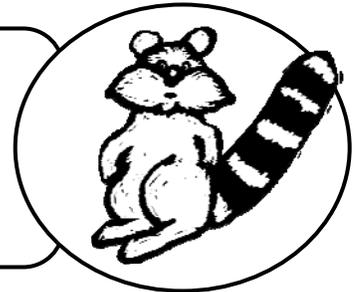


#2: P O G E H R S E I T R O T O

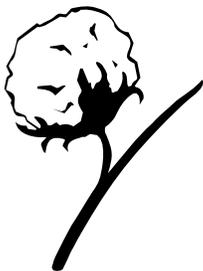
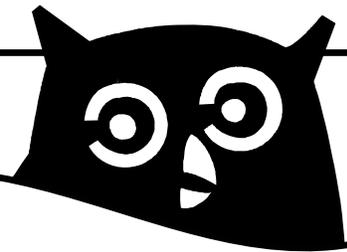

- ◆ Draw a line between the west coast of Africa and Florida. This is one of the routes that ships carrying slaves traveled.

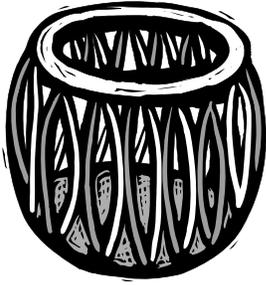

The French and the Timucua exchanged gifts when they met.

Look at the exhibit to see which gifts were exchanged.

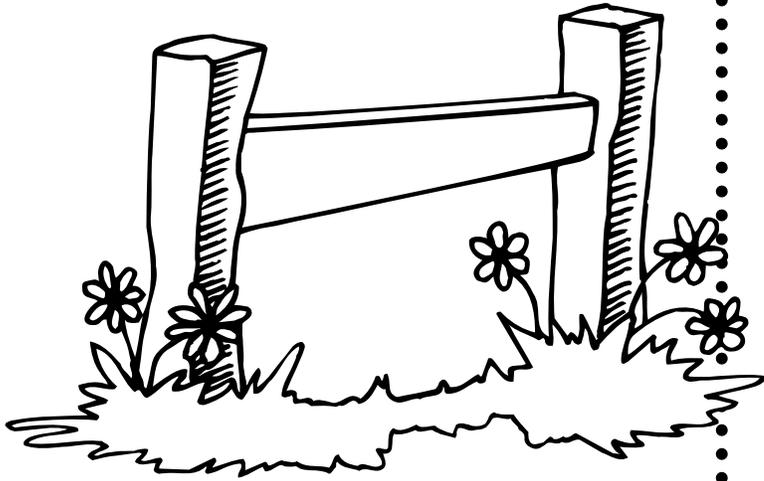
