



Commercial Bus Tours

Reserving Your Tour:

The 16-mile Dunes Drive is suitable for buses. We recommend a minimum of two hours for commercial tours, including stops at the visitor center and in the dunes. Commercial bus or van tours are charged a set fee based on the capacity of the vehicle and not on the number of passengers.

Seating Capacity Fee	
1 to 6 seats	\$25
7 to 25 seats	\$40
26 or more seats	\$100

Requesting a Step-on Ranger: Rangers may be available to serve as step-on guides for a *one-hour presentation*. There is no additional fee for this service. If requesting a ranger, please make your reservation as far in advance as possible. To ensure one has been assigned to your tour, call the monument one to two weeks in advance of the tour. Rangers are assigned to tours as staffing levels permit and are not guaranteed. For more information, call the Commercial Bus Tour Coordinator at (575) 679-2599, ext. 232.

Important Notes:

** If requesting a ranger, the start time you request should not be the time you arrive at the monument, but the time you would like the ranger to start the tour. For example, if you expect to arrive at 9:00 am, but don't want the ranger tour to start until 9:30 am, request 9:30 am as the start time for your tour.

** If you are going to be more than 15 minutes late for the start of your tour, please call us to let us know. Otherwise, due to scheduling issues, we will not be able to provide a step-on ranger-guide if you show up later than 15 minutes from your scheduled time.

** Payment of the entrance fees should be made at the entrance station on the way into the park. Checks should be made out to “National Park Service.” Annual, Access, and Senior passes are not valid for commercial tours.
