



## NOTICE OF RESTRICTIONS TO RECREATIONAL ORV USE

Effective May 17, 2007, Wrangell-St. Elias National Park and Preserve will be issuing Recreational Off-Road Vehicle (ORV) Permits for the following trails:

- **Boomerang Lake Trail** (via Copper Lake Trail to the Boomerang Lake Trail Turn off)—Mile 12.2 Nabesna Road
- **Caribou Creek Trail**—Mile 19.2 Nabesna Road
- **Trail Creek Trail**—Mile 29 Nabesna Road
- **Lost Creek Trail**—Mile 30.8 Nabesna Road
- **Soda Lake Trail**— Mile 30.8 Nabesna Road (Lost Creek Trailhead)
- **Reeve's Field Trail**—Mile 40.2 Nabesna Road
- **Kotsina Road**—Mile 14.5 McCarthy Road
- **Nugget Creek Trail**—Mile 14.5 McCarthy Road

Recreational ORV Permits will **NOT** be available for the following trails until the ground is frozen:

- **Copper Lake Trail** beyond the Boomerang Lake trail turn-off
- **Suslota Lake Trail**
- **Tanada Lake Trail**

Recreational ORV Permits for these trails will be available after park staff has certified that the ground is frozen.

These restrictions are as a result of the settlement of a lawsuit against the National Park Service alleging that recreational ORV use within the park has not been properly managed. **This restriction does not affect access to in-holdings, subsistence use or individuals with 13.440 permits.**

These trails remain open to the public. Foot, horseback and other alternative forms of transportation may be used.
