HISTORY

Charles P. Harmon worked on a construction crew in Yellowstone National Park, possibly as a stone mason, in the 1930s. Specific projects included the rock wall along the Mammoth to Norris road and the Tudor Revival apartment building in upper Mammoth/Fort Yellowstone (building 70).

DESCRIPTION

The collection consists of photographs and negatives related to Charles P. Harmon's work in construction in Yellowstone National Park in the 1930s. The photographs include images of roads, including the Mammoth to Norris road; buildings such as the then new apartment building in upper Mammoth/Fort Yellowstone and backcountry cabins; and more traditional images by commercial photographers Haynes and Casahiel. The collection is notable in its behind the scenes views of park activities and depictions of less well documented construction activities.
