HISTORY

William H. Hendrickson was a biologist working for Yellowstone National Park in 1967-1970. Most of his work focused on vegetation studies, especially issues related to the park's Northern Range. See biography in collection for more information.

DESCRIPTION

The collection contains the personal photographic slides taken by William H. Hendrickson while working as a biologist for Yellowstone National Park from 1967 to 1970. The slides appear to have been taken while Hendrickson was working in the field and consist primarily of what he labels "scenics" or landscape views. There are also a few images taken while accompanying a project to count Trumpeter Swans. The slides are meticulously labelled and dated. Because Hendrickson's work focused on vegetation, his images provide good documentation of the vegetation landscape and range coverage at a specific point in time. The collection also includes photocopies of a report by Hendrickson on lodgepole pine and a photocopy of a photograph of NPS Director George Harzog. A specimen related to the lodgepole pine study is part of the Museum Collection.
