### DRAFT PREFERRED ALTERNATIVE



### Goals of the Draft Preferred Alternative:

- Ensures that the experiences enjoyed by generations of families are sustained over time.
- Provides visitors the freedom to access Yosemite Valley by private vehicle.
- Reduces traffic congestion and crowding with organized and efficient day-use parking.
- Creates a sense of arrival by redesigning the primary day-use parking area and removing of industrial and administrative functions.
- Improves circulation, reduces congestion and provides for a more relaxed visitor experience.











# **Enhancing Camping Opportunities**

- Expand low-cost camping by 37% in Yosemite Valley
- Provide riparian buffer, and resource appropriate river access
- Additional Camping includes
  - RV camping loop (36 sites)
  - Drive-in camping (42 sites)
  - Group Camping (4 sites)Opportunities
  - Walk-in Camping (132 sites)

### Wilderness

- All zone capacities would remain the same
- Capacity at Merced Lake HSC reduced
- Meadow restoration near Merced Lake
- Boating permitted in all wild segments @ 10 boats/day



## Wawona

- Stables retained and stock day rides continue
- Boating permitted at 10 boats/day
- Swinging Bridge river access improved
- Improvements at the Wawona store area
- Golf course and golf shop retained
- NPS maintenance area redeveloped with new fire station
- Relocate dump station away from river



### **El Portal**

- Remote parking at Abbieville
- Infill housing in Old El Portal
- Infill housing at Rancheria
- Removal of bulk fuel facility
- Boating allowed below Yosemite View Lodge to Foresta Bridge
- Establish valley oak recruitment area
- Remove above-ground abandoned infrastructure







- Odgers Bulk Petroleum Storage in El Portal
- Old Wastewater Treatment Plant in El Portal

## **Facilities Analysis**

5 "To illustrate the level of degradation already experienced in the Merced and maintained under the regime of interim limits proposed by NPS, we need look no further than the dozens of facilities and services operating within the river corridor, including but not limited to, the many...

-- (Friends of Yosemite v. Kempthorne, 9th Circ., 2008)

...swimming pools, tennis courts, mountain sports shops, restaurants, cafeterias, bars, snack stands, and other food and beverage services, gift shops, general merchandise stores, an ice-skating rink, an amphitheater, a specialty gift shop, a camp store, an art activity center, rental facilities for bicycles and rafts, skis and other equipment, a golf course and a dining hall accommodating 70 people."
