## **2023 Backcountry and River Use Statistics**

## Summary Overview

Three issues from calendar year 2023 deserve special note.

**Winter/Spring Storms:** Strong winter and spring storms limited access to many backcountry sites. The North Rim had a delayed opening of June 2nd, the North Kaibab Trail above Cottonwood Campground was closed until June 16<sup>th</sup>, and North Rim backcountry roads did not open until July 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Trans-Canyon-Waterline (TCWL):** The park's huge endeavor to replace the TCWL began in earnest during 2023. As part of this work, Bright Angel Trail, including Havasupai Gardens Campground as well as the Plateau Point Spur Trail, was shut down for all of December (continuing into the subsequent year).

**Recreation.gov:** Backcountry permits transitioned to Recreation.gov at the end of 2023. Next year backcountry statistics will be generated through Recreation.gov, and many reports will be different.

Readers will see evidence of the above within the following pages, numbers, and graphs.

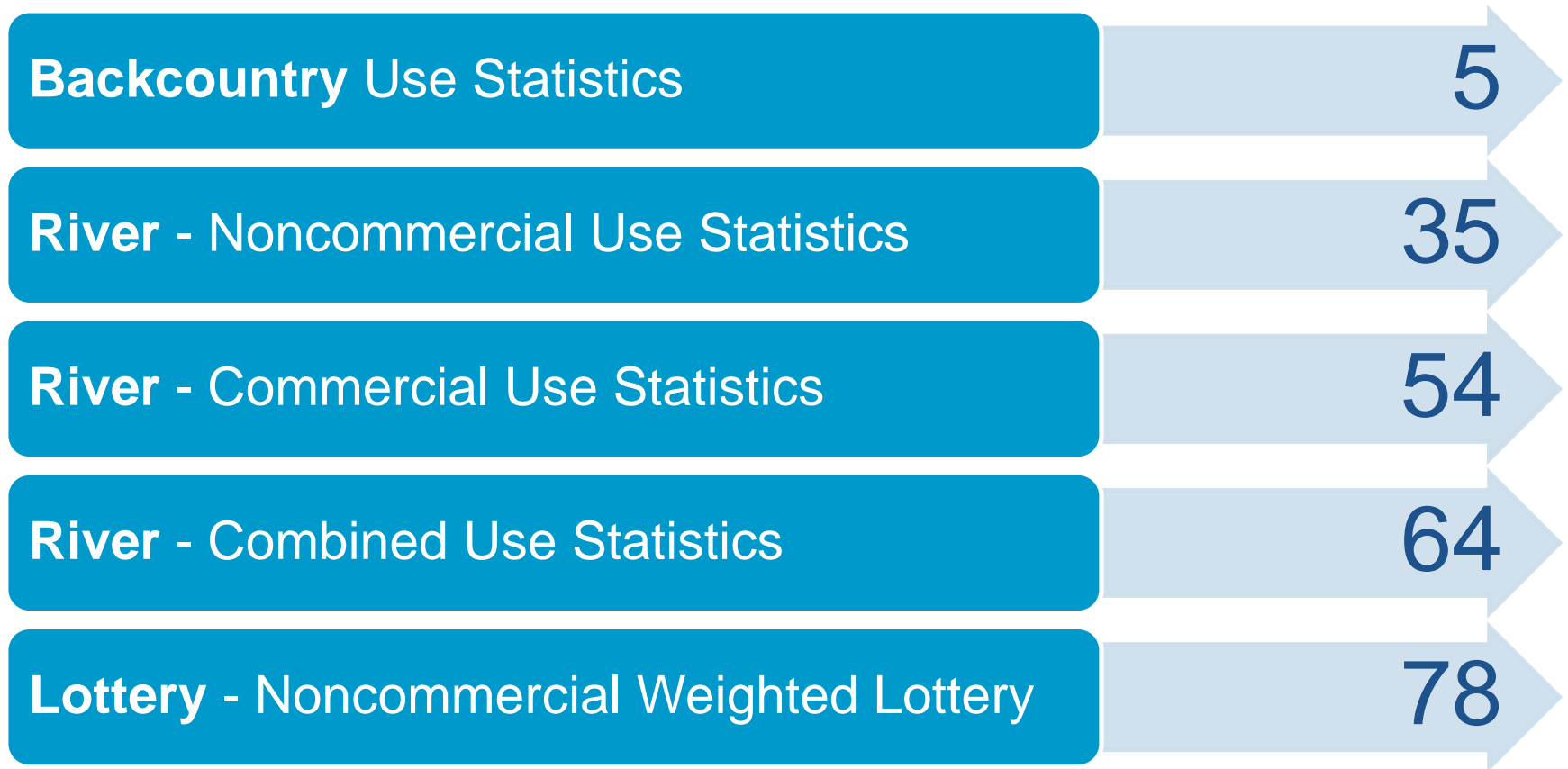

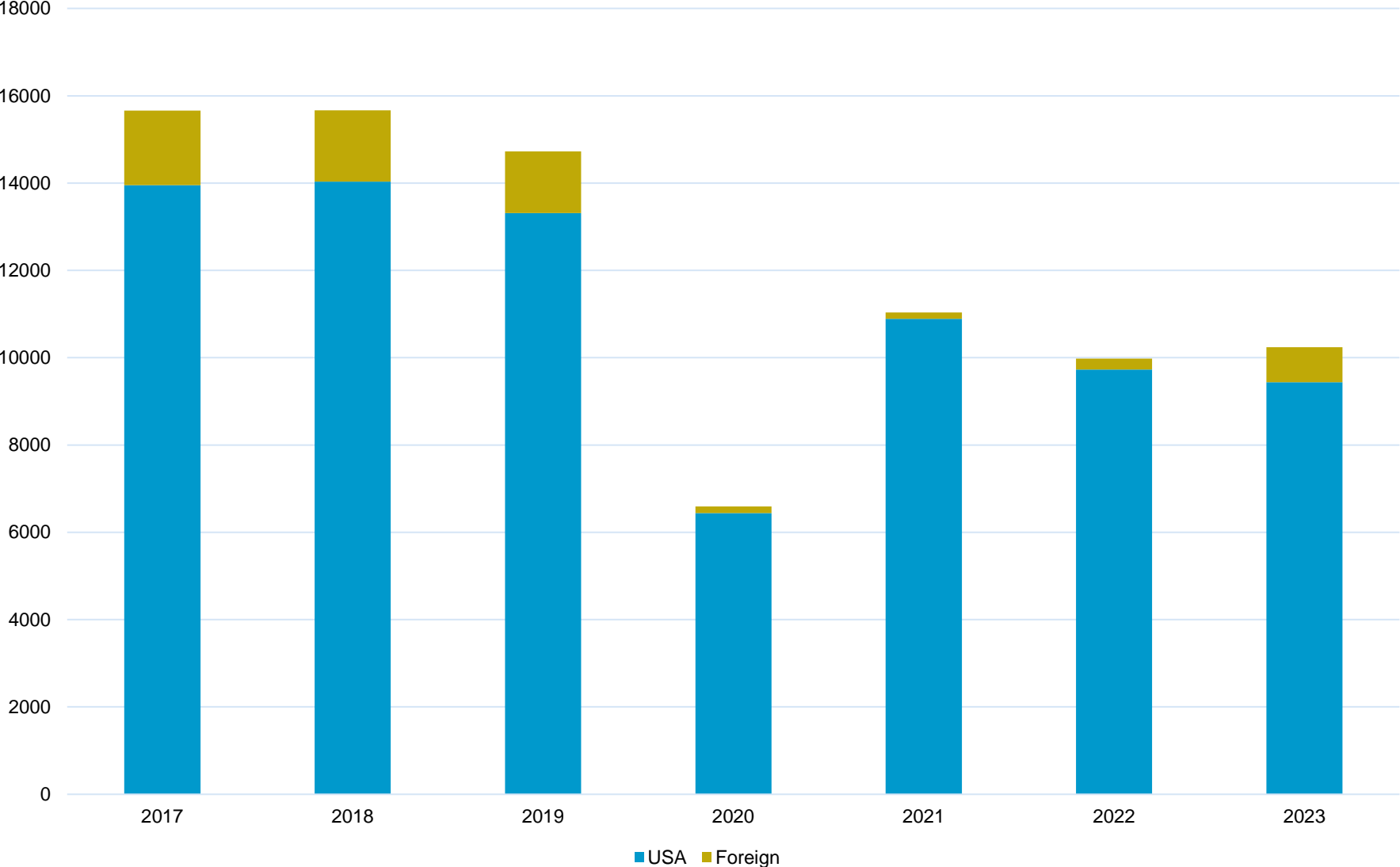

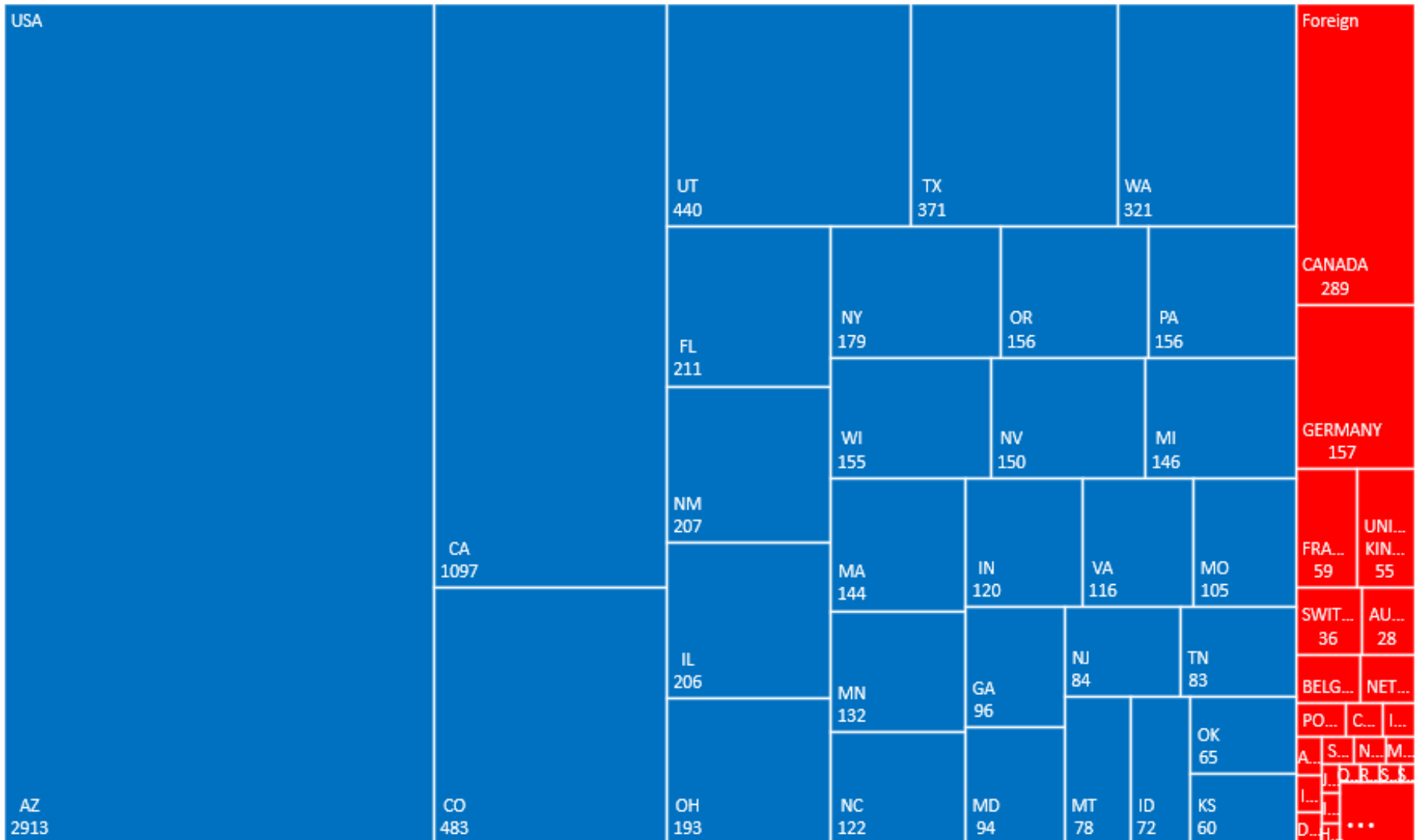
## Backcountry Trip Leaders: USA vs. Foreign

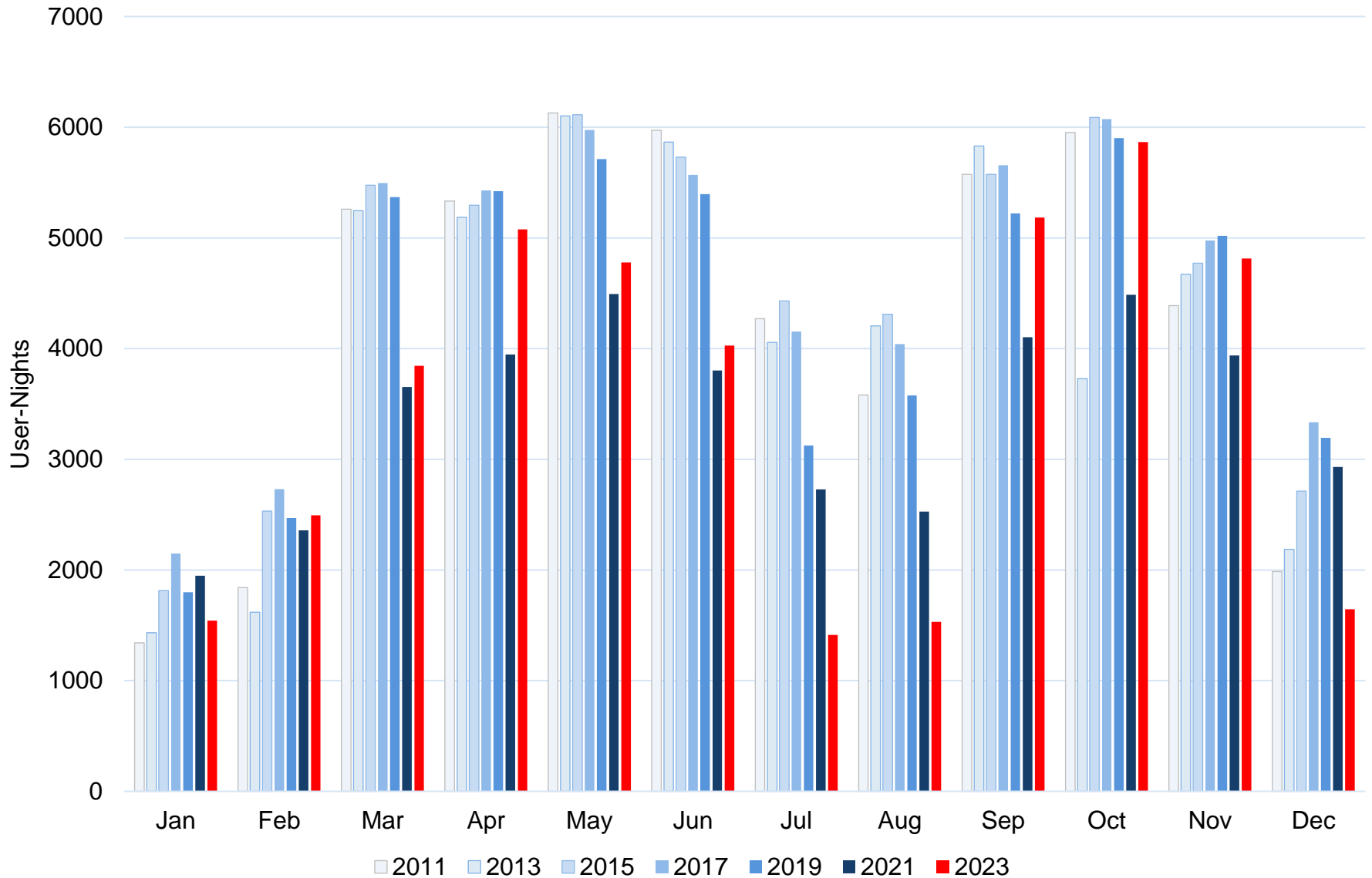

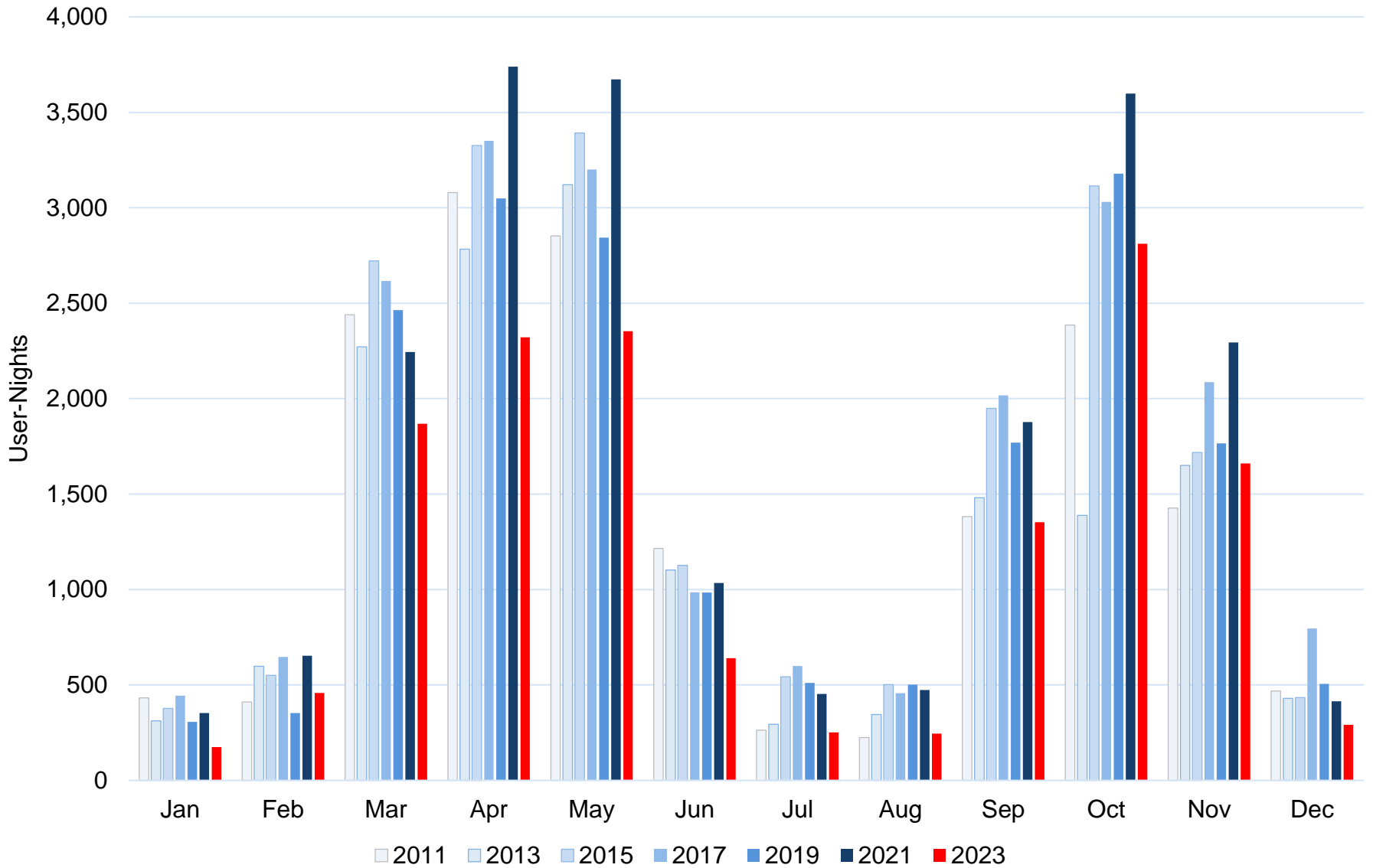

## Threshold Use Areas User-Nights



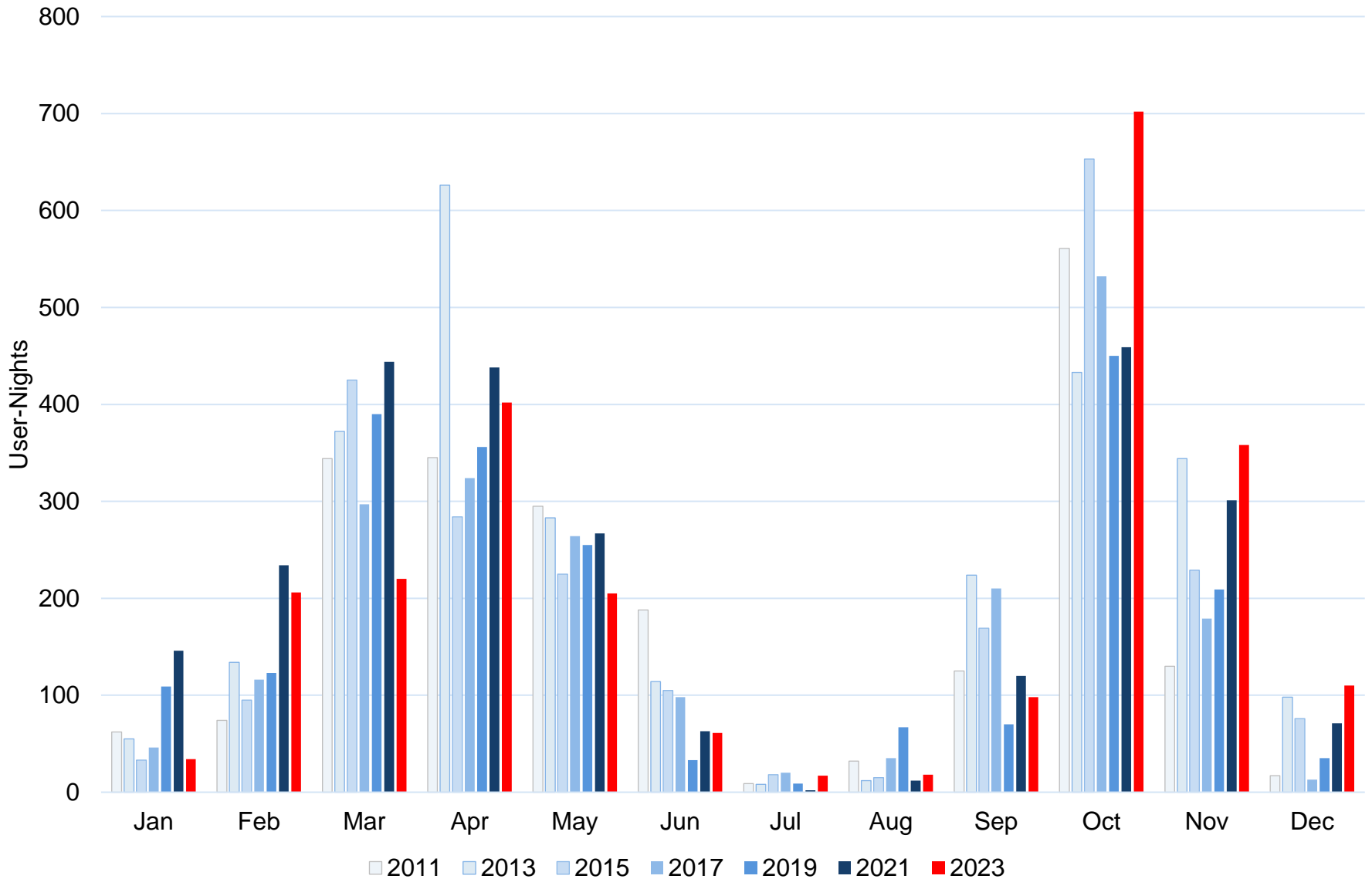

## Primitive Use Areas User-Nights



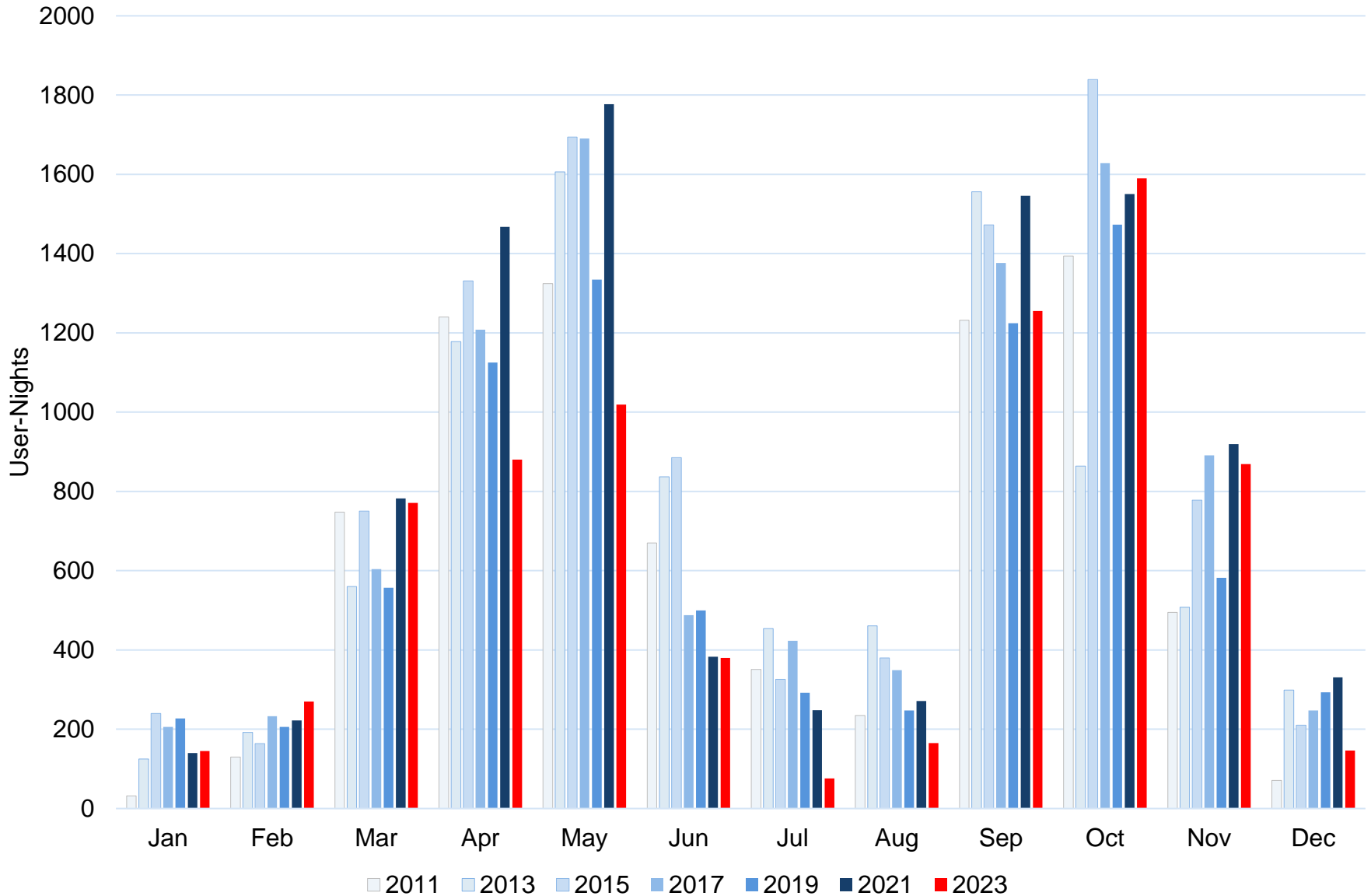

## Wild Use Areas User-Nights



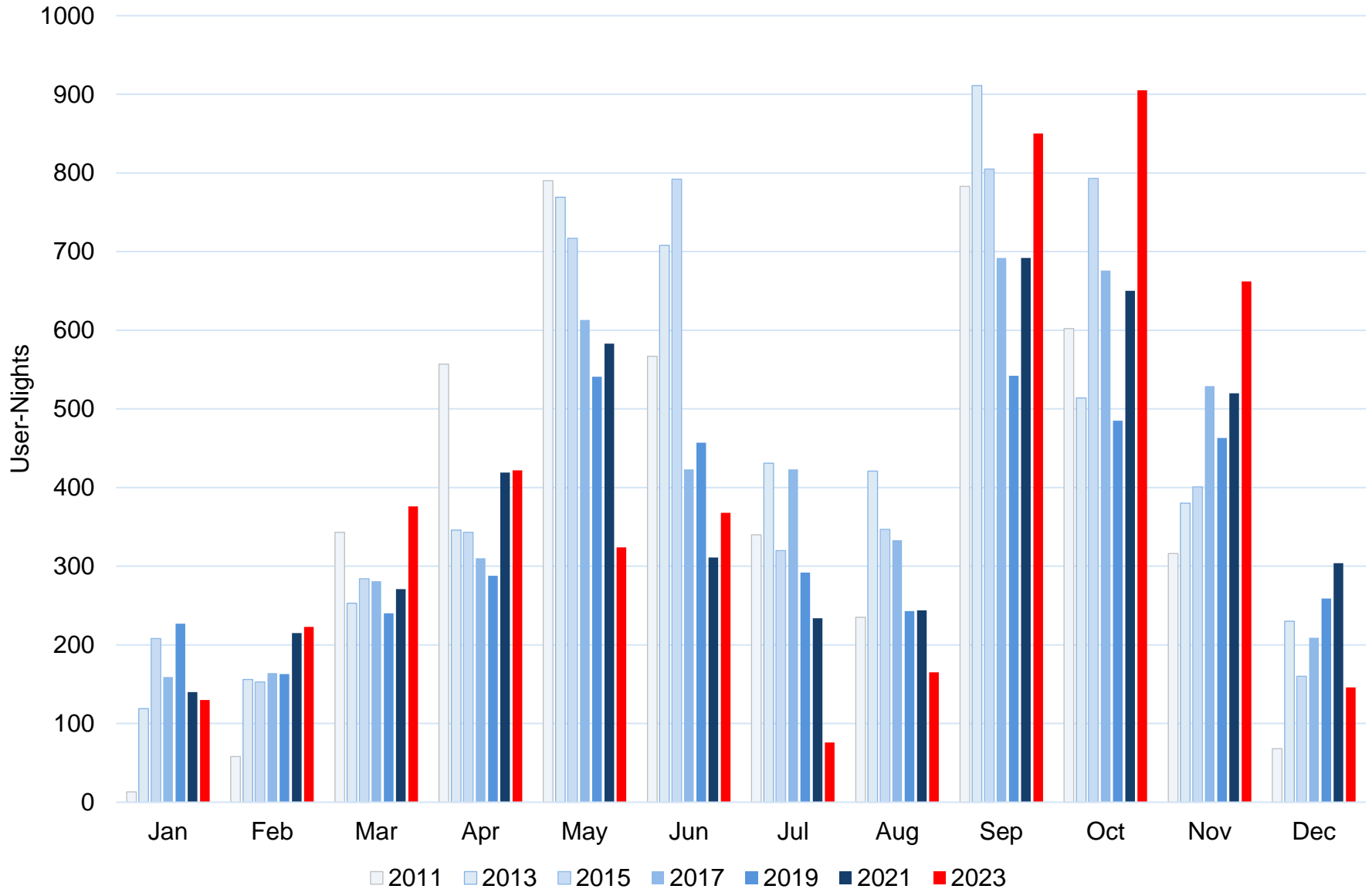

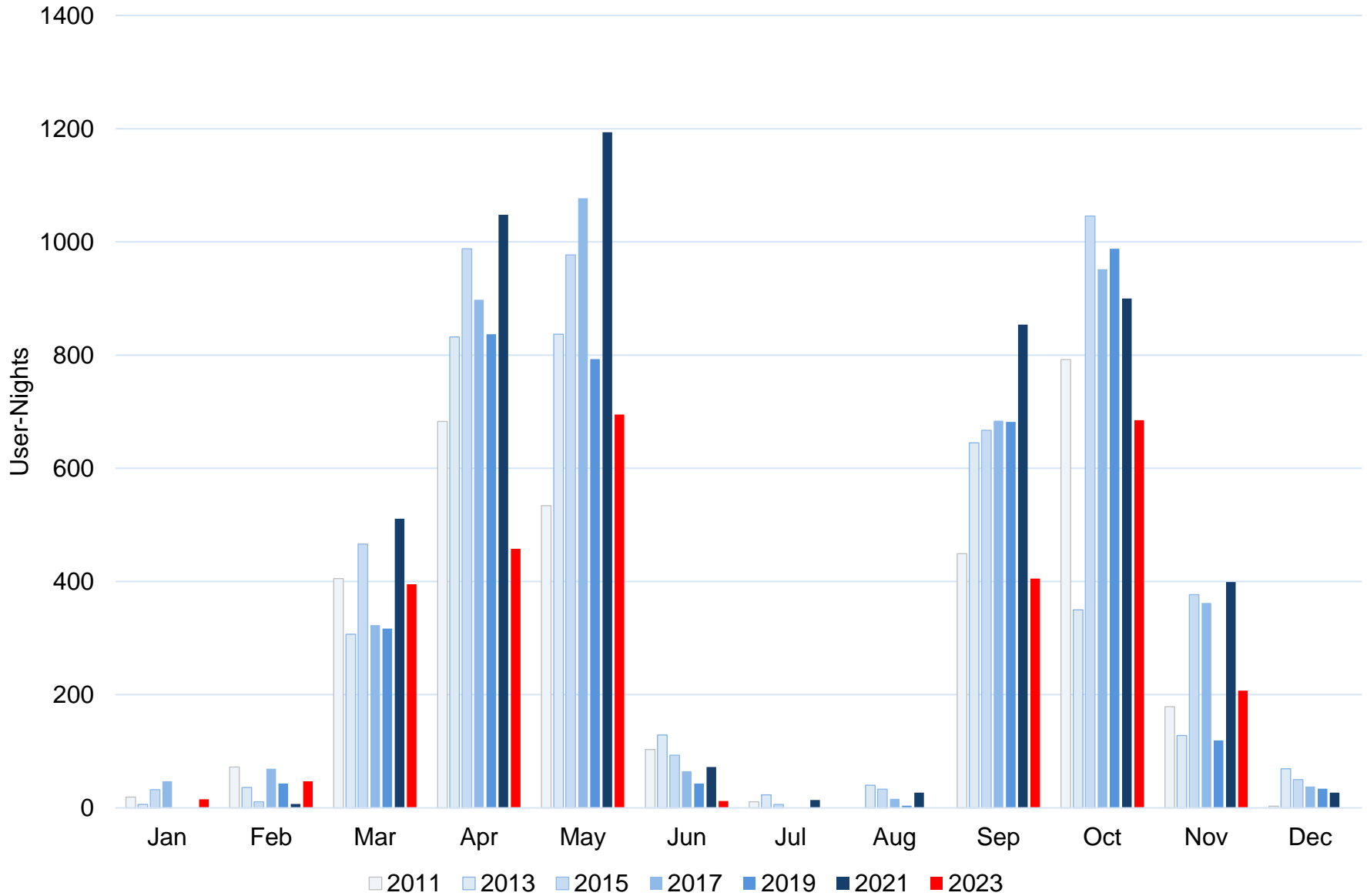

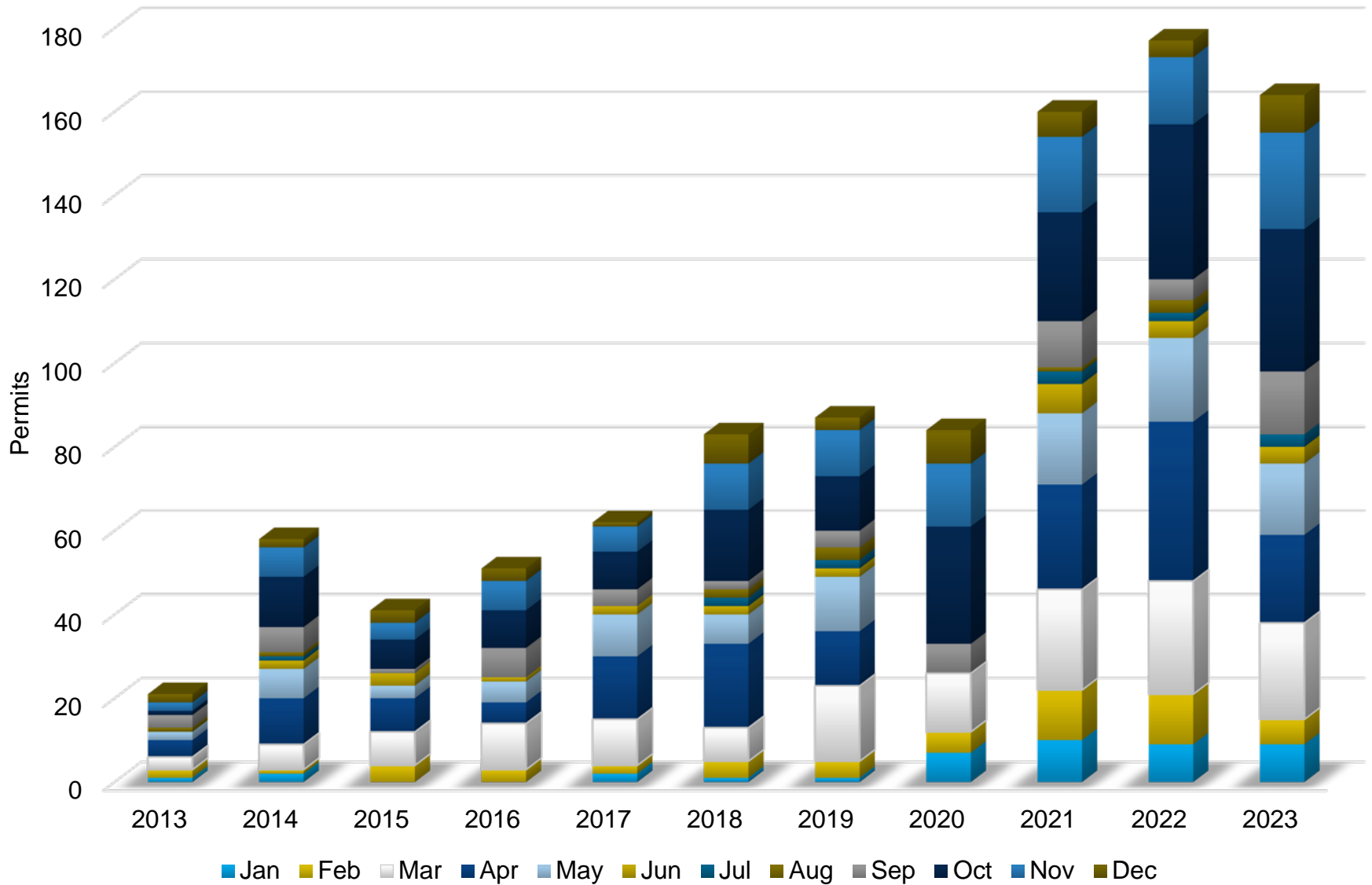

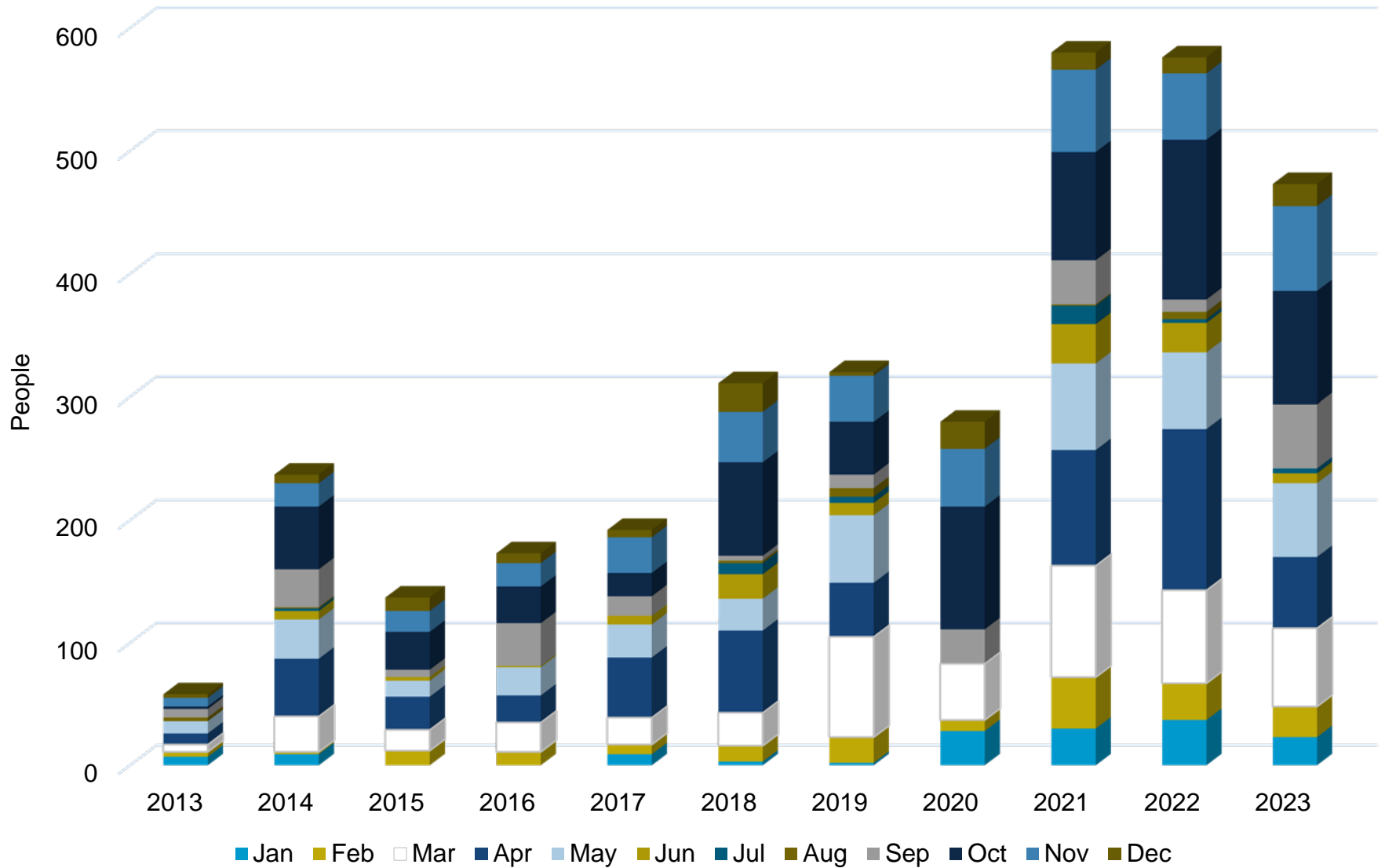
# Backcountry User-Nights in 2023: Corridor and Non-Corridor



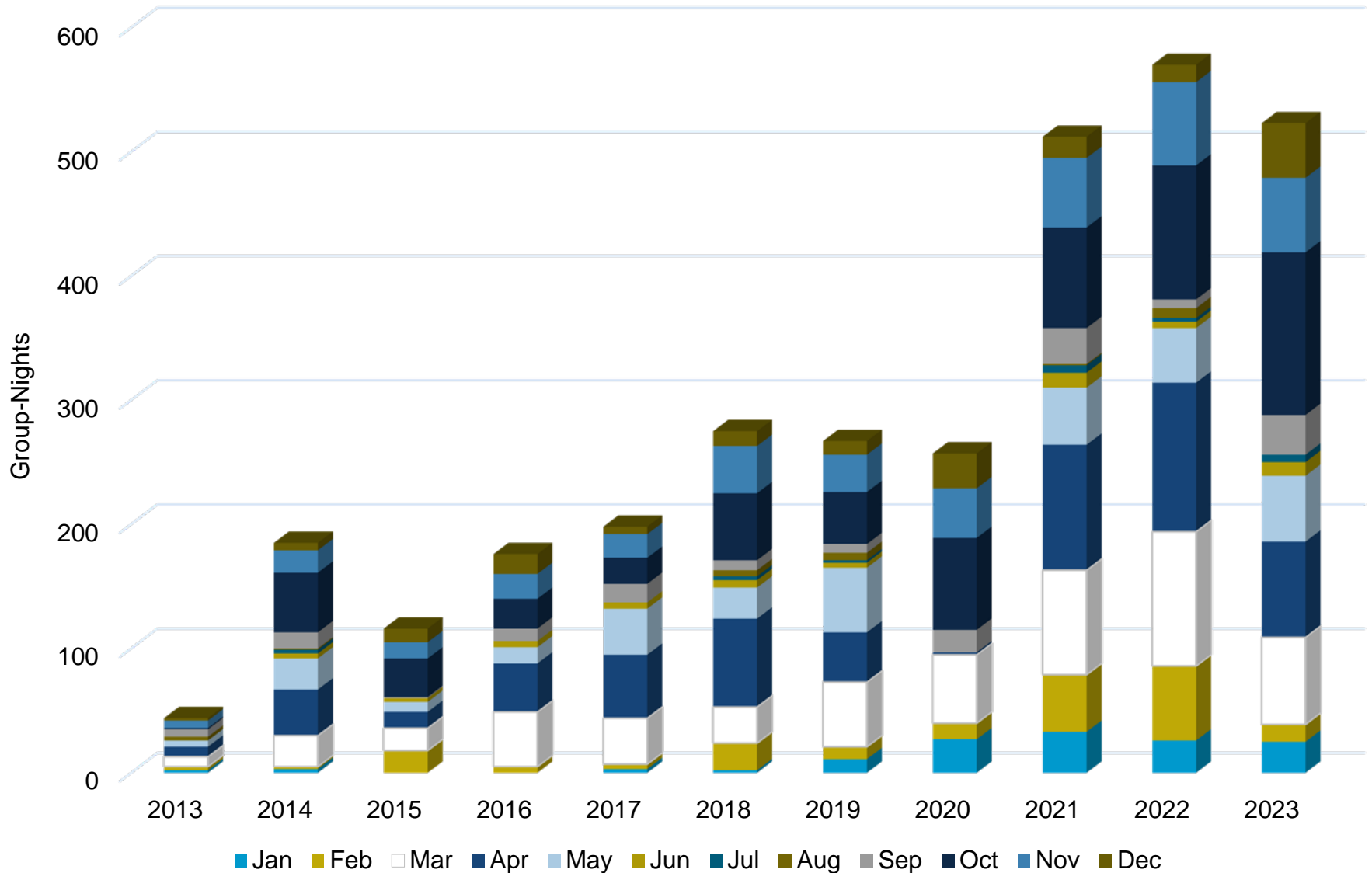

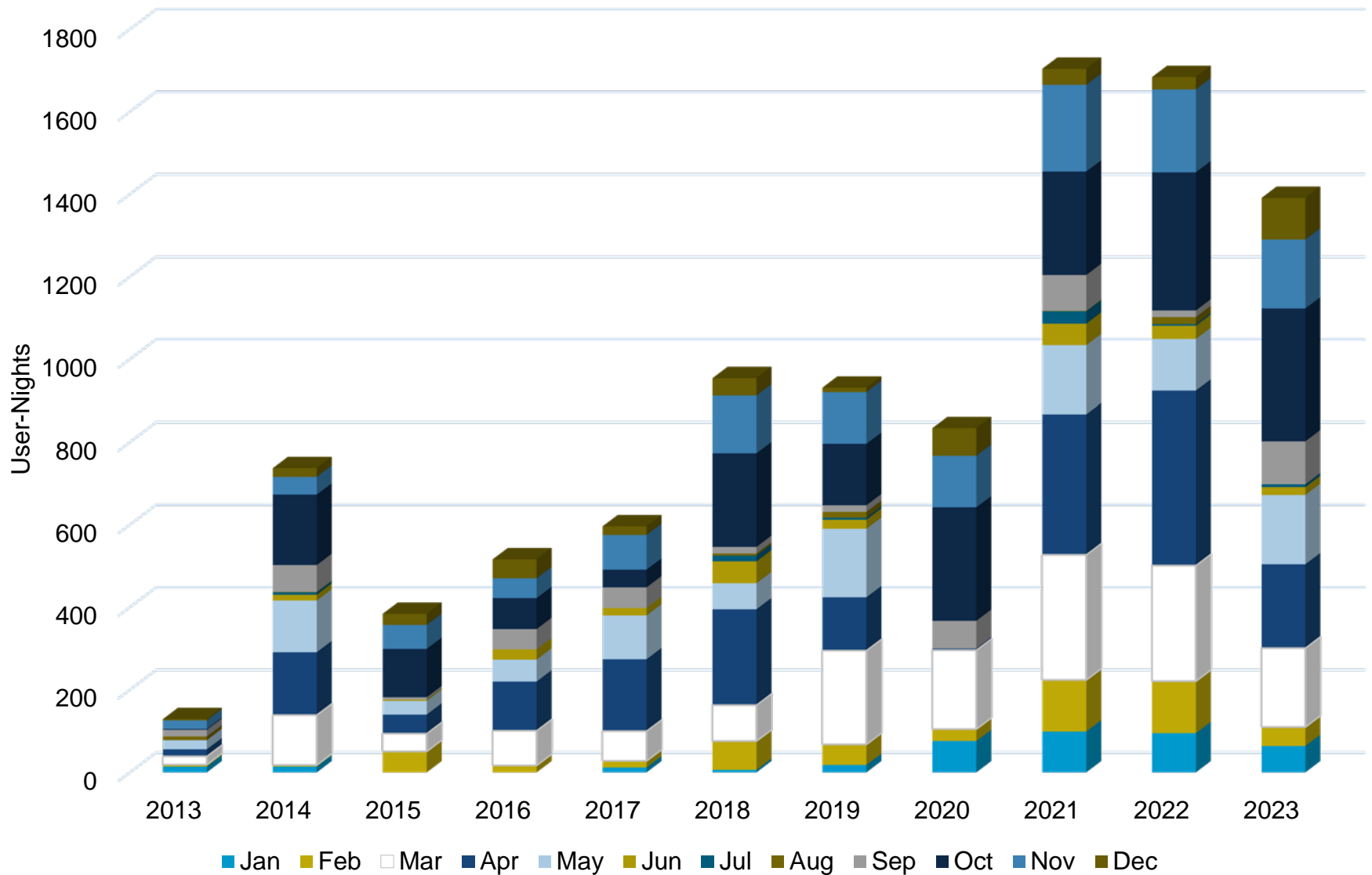

## River – Lees Ferry to Diamond Creek Noncommercial User-Days

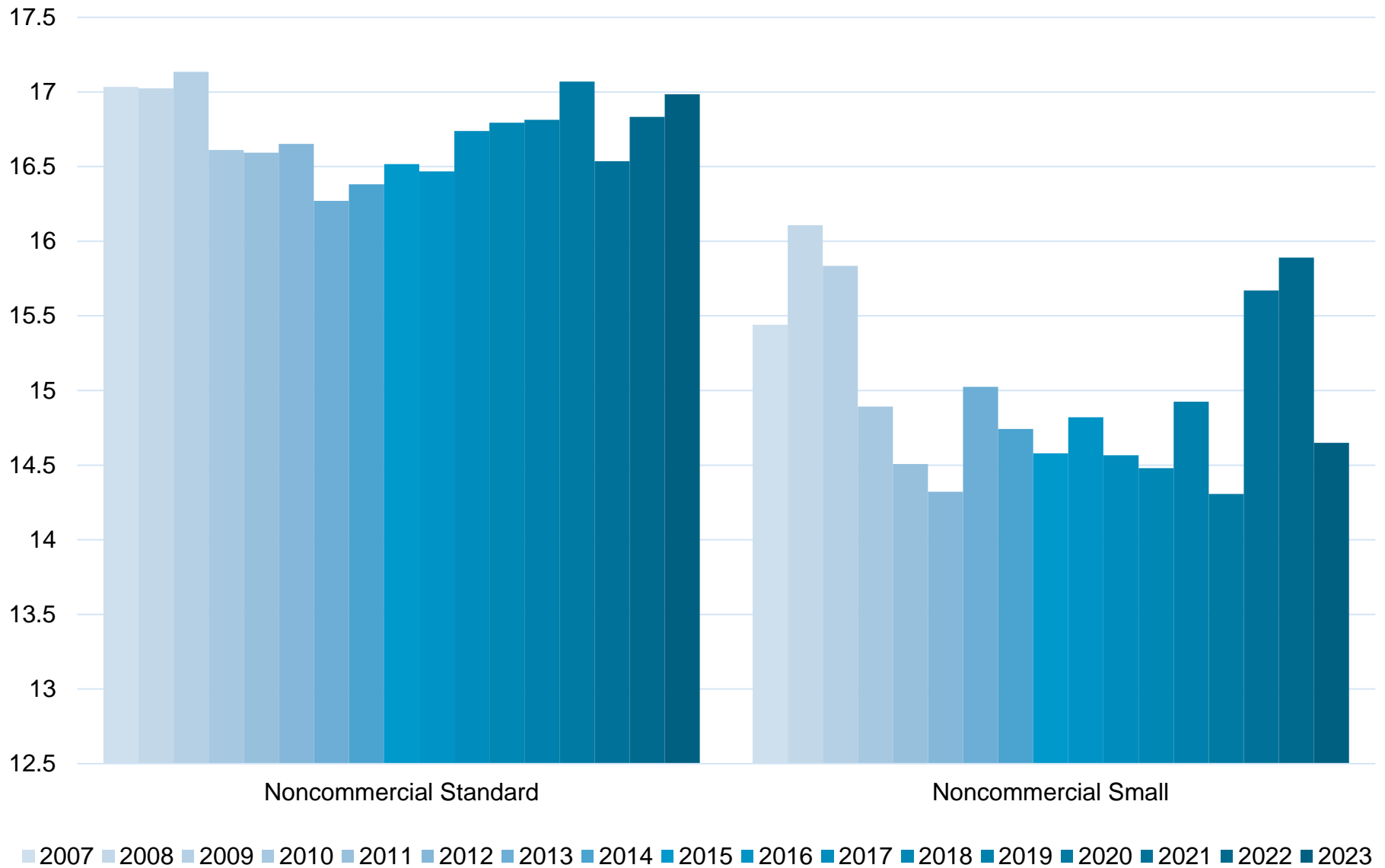

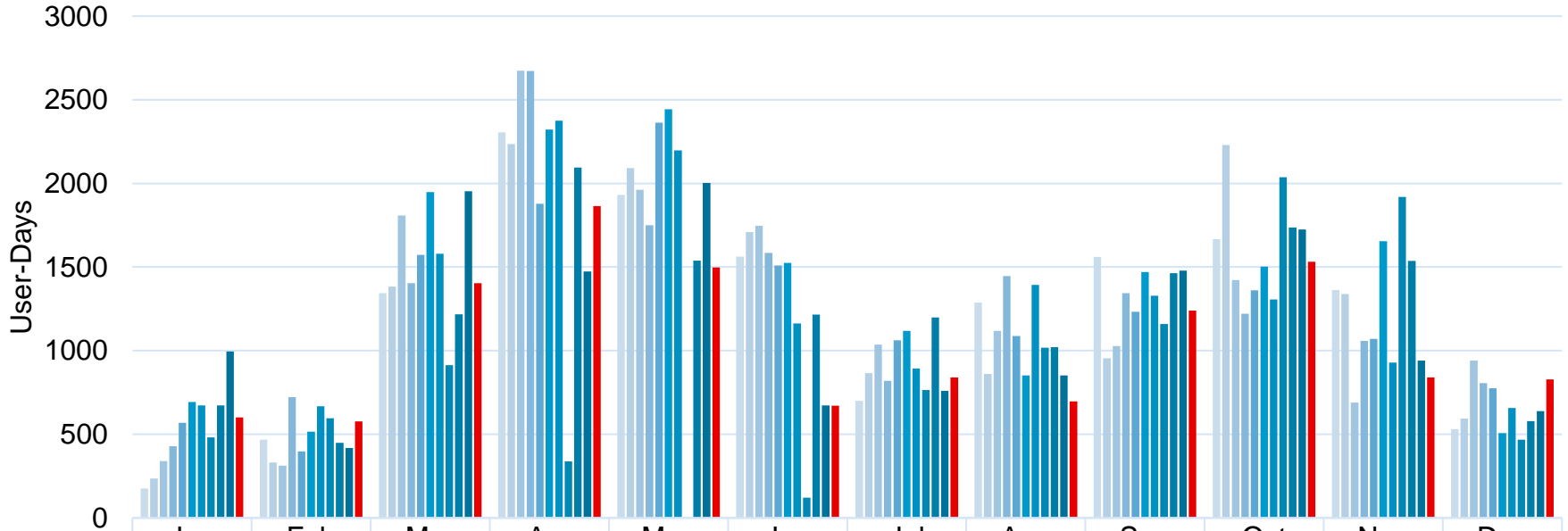

# River – Lees Ferry to Diamond Creek Commercial Participant Ages in 2023



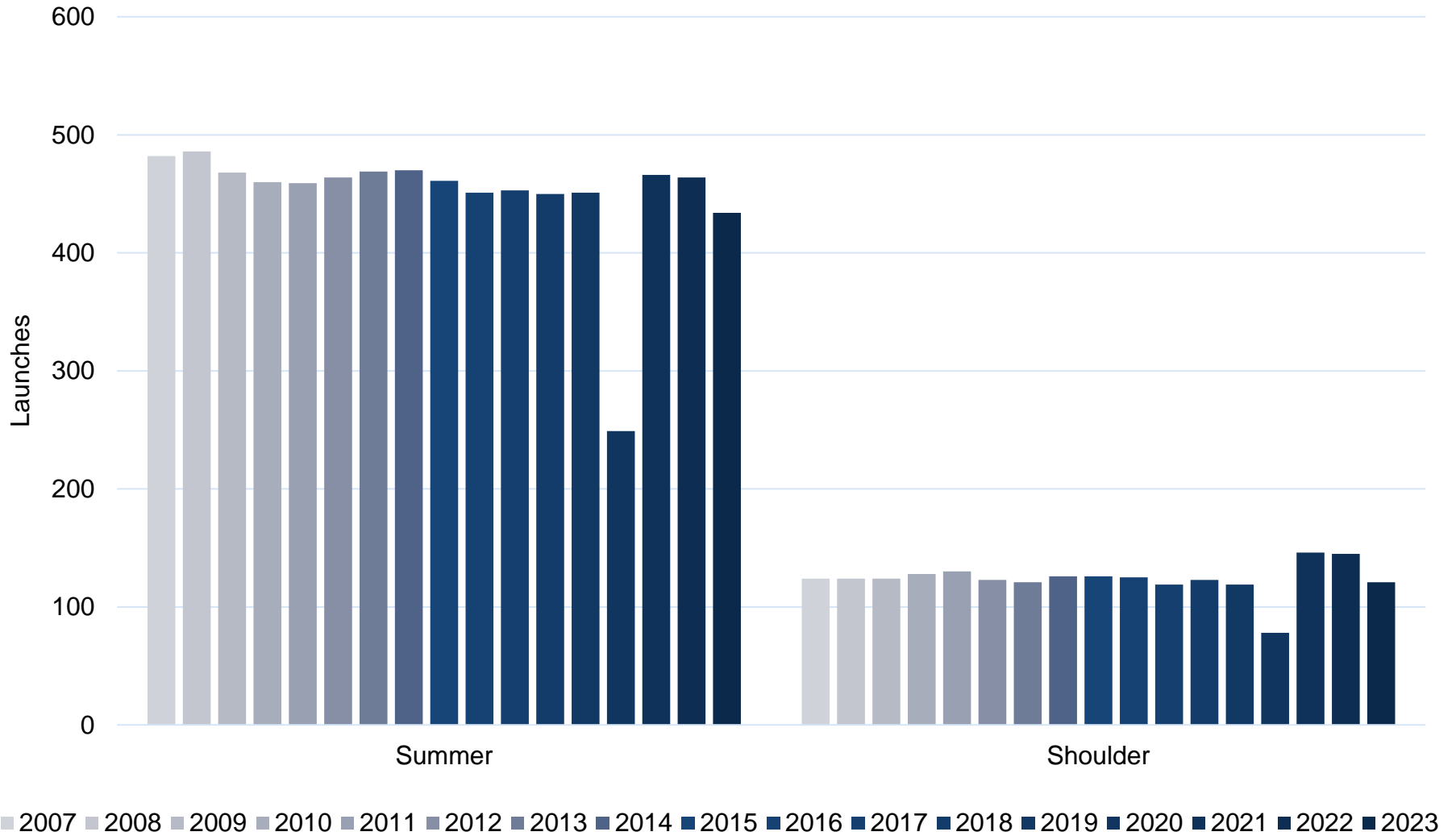

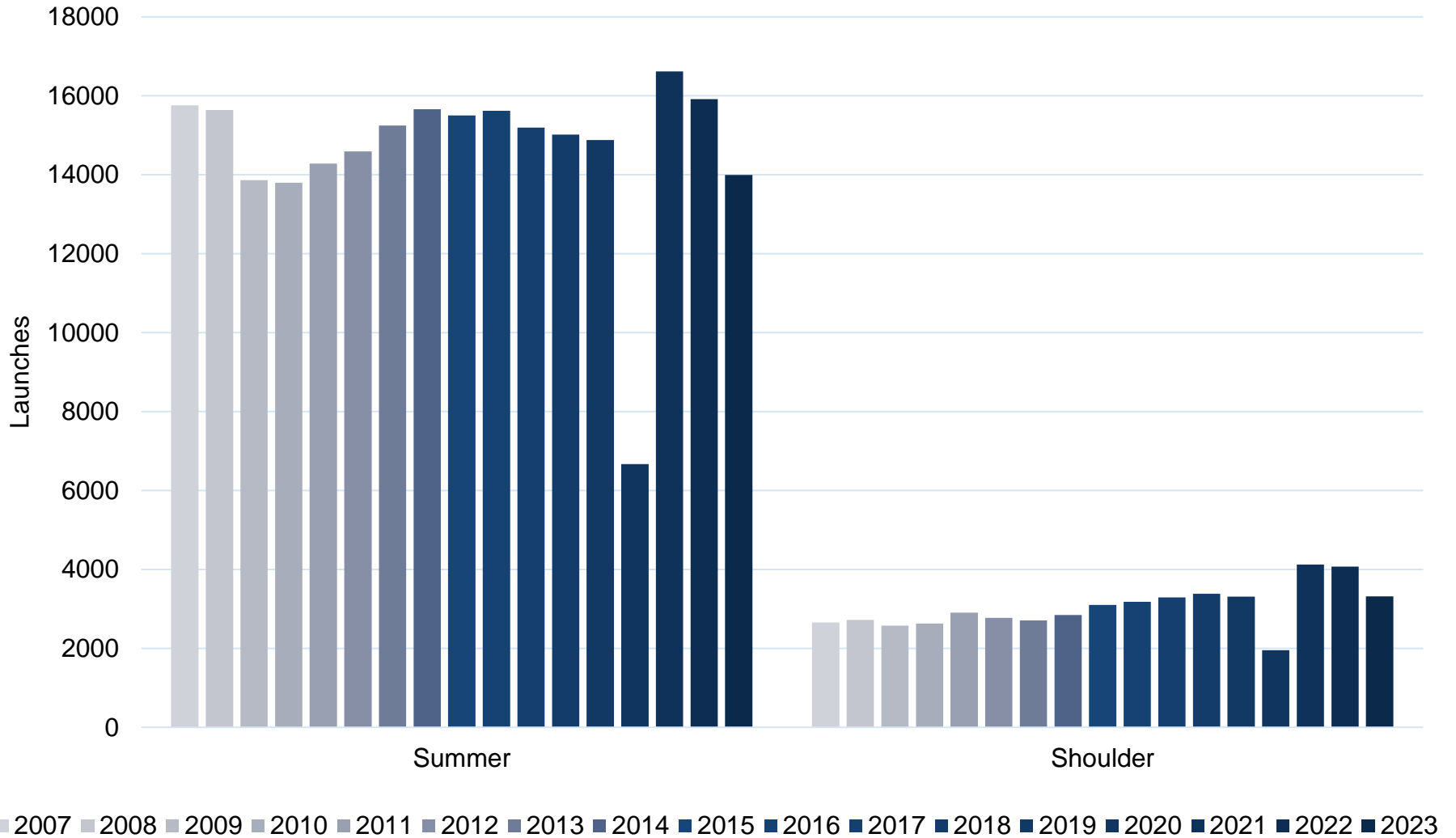

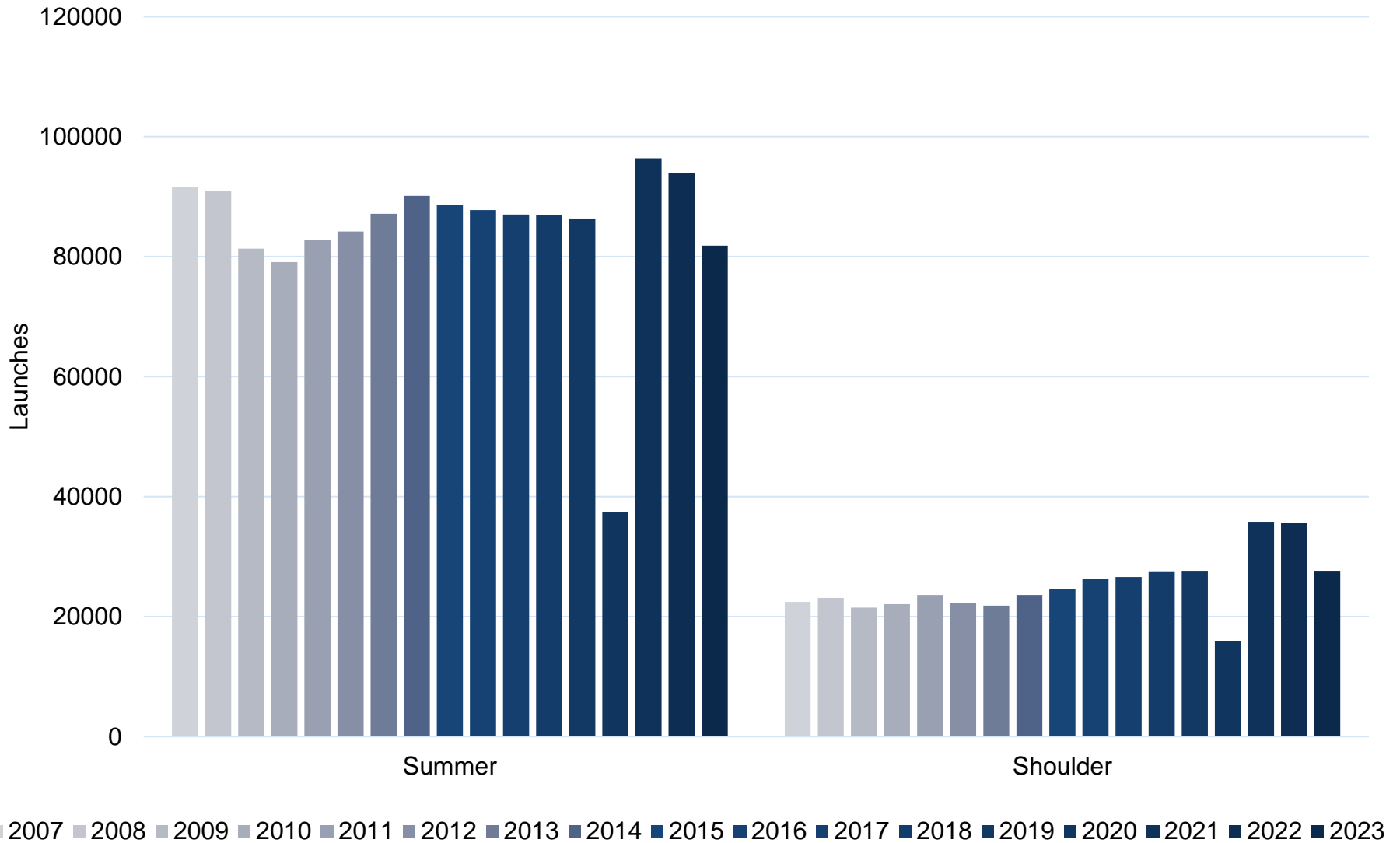

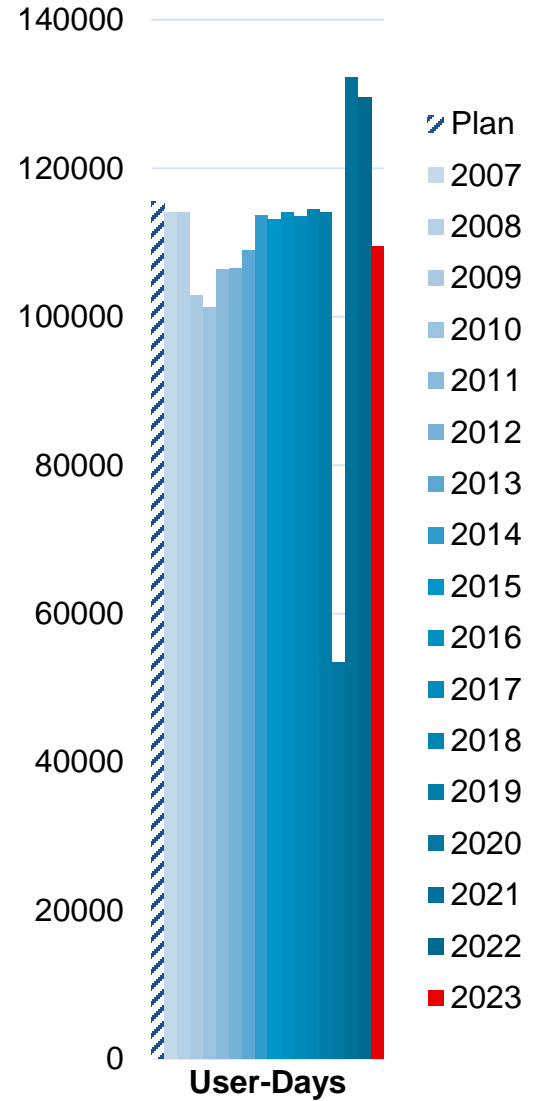
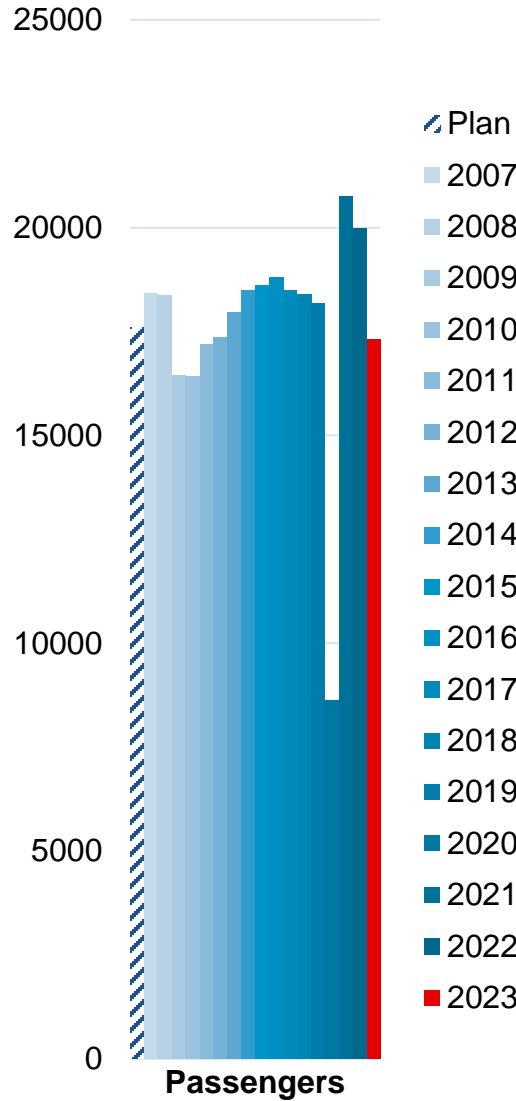
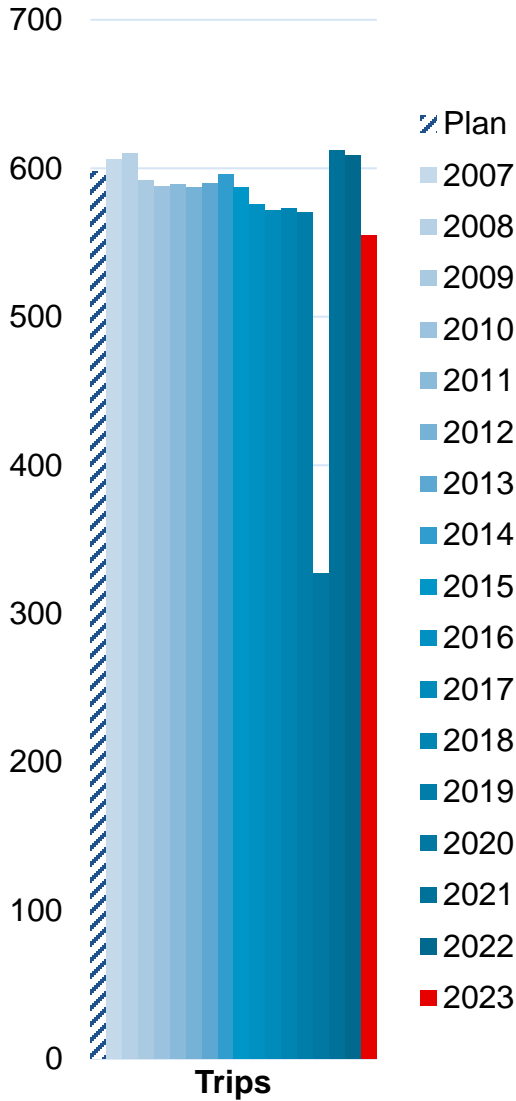
# River – Lees Ferry to Diamond Creek Commercial Passenger Counts by Season



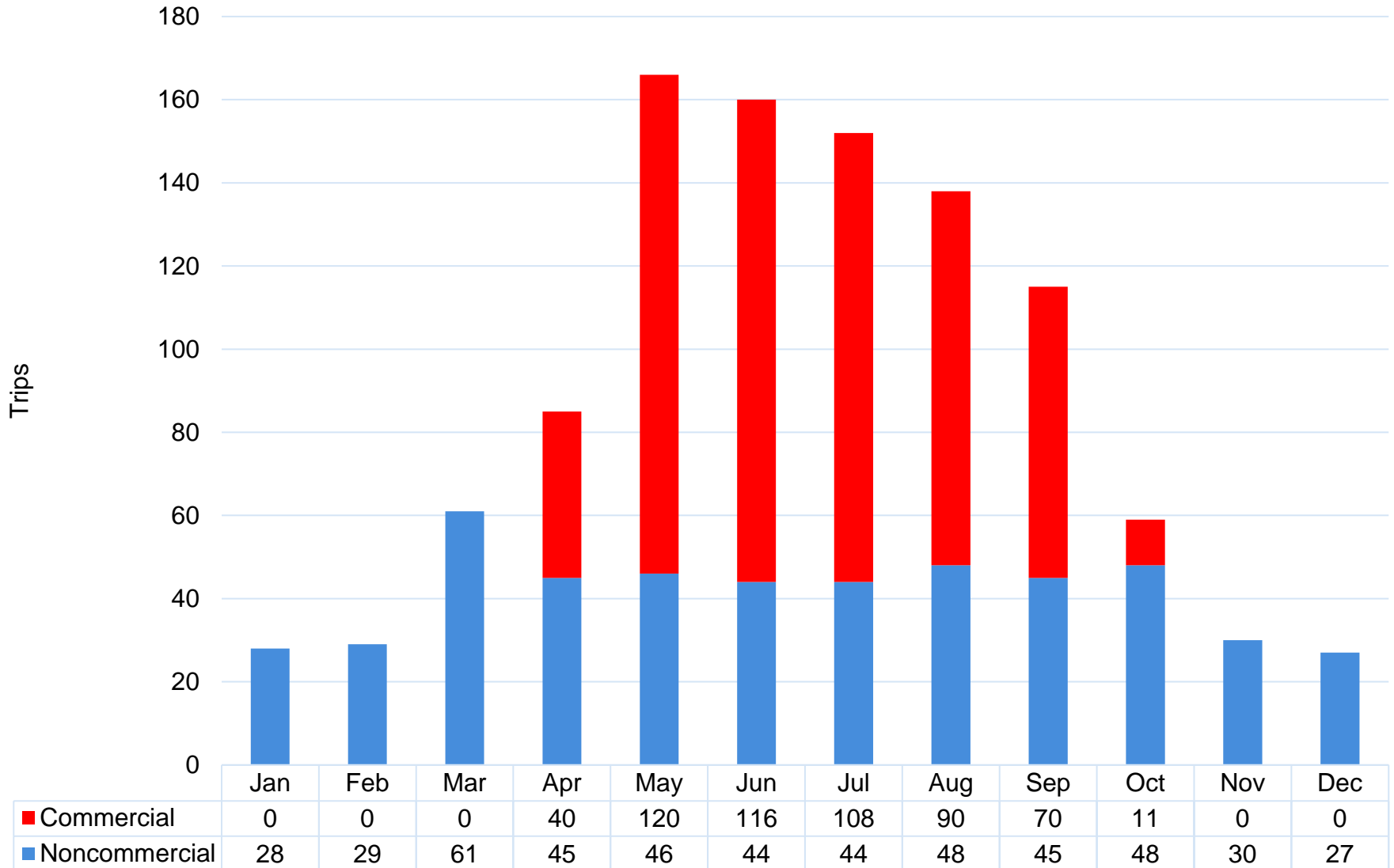

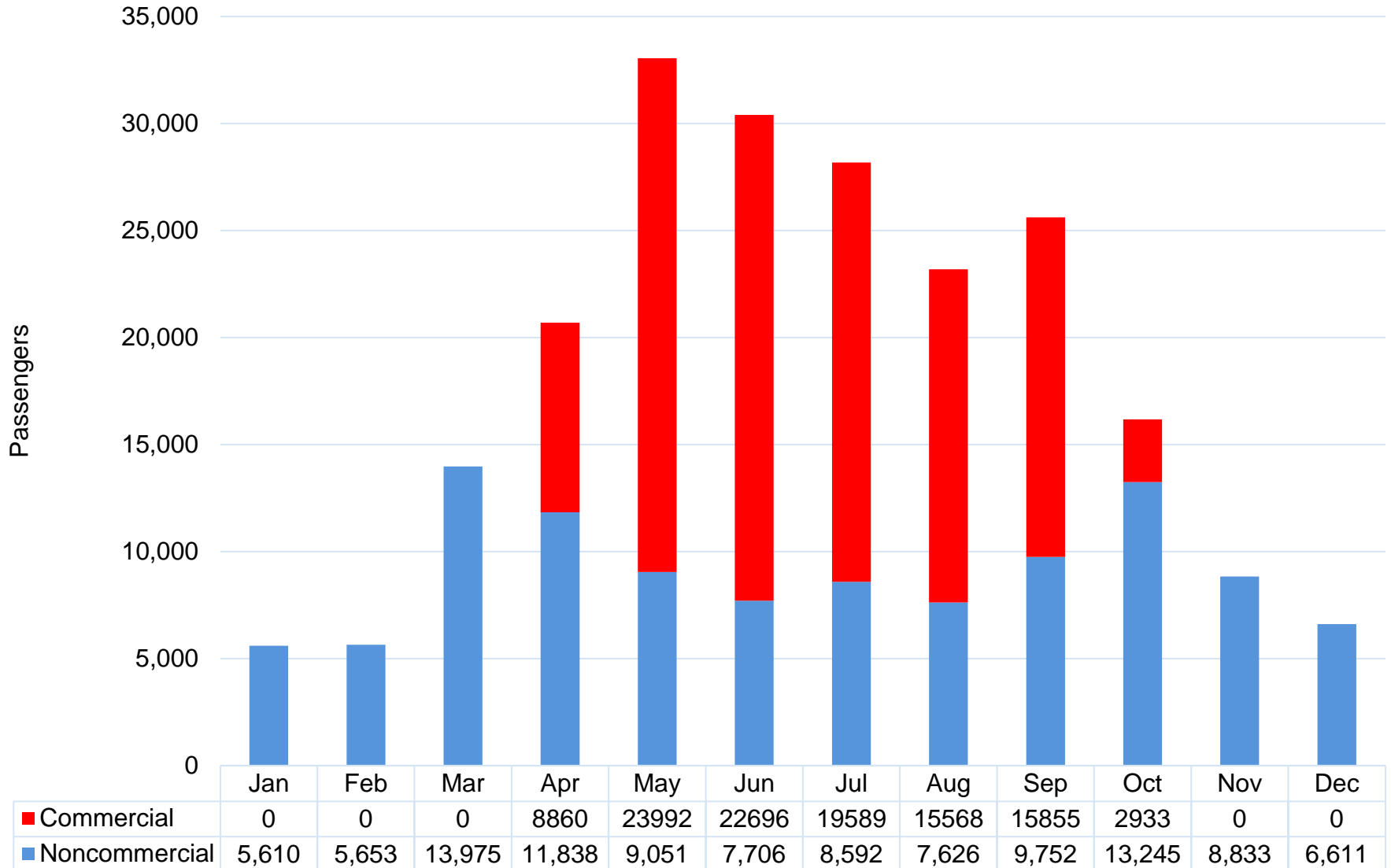
## River – Lees Ferry to Diamond Creek Combined Total Use Trips in 2023



## River – Lees Ferry to Diamond Creek Combined Total Use Passengers in 2023

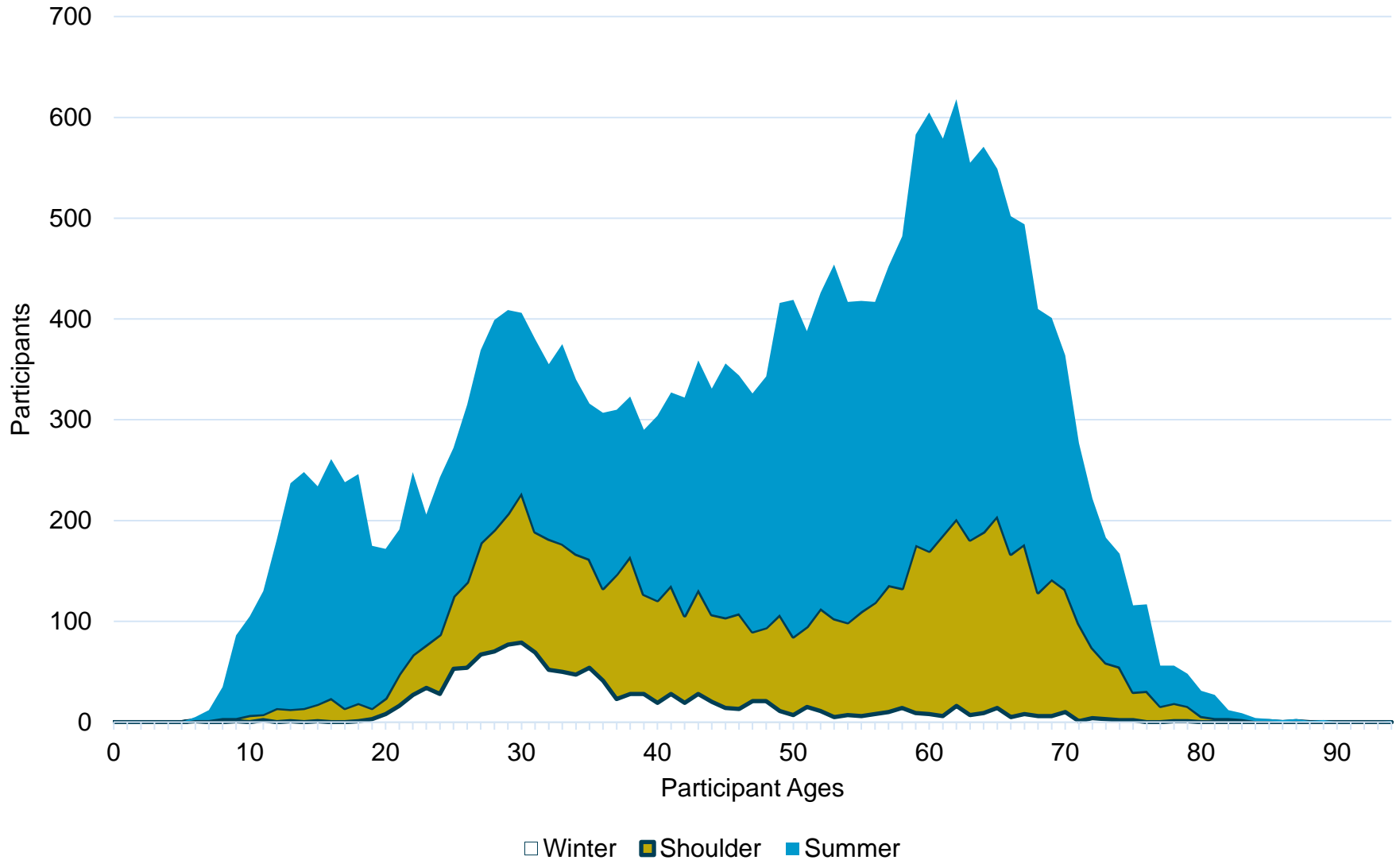

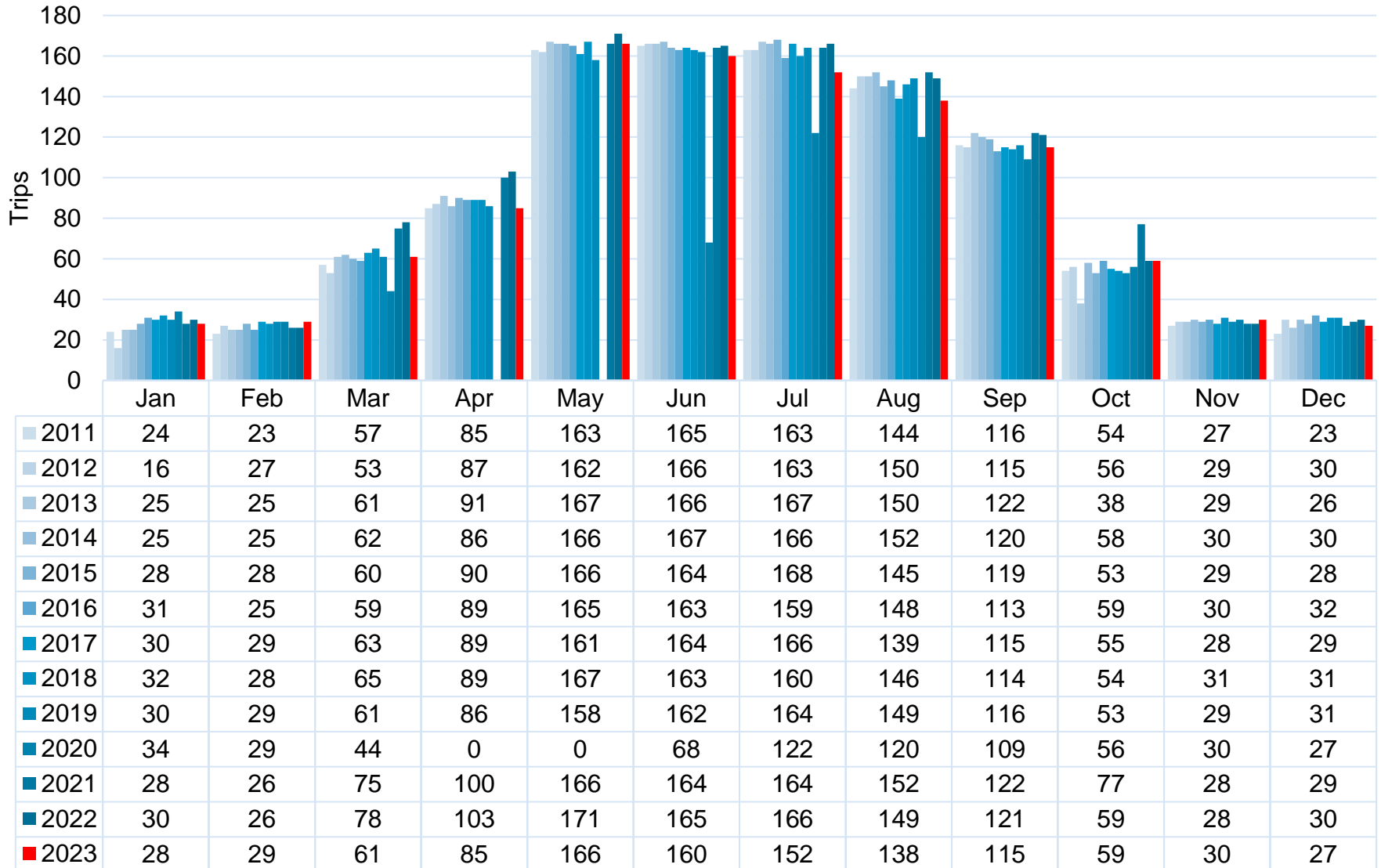




# River – Lees Ferry to Diamond Creek Combined Total Use Participant Ages by Season in 2023

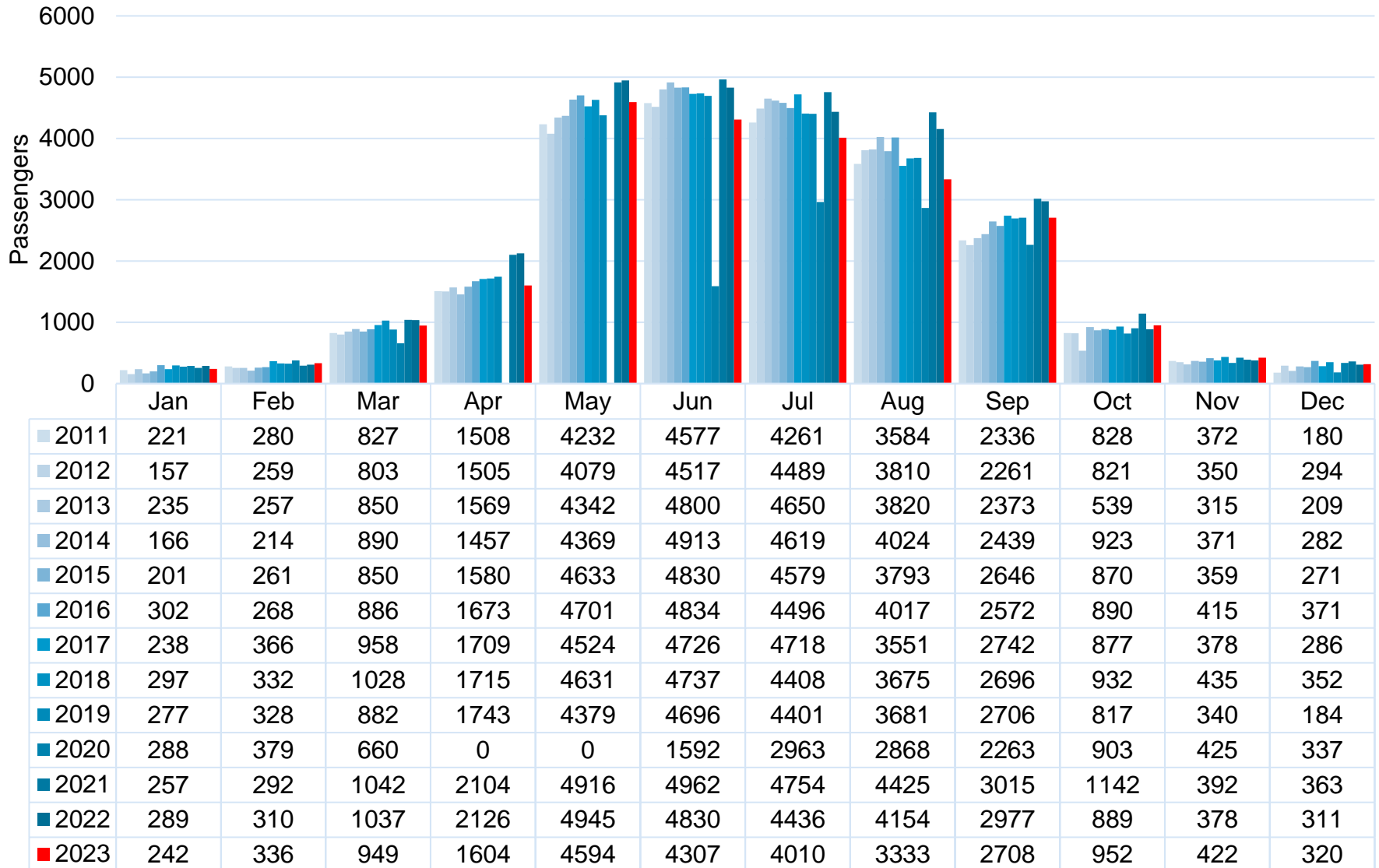

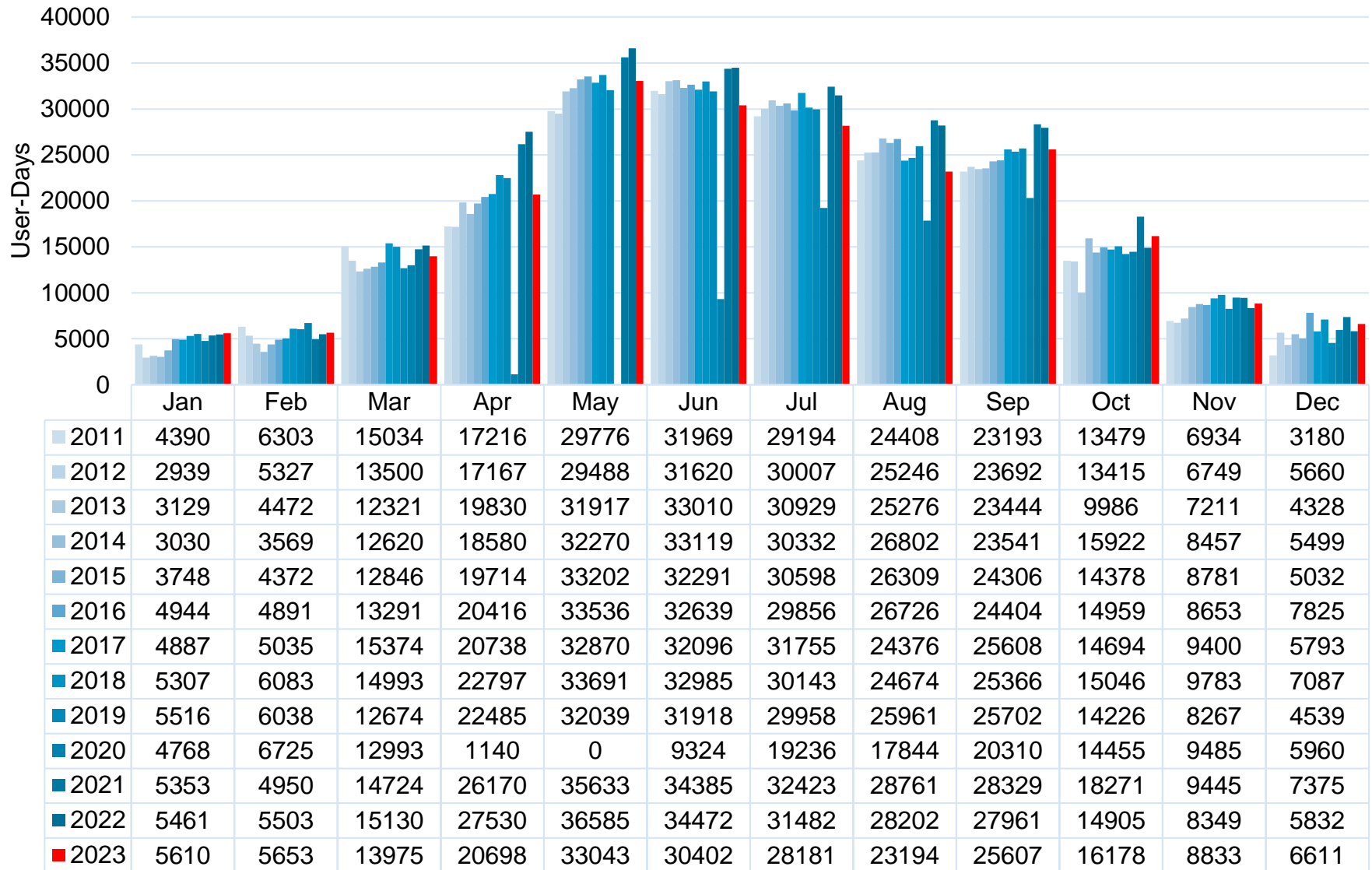

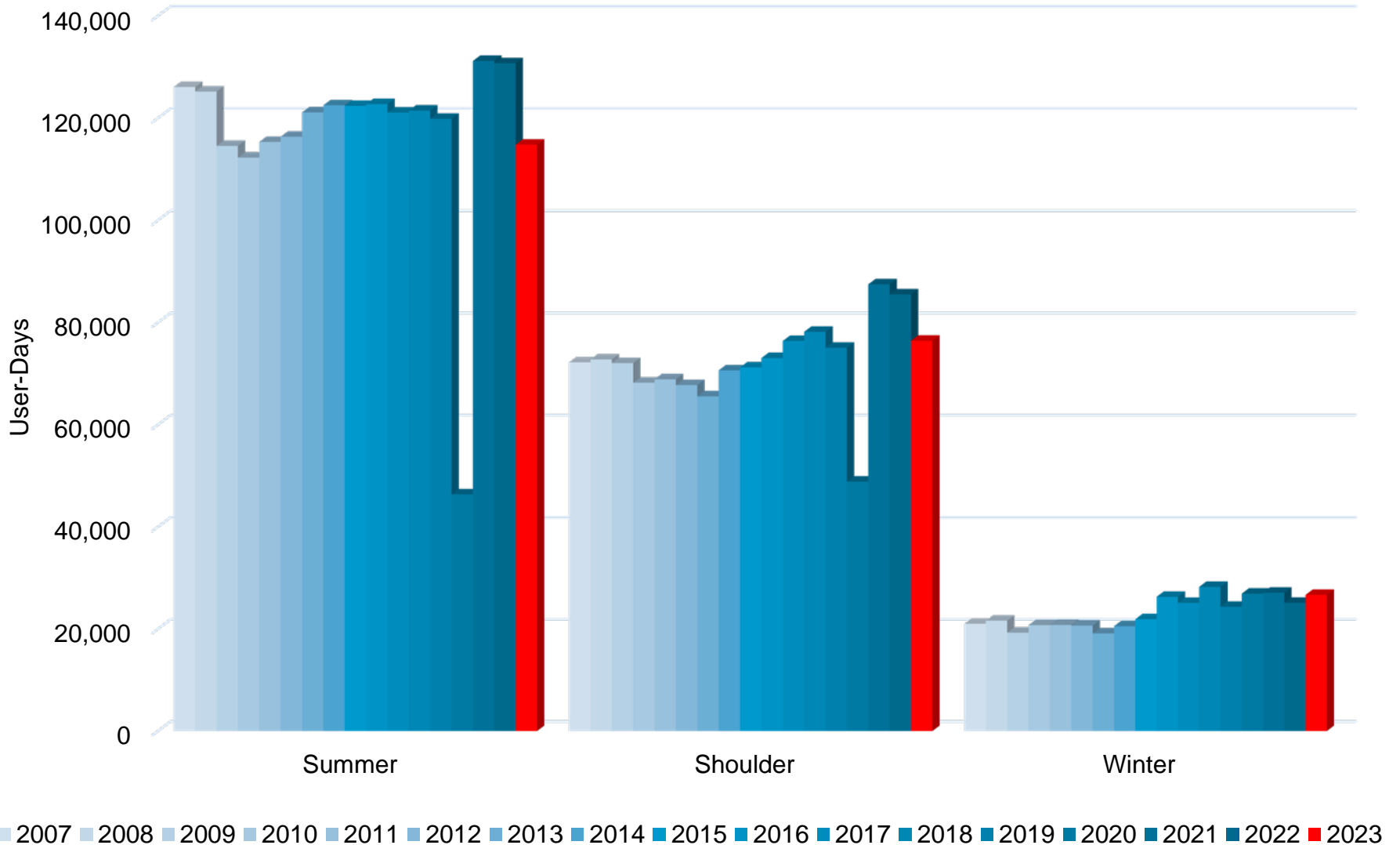

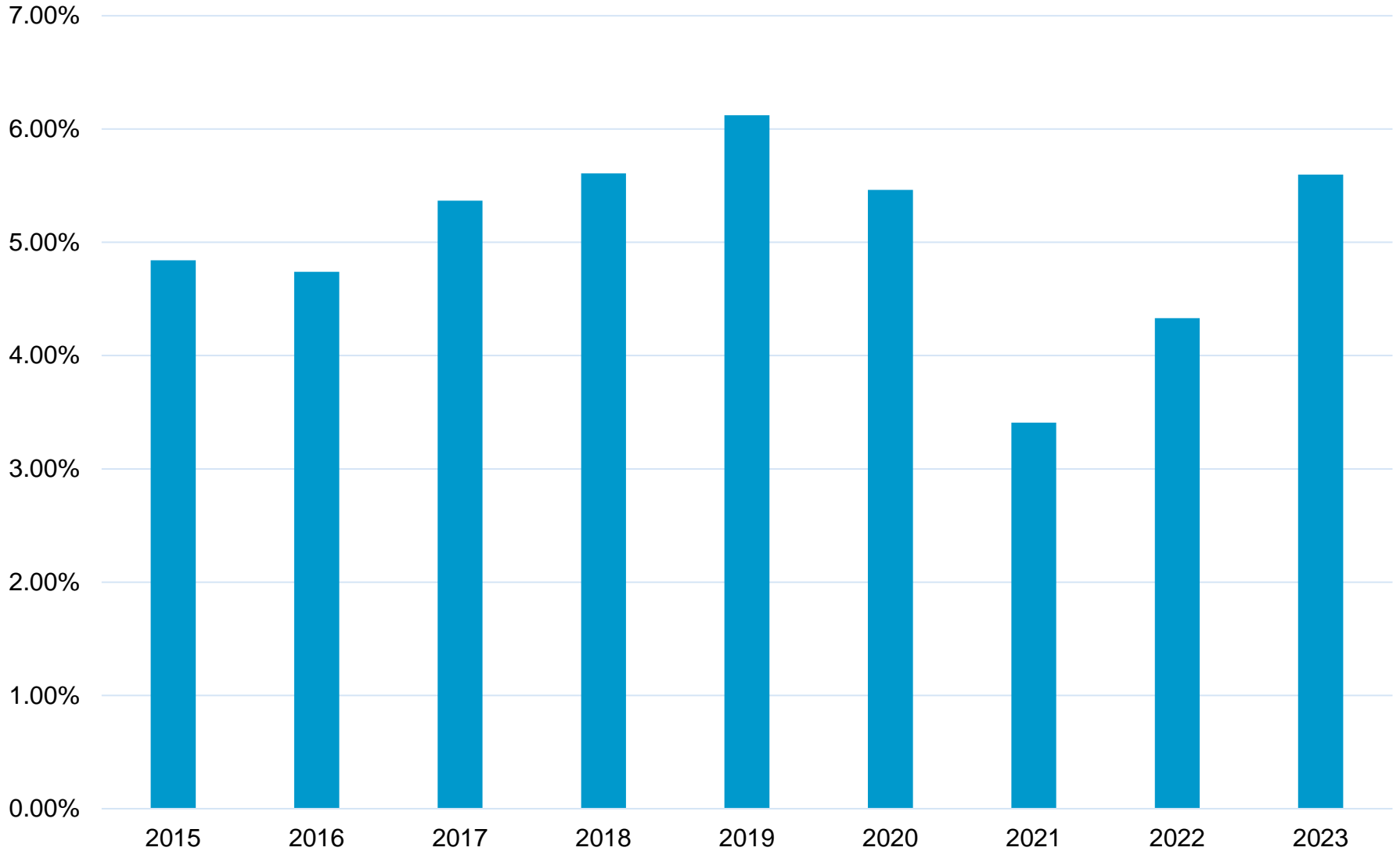

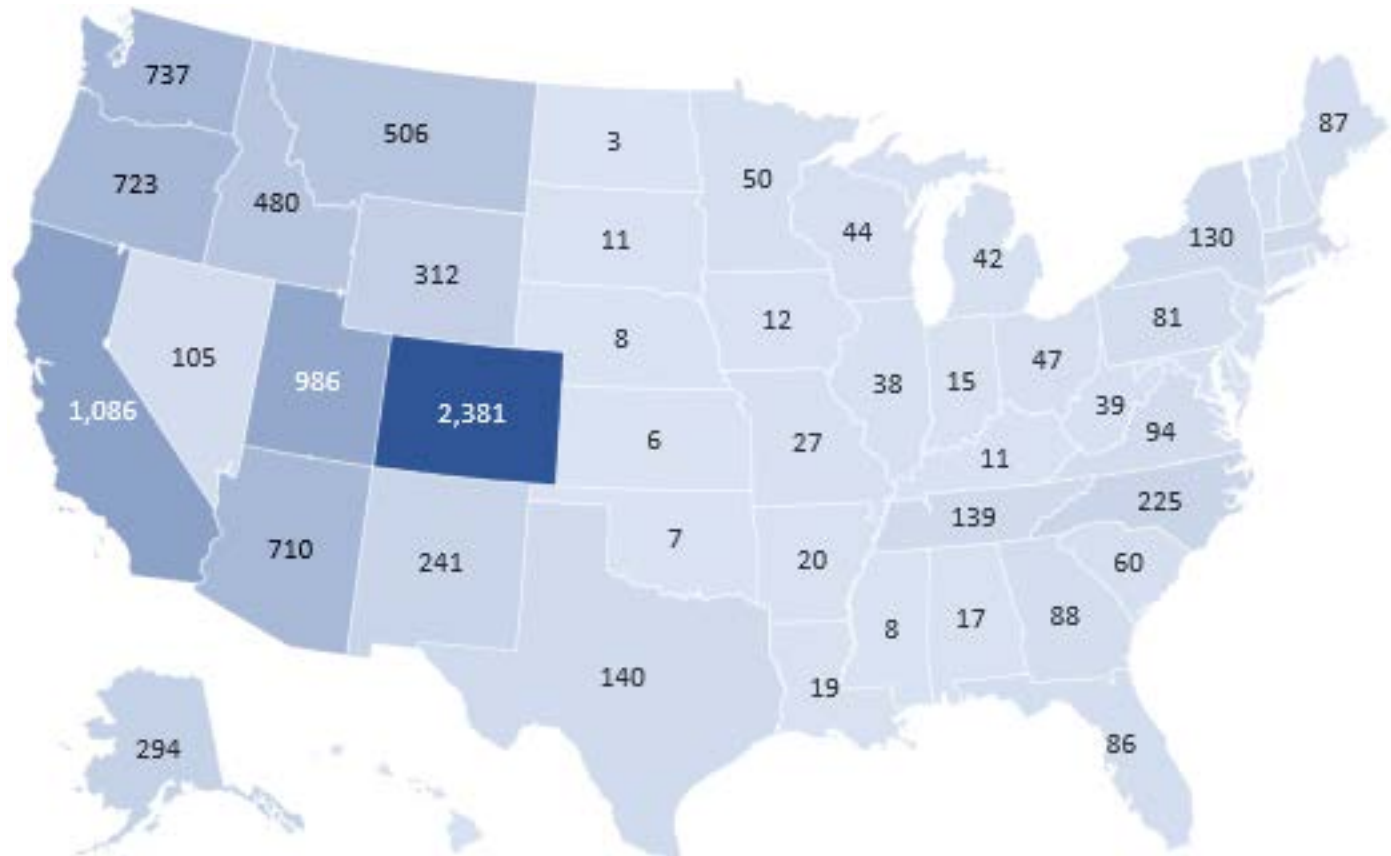
## Noncommercial Weighted Lottery Percent of Foreign Applicants

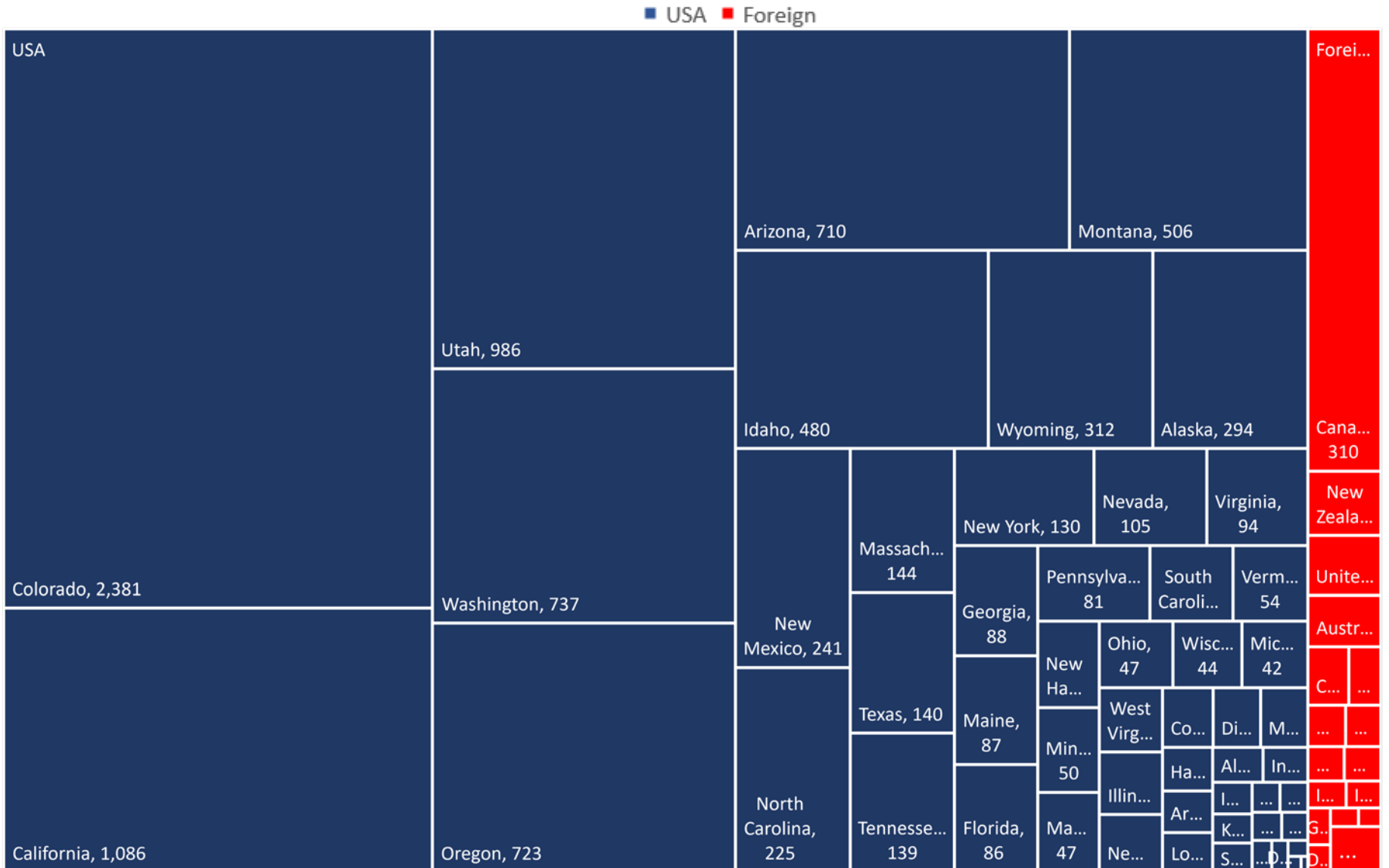

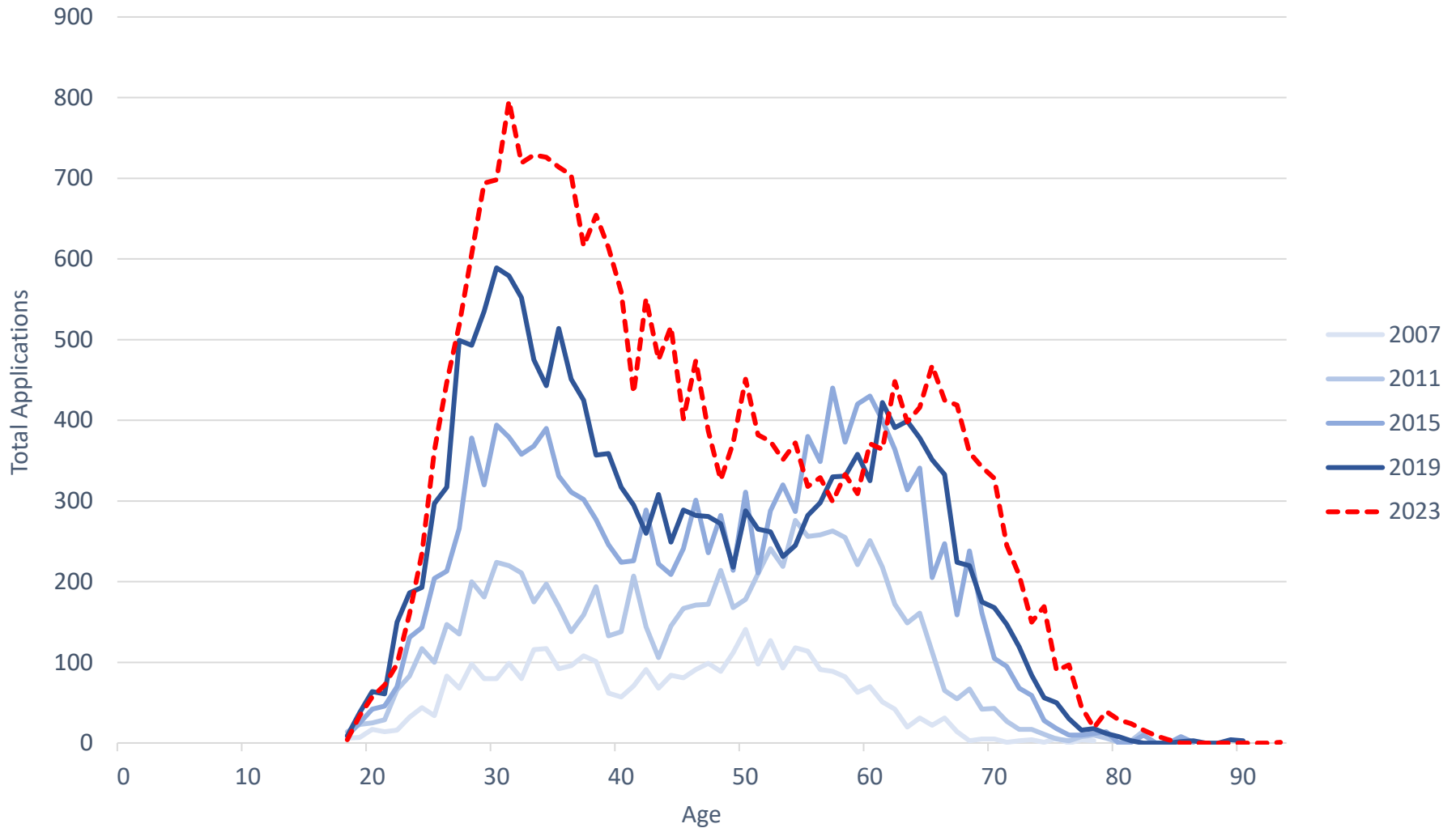

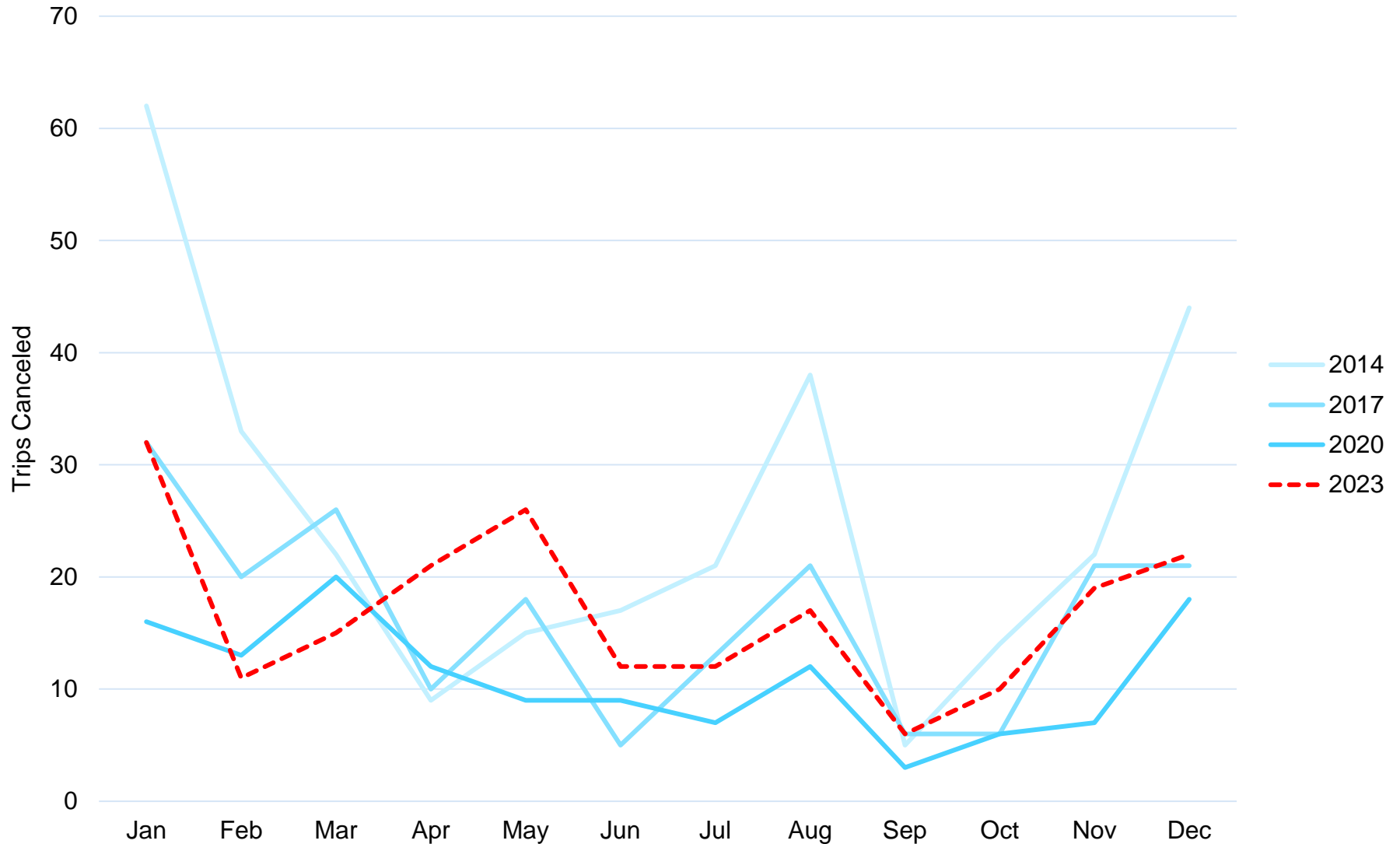
# River – Lees Ferry to Diamond Creek Noncommercial Lottery Applications in 2023: Treemap

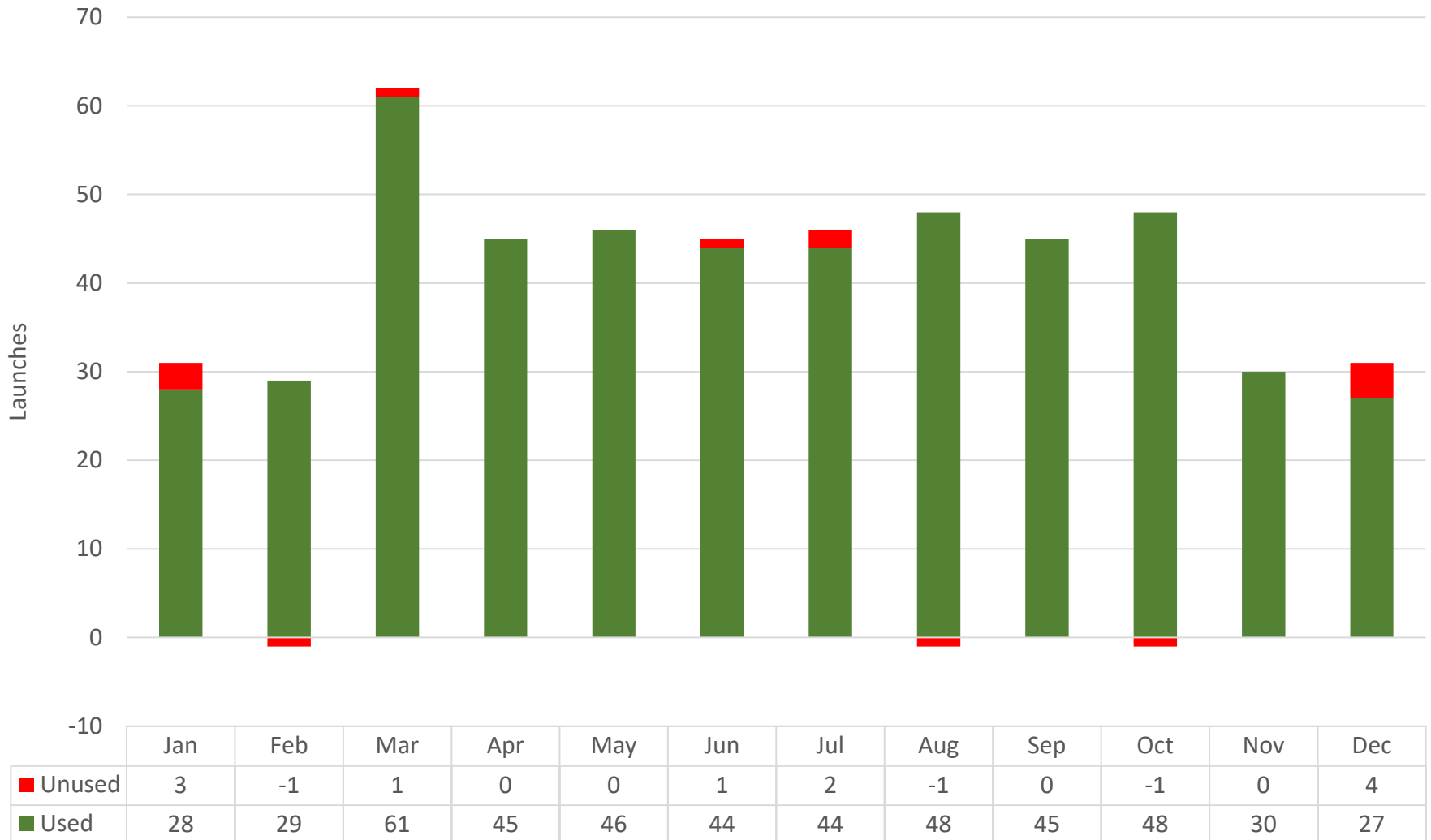

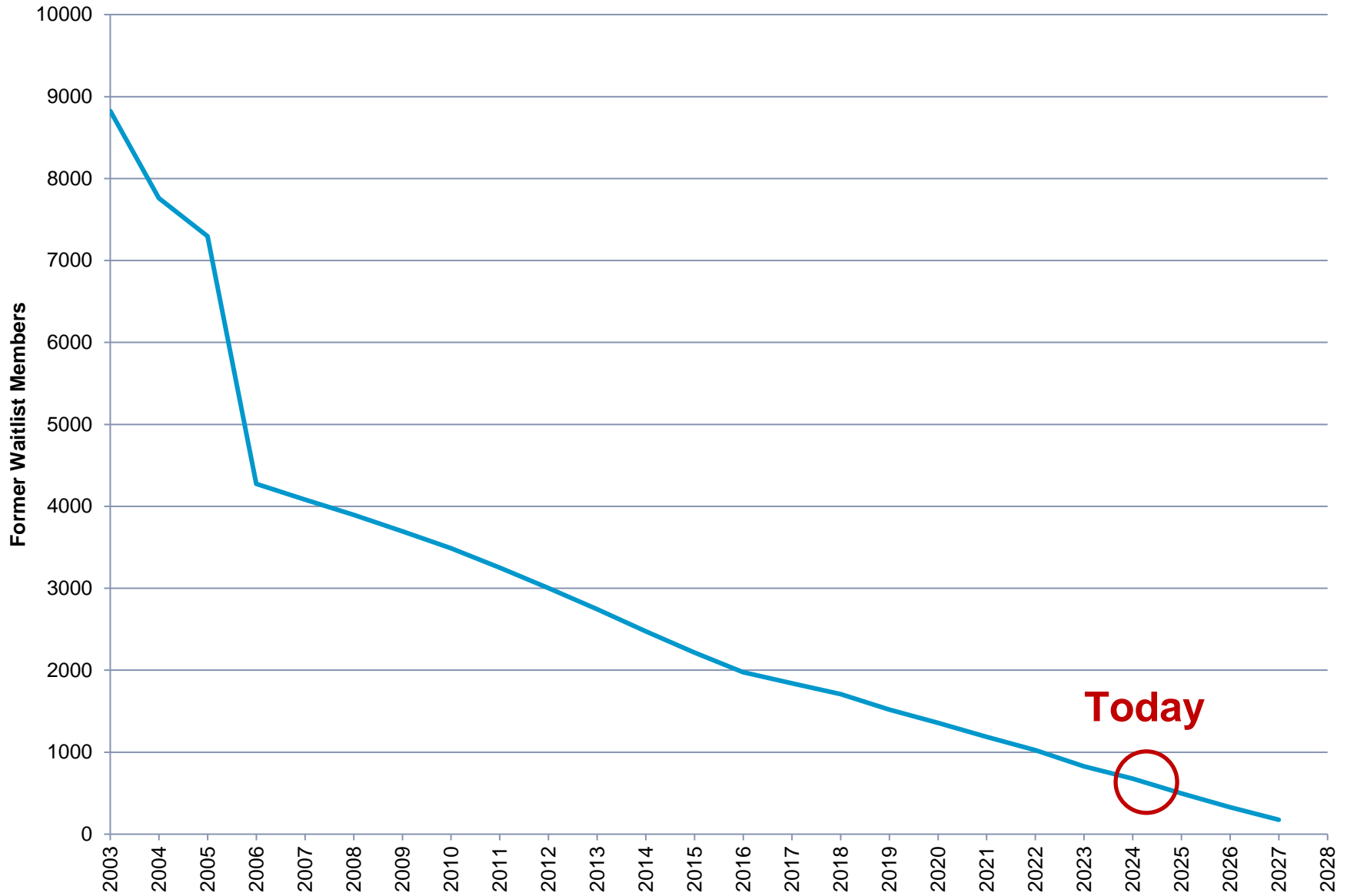
