American Battlefield Land Grants Program

The American Battlefield Land Grants Program is a federal matching grants program that encourages private-sector investment in battlefield preservation. The program, administered by the American Battlefield Protection Program (an arm of the National Park Service) and funded through the Land and Water Conservation Fund, has helped protect more than 28,500 acres of hallowed ground at Revolutionary War, War of 1812, and Civil War battlefields.

Battlefields Receiving Grant Awards

At the ceremony today, Secretary Zinke announced \$7.2 million in American Battlefield Land Grants to protect 1,196 acres at 19 battlefields. The battlefields benefiting from the grants are: Prairie Grove, Ark.; South Mountain and Williamsport, Md.; Brices Cross Roads, Miss.; Fort Ann and Sackets Harbor, N.Y.; Brandywine, Pa.; Eutaw Springs, S.C.; Fort Donelson, Tenn.; Appomattox Courthouse, Fredericksburg, Gaines Mill, Kelly's Ford, Malvern Hill, New Market, Second Manassas, Third Winchester, and Trevilian Station, Va.; and Shepherdstown, W.Va.

President Trump's Donation for Battlefield Maintenance

Secretary Zinke also revealed that President Trump's donation for battlefield park maintenance, first announced this past April, will go toward preservation of the historic Newcomer House at Antietam, along with replacement of 5,000 linear feet of deteriorated rail fencing along the Hagerstown Turnpike where some of the most intense fighting of the battle occurred. The Civil War Trust, National Park Foundation and Save Historic Antietam Foundation presented a check of \$185,212 to match the President's gift.

About the Battle of Antietam

The Battle of Antietam, fought September 17, 1862, is one of the most significant battles in American history. Although the battle itself was a tactical stalemate, the Confederate Army under Gen. Robert E. Lee was forced to retreat south of the Potomac, ending Lee's first invasion of the North. Lee's retreat provided the Union cause with a strategic victory, enabling President Abraham Lincoln to release the Emancipation Proclamation, granting freedom to slaves in regions under Confederate control. The battle also marked the bloodiest day in American history, resulting in nearly 23,000 casualties.

About the Civil War Trust

One last thing on ANTI. Am I correctly reading your letter that the donations are coming to NPS from the three organizations and not through NPF?

As for Bechtel, there are several efforts. Chrystal might have been talking about another one, or maybe our wires are crossed, which wouldn't be the first time.

I'm working with Lise and the consultant team Redstone on this strategic capacity-building initiative for Friends Groups. This is something that Director Jarvis was very interested in. He and Will believe there are a number of groups -- like Friends of INDE -- who could accomplish much more if we made a targeted, multi-year investment in them. Bechtel agrees. These groups wouldn't be identified through a call, but through an analysis by Redstone of where the greatest potential is and through discussions with NPS staff. It would be opportunistic. Mike said they should talk to a couple RDs. I've been able to expand that to include each RD, or in cases where the RD wasn't available or was new, the partnership coordinator. They're set to talk to Bob. I invited the RDs to include staff on the call if they would like. I think I cc'd you on my note to him, but let me know if I didn't.

MBT is at an intersection of a lot of things they're looking at and would be very appealing. The park's proximity to DC, access to Civil War donors, the up and down history of the group, and it has some name recognition. Confidentially, ^{(b) (5)}

I've also pushed and they look not only at individual groups, but also at the system of philanthropic partners and ways we could help groups of parks. Perhaps it's direct assistance to a group of parks or developing models for successful geographic or theme-based alignments, resource sharing models, parent relationships where a larger organization provides some functions to smaller groups, etc... While direct assistance to some groups will help, I think we also have to address the environment in which some of these groups -- especially smaller ones -- are operating and tackle some of their underlying challenges. I don't have their commitment yet, but have piqued their interest

Jeff - So you are aware, I just did a SF182 with PLA for a series of nonprofit training sessions for NCR partners (and parks) with PLA. See attached. It is basically their nonproit Boot Camp with several extra features.

Last month when Reggie and I met with Chrystal and NPF, I asked about what support they may be able to provide NCR partners like MBT and others. I let them know about the PLA training proposal and they said NCR should go ahead with PLA. So I did.

She described the Bechtel funding being used differently. But if you think some of it can be similar to the technical consultative support that Siobhan had been providing to individual friends groups - then great. MBT is one of several in NCR that would benefit from the individualized support. I recommend there be some sort of application process with clear selection criteria.

Only thing I need to know from you is would you be open to me pushing MANA as a park to receive capacity-building support from NPF. This will be multi-year funding from the Bechtel grant. I didn't want to propose it to Brandon and start pushing with NPF if NCR had objections.

Trump and will be used to complete several critical deferred maintenance projects in the park, as part of the National Park Service's mission to protect and preserve this nationally significant historic battlefield. The president may have a present for the Chickamauga battlefield: about \$78,000 out of his own pocket for preservation work at the nation's oldest battlefield park.

President Donald Trump said he would donate his \$400,000-a-year presidential salary back to the Treasury. In April, he gave the \$78,000 from his first three months' pay to the National Park Service.

At the time, Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke said the money would be spent in U.S. military parks.

"We're going to dedicate it and put [it] against the infrastructure on our nation's battlefields," Zinke said in a press briefing. "We're about \$100 million or \$229 million behind in deferred maintenance on our battlefields alone."

Last week, USA Today reported the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park is at the top of a list of three. The popular park had more than 1 million visitors last year and could start work on two projects right away: repairing erosion on Point Park Trail and restoring the <u>1938-</u> <u>era Ochs Museum</u>.

The other battlefield parks are at Vicksburg, Miss., and Kings Mountain, S.C.

Tom Crosson, spokesman for the National Parks Service, said the president specified the donation go to a battlefield preservation project, but the parks service came up with the list of finalists.

"We have a variety of parks that have a variety of projects that need to get done," Crosson said by phone Wednesday. "They're projects that could be accomplished with that money."

USA Today also reported Trump would be able to deduct the donation on his federal income taxes.

The battles for Chickamauga raged between September and November 1864

as Union and Confederate armies clashed over control of Chattanooga, a rail center considered the <u>gateway to the heart of the Confederacy</u>, according to the park website. Eventually the Union troops prevailed and the Confederates retreated south into Georgia.

Tricia Mims, with the Friends of the Chickamauga-Chattanooga National Military Park, pointed out in an email that the view from Point Park is among the most iconic images of Chattanooga and is featured on the city and county seals.

She said the Friends group raises thousands of dollars each year restoration projects and that "We appreciate and welcome all support from the public toward that end."

"We hope the recent publicity surrounding the considerable deferred maintenance needs for the entire national park system will inspire Chattanoogans to join the Friends in giving back locally to support our park that means so much to our community," Mims said.

Vicksburg National Military Park in Mississippi is also a landmark Civil War site.

"Vicksburg is the nail head that holds the South's two halves together. <u>Vicksburg is the key</u>," the park service website says. If the Union controlled Mississippi River at Vicksburg, it could stop the flow of supplies to the Confederates and split the South.

Kings Mountain, in Blacksburg, S.C., dates back to the Revolutionary War. The Oct. 7, 1780, battle of Kings Mountain was the fledgling nation's first major victory after the British invaded Charleston in May of that year. Founding father and second president Thomas Jefferson called it "<u>the turn of</u> <u>the tide of success</u>," the park service website says.

Heather Swift, spokeswoman for the Department of the Interior, said Wednesday via email that no decision has been made on the choice of projects.

Crosson added, "We're just waiting on the final decision. Once we get that we could work with the region and the parks to get the project going."

Thanks for more background. I had not heard that Nau joined the MBT board. I agree that the needs and connections related to MBT make them a smart choice for NPF support. I just want to be as transparent and strategic as possible because there are many many needs out there. The broad training from PLA should help with some universal issues the little or midsize groups are facing.

I like your idea of bundling similar or themed organizations for potential NPF support. For example a brand new friends group just started last year at Monocacy and Antietam needs one. Save Historic Antietam Foundation is primarily an advocacy group not a philanthropic partner. Possibly Redstone/NPF could help the regions battlefield park partners because presumably they would be working on similar park resources/projects and soliciting very similar or overlapping donors, etc.

Last month when Reggie and I met with Chrystal and NPF, I asked about what support they may be able to provide NCR partners like MBT and others. I let them know about the PLA training proposal and they said NCR should go ahead with PLA. So I did.

She described the Bechtel funding being used differently. But if you think some of it can be similar to the technical consultative support that Siobhan had been providing to individual friends groups - then great. MBT is one of several in NCR that would benefit from the individualized support. I recommend there be some sort of application process with clear selection criteria.

The president may have a present for the Chickamauga battlefield: about \$78,000 out of his own pocket for preservation work at the nation's oldest battlefield park.

President Donald Trump said he would donate his \$400,000-a-year presidential salary back to the Treasury. In April, he gave the \$78,000 from his first three months' pay to the National Park Service.

At the time, Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke said the money would be spent in U.S. military parks.

"We're going to dedicate it and put [it] against the infrastructure on our nation's battlefields," Zinke said in a press briefing. "We're about \$100 million or \$229 million behind in deferred maintenance on our battlefields alone."

Last week, USA Today reported the Chickamauga and Chattanooga National Military Park is at the top of a list of three. The popular park had more than 1 million visitors last year and could start work on two projects right away: repairing erosion on Point Park Trail and restoring the <u>1938-</u> <u>era Ochs Museum</u>.

The other battlefield parks are at Vicksburg, Miss., and Kings Mountain, S.C.

Tom Crosson, spokesman for the National Parks Service, said the president specified the donation go to a battlefield preservation project, but the parks service came up with the list of finalists.

"We have a variety of parks that have a variety of projects that need to get done," Crosson said by phone Wednesday. "They're projects that could be accomplished with that money."

USA Today also reported Trump would be able to deduct the donation on

his federal income taxes.

The battles for Chickamauga raged between September and November 1864 as Union and Confederate armies clashed over control of Chattanooga, a rail center considered the gateway to the heart of the <u>Confederacy</u>, according to the park website. Eventually the Union troops prevailed and the Confederates retreated south into Georgia.

Tricia Mims, with the Friends of the Chickamauga-Chattanooga National Military Park, pointed out in an email that the view from Point Park is among the most iconic images of Chattanooga and is featured on the city and county seals.

She said the Friends group raises thousands of dollars each year restoration projects and that "We appreciate and welcome all support from the public toward that end."

"We hope the recent publicity surrounding the considerable deferred maintenance needs for the entire national park system will inspire Chattanoogans to join the Friends in giving back locally to support our park that means so much to our community," Mims said.


Vicksburg National Military Park in Mississippi is also a landmark Civil War site.

"Vicksburg is the nail head that holds the South's two halves together. <u>Vicksburg is the key</u>," the park service website says. If the Union controlled Mississippi River at Vicksburg, it could stop the flow of supplies to the Confederates and split the South.

Kings Mountain, in Blacksburg, S.C., dates back to the Revolutionary War. The Oct. 7, 1780, battle of Kings Mountain was the fledgling nation's first major victory after the British invaded Charleston in May of that year. Founding father and second president Thomas Jefferson called it "the turn of the tide of success," the park service website says.

Heather Swift, spokeswoman for the Department of the Interior, said Wednesday via email that no decision has been made on the choice of projects.

Crosson added, "We're just waiting on the final decision. Once we get that

Thank you for the generous support and donations provided by your organizations to Antietam National Battlefield. These donations will match and enhance an existing donation of \$78,333 from President Donald J. Trump and will be used to complete critical deferred maintenance projects in the park, as part of the National Park Service's mission to protect and preserve this nationally significant historic battlefield. The President's gracious gift this spring of his federal salary to the NPS will be combined with the following contributions: \$xxxx from the Civil War Trust, \$xxxx from the National Park Foundation, and \$5,000 from the Save Historic Antietam Foundation.

The combined donations enabled the NPS to complete the following projects at one of our nation's most hallowed grounds:

• Preserve Historic Newcomer House (\$141,400.48): This project involves exterior maintenance work on the Newcomer House, consisting of repairs to woodwork and porches, new gutters and downspout, and painting all surfaces. The house presently

serves as the visitor center for the Maryland Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area, through an agreement with the National Park Service.

• Replace Dunker Church Road Historical Rail Fencing (\$122,812.65): This project involves the replacement of approximately 5,000 lf of deteriorated rail fencing along the historic Hagerstown Turnpike (now Dunker Church Road). This roadway witnessed some of the heaviest fighting during the Battle of Antietam and borders property owned by the Civil War Trust.

- A lead article on the website of Antietam National Battlefield highlighting the partners' donations and the benefitting projects.
- Recognition within temporary construction signage on the project sites to remain in place during the length of the work and a short period following completion of construction at the Superintendent's discretion. The temporary construction signs will provide an overview of the project, the historic significance of the resource and recognition of the donations. Thank you for the generous support and donations provided by your organizations to Antietam National Battlefield. These donations will match and enhance an existing donation of \$78,333 from President Donald J. Trump and will be used to complete critical deferred maintenance projects in the park, as part of the National Park Service's (<u>NPS's)(NPS)</u> mission to protect and preserve this nationally significant historic battlefield. 

Thank you for the generous support and donations provided by your organizations to Antietam National Battlefield. These donations will match and enhance an existing donation of \$78,333 from President Donald J. Trump and will be used to complete critical deferred maintenance projects in the park, as part of the National Park Service's (<u>NPS's)(NPS)</u> mission to protect and preserve this nationally significant historic battlefield. The President's gracious gift this spring of his federal salary to the NPS will be combined with the following contributions: \$xxxx <u>88,940.07</u> from the Civil War Trust, \$xxxx <u>88,940.07</u> from the National Park Foundation, and \$<u>85</u>,000 from the Save Historic Antietam Foundation.

The combined donations <u>will enable</u>-enabled the NPS to complete the following projects at one of our nation's most hallowed grounds:

• -Preserve Historic Newcomer House (\$141,400.48): This project involves exterior maintenance work on the Newcomer House, consisting of repairs to woodwork and porches, new gutters and downspout, and painting all surfaces. The house presently

serves as the visitor center for the Maryland Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area, through an agreement with the <u>NPSNational Park Service</u>.

• Replace Dunker Church Road Historical Rail Fencing (\$122,812.65): This project involves the replacement of approximately 5,000 lf of deteriorated rail fencing along the historic Hagerstown Turnpike (now Dunker Church Road). This roadway witnessed some of the heaviest fighting during the Battle of Antietam and borders property owned by the Civil War Trust.

These two projects will reduce Antietam National Battlefield's maintenance backlog and preserve signature historic features of the Battlefield. The donations will be placed in a parkbased federal donation account in order to execute the projects identified above at the park level and in the most efficient manner possible. Since unforeseen circumstances may require adjustments in the proposed projects, the NPS reserves the ability to modify the projects as it deems appropriate or necessary to meet the goals of our deferred maintenance and historic preservation programs. Antietam National Battlefield will consult with all partners should proposed project modifications differ significantly from the projects listed above.

Antietam National Battlefield will provide recognition to President Donald J. Trump, the Civil War Trust, the National Park Foundation, and Save Historic Antietam Foundation in the following manner:

- Joint press release announcing contributions by the partners in support of the projects identified above.
- Joint in-park media event announcing contributions by the partners in support of the projects identified above. The presidents from the Civil War Trust and the National Park Foundation will be guest speakers at the event and joined by Secretary of the Interior, Ryan Zinke representing President Trump.
- <u>The three nonprofit organizations will present a ceremonial check in the amount of</u> <u>the donation to the Secretary of the Interior and Antietam National Battlefield at the</u> <u>event.</u>
- A lead article on the website of Antietam National Battlefield highlighting the partners' donations and the benefitting projects.
- Recognition within temporary construction signage on the project sites to remain in place during the length of the work and a short period following completion of construction at the Superintendent's discretion. The temporary construction signs will provide an overview of the project, the historic significance of the resource and recognition of the donations. This recognition will read as follows, "This project was made possible through the generous contributions of" The donor name or their name script/logo will be included after the credit line toward the bottom of the temporary sign.

The \$7.2 million will preserve nearly 1,200 acres at Civil War battlefields as part of the Battlefield Land Acquisition grants. The grant projects are located at 23 battlefields threatened with damage or destruction by urban and suburban development in Arkansas, Maryland, Mississippi, New York, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Deferred Maintenance at Antietam National Battlefield

The Deferred Maintenance total calculated for Antietam National Battlefield at the end of FY2016 is \$10,927,792, or almost \$11 million. Deferred maintenance is defined by the NPS as "The cost of maintenance and repairs that were not performed when they should have been or were scheduled to be and which are put off or delayed for a future period."

The two projects funded by the donations made today are part of the deferred maintenance backlog for the battlefield. These projects are:

Preserve Historic Newcomer House

Project description – This project involves exterior maintenance work on the Newcomer House, consisting of repairs to deteriorated woodwork and porches, new gutters and downspout, and painting all surfaces.

The Newcomer House, part of a thriving milling community located near the Middle Bridge area of the battlefield, was standing at the time of the Battle of Antietam and presently serves as the visitor center for the Maryland Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area through an agreement with the NPS.

The National Park Service acquired the Newcomer House and surrounding property in 2005. Since that time, the park has painted the metal roof and completed some spot painting of the siding, but had not been able to complete the comprehensive preservation maintenance project needed to bring the exterior to good condition.

Replace Dunker Church Road Historical Rail Fencing

Project description -- This project involves the replacement of approximately 5,000 lf of deteriorated rail fencing along both sides of the historic Hagerstown Turnpike (now Dunker Church Road).

This roadway witnessed some of the heaviest and most decisive fighting during the Battle of Antietam and encompasses the Dunker Church, West Woods, and Miller Cornfield. This is a heavily visited location and adjoins property owned by the Civil War Trust.

Rail fencing has a maximum life cycle of around fifteen years before it should be replaced. The fencing along the west side of Dunker Church Road was erected about 12 years ago; the fencing on the east side was last replaced about 20 years ago. The posts on both sides of the road are rotting and splitting. While the park has replaced individual rails as staffing and funds have allowed, many of the rails, particularly along the east side of the road, are in poor condition.

President Trump's Salary and Matching Funds to Restore Antietam National Battlefield

Secretary Zinke Announces \$7.2 Million in Grants to Protect American Battlefields Nationwide

WASHINGTON – While visiting Antietam National Battlefield in Western Maryland, U.S. Secretary of the Interior Ryan Zinke today announced that President Donald J. Trump's <u>first quarter salary donation</u> would be donated toward the restoration of two projects at the fabled Antietam National Battlefield. Secretary Zinke also announced \$7.2 million in additional grants to help identify, preserve, and protect America's historic battlefields. The Secretary was joined by representatives from Antietam, the Civil War Trust, the National Park Foundation, and the Save Historic Antietam Foundation.

After it was announced that President Trump would donate his Q1 salary to the National Park Service, an anonymous donor pledged \$22,000 to bring the President's \$78,333 donation to an even \$100,000. The Civil War Trust and the National Park Foundation, and Save Historic Antietam Foundation have also pledged funds bringing the total gift to \$263,545. The donation will restore the historic Newcomer House on the Antietam battlefield, and will underwrite the replacement of 5,000 linear feet of deteriorated rail fencing along the Hagerstown Turnpike where some of the most intense fighting of the battle occurred.

"As both the Secretary of the Interior and a military veteran, I'm deeply honored and humbled to deliver the donation to Antietam National Battlefield on behalf of President Trump," **said Secretary Zinke.** "Visiting the hallowed ground the day after Independence Day is incredibly moving and it underscores the importance of why we must preserve these historic grounds. The president's donation will allow generations of Americans to learn about our history and heritage on this sacred site."

"It is an honor to be standing here today with Secretary Zinke for these exciting announcements," **remarked Civil War Trust President James Lighthizer.** "We are proud of our long-standing partnership with the Department of the Interior to protect America's endangered battlefield parks, and look forward to working with President Trump and Secretary Zinke to preserve these irreplaceable national treasures." John L. Nau III, chairman *emeritus* of the Civil War Trust and a director of the National Park Foundation, noted the benefits of battlefield preservation: "We have in Secretary Zinke a leader who 'gets it.' He understands the many benefits of protecting battlefields, which serve as outdoor classrooms for teaching history, as places of remembrance to honor America's fallen, as heritage tourism destinations that bolster local economies, and as training grounds for the modern U.S. military."

The \$7.2 million will preserve nearly 1,200 acres of battlefield land as part of the American Battlefield Land Acquisition Grants program. The grant projects are located at 19 battlefields threatened with damage or destruction by urban and suburban development in Arkansas, Maryland, Mississippi, New York, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia.

"These lands were once the scenes of our nation's bloodiest conflicts," **Zinke said.** "Working with the state and local communities, historians, and advocates, we must preserve these battlefields for future generations of Americans to remember and understand the impact of sacrifices of those who fought on these hallowed grounds. This grant program, along with President Trump's donation will help ensure just that."

The grants are funded from the Land and Water Conservation Fund, which uses revenue from federal oil and gas leases on the Outer Continental Shelf to purchase land, water, and wetlands for the benefit of all Americans. Since its establishment in 1964, the Land and Water Conservation Fund has conserved land in every state and supported tens of thousands of state and local projects. The fund does not use taxpayer dollars; the primary source of income derives from fees paid by oil and gas companies drilling offshore in waters owned by the American people.

The grants are administered by the National Park Service's American Battlefield Protection Program (ABPP), one of more than a dozen programs administered by the NPS that provide states and local communities technical assistance, recognition, and funding to help preserve their own history and create close-to-home recreation opportunities. Consideration for the American Battlefield Land Acquisition Grants is given to battlefields listed in the National Park Service's Civil War Sites Advisory Commission's 1993 Report on the Nation's Civil War Battlefields and ABPP's 2007 Report to Congress on the Historic Preservation of Revolutionary War and War of 1812 Sites in the United States.

Grants are awarded to units of state and local governments for the fee-simple acquisition of land, or for the non-federal acquisition of permanent, protective interests in land (easements). Private non-profit groups may apply in partnership with state or local government sponsors. Those non-profit partners are listed along with the government sponsors below.

Trump Donates \$78,000 To Antietam Battlefield, But Interior Department Still Set To Lose \$1.5 Billion*

He'd make up the budget shortfall with such salary donations in about ... 3,750 years.

Secretary of the Interior <u>Ryan Zinke</u> announced a score of grants and donations on Wednesday to help protect America's battlefields, including the recipient of President <u>Donald Trump</u>'s first-quarter salary.

Maryland's <u>Antietam National Battlefield</u>, the site of the bloodiest one-day battle in U.S. history, will receive a \$78,333 donation from the president to help fund two restoration projects, and additional donations to the battlefield from the National Park Foundation and several historic trusts will bring the full amount to more than \$263,000.

However, the announcement comes as Trump plans to slash some \$1.5 billion from the Interior Department under his proposed federal budget — including some <u>\$296 million</u> from the National Park Service, which oversees protected battlefields like Antietam. If all \$400,000 of the president's annual salary were set aside for Interior, it'd take about 3,750 years of checks to make up for that shortfall.

"As both the Secretary of the Interior and a military veteran, I'm deeply honored and humbled to deliver the donation to Antietam National Battlefield on behalf of President Trump," Zinke said in a statement announcing the donation. "Visiting the hallowed ground the day after Independence Day is incredibly moving and it underscores the importance of why we must preserve these historic grounds. The President's donation will allow generations of Americans to learn about our history and heritage on this sacred site."

Zinke also announced grants totaling \$7.2 million "to help identify, preserve and protect America's battlefields" in nine different states. They will be administered through NPS's American Battlefield Protection Program.

Trump's donation follows through on campaign pledges that he <u>would work for free</u> during his presidency (he said during a meeting in 2015 the promise was "no big deal for me"). But the National Park Service will likely be forced to dramatically scale back its ability to serve the public under the White House's proposed budget.

If passed, the budget would <u>cut 13 percent of funding</u> from the NPS, which would result in 1,200 full-time employees losing their jobs. Outside magazine <u>notes</u> almost all funding for land acquisition would be cut, and the \$12 billion backlog needed for park maintenance likely would be pushed off even further.

"If enacted, this budget would represent the largest cut to the National Park Service since World War II," Theresa Pierno, president of the National Parks Conservation Association <u>said</u> <u>in May</u>. "Agencies like the National Park Service and EPA are already operating on shoestring budgets, and this budget, if enacted, will only make a bad situation worse."

In April, Zinke himself noted many of America's battlefields were among the areas protected by the NPS that had a backlog in maintenance.

"We're about \$229 million behind in deferred maintenance on our battlefields alone," the secretary <u>said</u>.

Conservation groups slammed the president's initial salary donation announcement as a "publicity stunt."

"If Donald Trump is actually interested in helping our parks, he should stop trying to slash their budgets to historically low levels," the Sierra Club said in April. "This publicity stunt is a sad consolation prize as Trump tries to stifle America's best idea."

CORRECTION: An earlier version of this article and headline said Trump's proposed budget would cut \$1.5 billion from the National Park Service. It would slash that amount from the Interior Department overall and \$296 million from the National Park Service.

Deferred Maintenance at Antietam National Battlefield

The Deferred Maintenance total calculated for Antietam National Battlefield is \$10,927,792, or almost \$11 million. Deferred maintenance is defined by the NPS as "The cost of maintenance and repairs that were not performed when they should have been or were scheduled to be and which are put off or delayed for a future period."

The two projects funded by the donations made today are part of the deferred maintenance backlog for the battlefield. These projects are:

Preserve Historic Newcomer House

Project description – This project involves exterior maintenance work on the Newcomer House, consisting of repairs to woodwork and porches, new gutters and downspout, and painting all surfaces. The Newcomer House was standing at the time of the Battle of Antietam and presently serves as the visitor center for the Maryland Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area through and agreement with the NPS.

I want to provide an update and summary of the Secretary's proposed visit to Antietam on July 5, as I know that some of you have been brought in at various times and have bits and pieces of information. I am not aware that anything has been finalized yet, but this is what I have up to this point.

1. I was contacted on Friday, June 16 to submit a list of 3-5 high priority deferred maintenance projects in the \$70-120k range for potential funding through the president's recent salary donation. This was brought up in conjunction with a possible visit by Secretary Zinke to the park on July 5 to announce this year's ABPP grants. The department contacted the Civil War Trust to facilitate this announcement; a discussion was also initiated with the CWT about the possibility of the Trust matching the president's donation.

2. This past Friday the National Park Foundation was brought into the discussion about bringing in other potential matching donations; the NPF agreed to be a matching partner and reach out to other organizations. I received a phone call from Susan Newton on Friday afternoon to let me know that they would be doing this. She was familiar with the projects that had been submitted and we talked about various combinations. Yesterday morning she contacted Save Historic Antietam Foundation about a potential donation and they agreed to \$5,000.

Several scenarios have been proposed (see bottom of email), but a selection has not yet been made as of the sending of this email.

3. The CWT has been working with the Department on setting up a press event for Wednesday, July 5 to announce the ABPP grants and the Trump/CWT/NPF/SHAF donation to the park. At this time, it appears the Secretary will be arriving 9:30-9:45 and will be given a tour of the battlefield, with a press conference at 11:30. The CWT will be setting up tents and chairs on the north side of the visitor center (see attachment) and is planning on catering lunch. This has not been confirmed and I have not been made aware of any discussion about press outreach. I have a call with the CWT at 11:30 this morning and should have more information after that.

I would very much like to set up a call to talk through the event and the donation. I am sure that it will shine a spotlight on deferred maintenance at Antietam and our program for addressing it. I also am concerned that our PFMD DM data is not accurate and want to ensure that we have the best information to share with the press and the public. I'd like to discuss strategies for discussing this donation and our deferred maintenance program with all of you.

The Newcomer House is one of only two historic structures on the battlefield that is open to visitors, providing them an opportunity to explore stories of the battlefield related to civilians and surrounding communities. The Newcomer House currently serves as the visitor center for the Maryland Heart of the Civil War Heritage Area, operated through an agreement with the National Park Service.

Trump and will be used to complete critical deferred maintenance projects in the park, as part of the National Park Service's (<u>NPS's)(NPS)</u> mission to protect and preserve this nationally significant historic battlefield.
