On May 9, 2016, I contacted Shamash KASSAM at the Buffalo Ranch in Yellowstone National Park with a bison calf in the trunk of his vehicle. The bison calf was released back into a bison herd near where KASSAM had picked up the calf. KASSAM was issued a violation notice for disturbing and touching wildlife, for removing the bison calf from the roadway and putting it in his vehicle.

NARRATIVE:

I state that on May 9, 2016 while exercising my duties as a law Enforcement Officer in the District of Wyoming, in Yellowstone National Park, at approximately 8:10 pm, while on patrol, I received a report from Yellowstone Dispatch that a visitor was at the Buffalo Ranch and had picked up a bison calf from the roadway. I asked Yellowstone Dispatch to call someone from NPS Bison management for advice on how to handle the situation. Eventually a state was notified.

I arrived at the Buffalo Ranch and contacted two males in a maroon Toyota Sequoia (WY/2249006). The driver was identified by his arready Driver's license as a second male at I identified the second male as Shamash KASSAM by his arready Driver's License. Shamash KASSAM stated that they had been on the road near the river, a few miles east of the Buffalo Ranch, and a baby bison was in the middle of the road, wet and shivering. Shamash KASSAM stated that the bison calf would not leave their vehicle for 20 minutes, while they waited to see if any bison would come back for the bison calf. After 20 minutes they still could not see any bison anywhere in the vicinity, and the bison calf would not leave their vehicle, appearing to be seeking warmth from the engine. Shamash KASSAM stated that he decided to pick up the bison calf, or it would have been road kill. They then drove to the Buffalo Ranch and called law enforcement for assistance. Shamash KASSAM stated he was trying to help the bison calf.

I observed a bison calf lying in the trunk of KASSAM's Toyota Sequoia. I advised Shamash and that bison, including calves, are wild animals and in Yellowstone National Park, people are not allowed to intervene with wildlife, touch, disturb or feed them, and that by removing the calf, he was preventing the mother from locating it and possibly altering its' ability to survive in the wild. KASSAM stated that he understood what he did was wrong and he would never pick up or disturb any wildlife again, and instead would wait at the scene and call for law enforcement.

I advised KASSAM that we needed to drive back to the location where he had picked up the calf and attempt to release it. KASSAM described the location as a place where the road was close to the river, a few miles to the east of the Buffalo Ranch. KASSAM stated that there had been no bison anywhere in the area at the time they picked up the calf. The location KASSAM described, appeared to be the Confluence of the Lamar River and Soda Butte Creek on the Northeast Entrance Road.

Approximately 3 miles east of the Buffalo Ranch, I observed a bison herd walking west in the roadway, away from the Confluence, near Old Lamar Picnic Area. I decided this was likely the herd the bison had been separate from. The bison calf was released into the herd. It took two attempts to get the calf to leave the engine block of my patrol vehicle. I observed the bison calf run up to a cow bison with another calf in the roadway and saw the cow lick the newly released bison calf. The calf then walked with the herd towards the Lamar river. Before releasing the bison calf, it appeared to have pooped in the trunk of KASSAM's Toyota Sequoia.

I issued KASSAM a violation notice for Wildlife Protection, 36 CFR 2.2 (a)(2), for picking up and disturbing a bison calf.

After concluding the stop, I drove east towards the Northeast Entrance and observed only two groups of bison. The first was approximately 0.5 mile north of the roadway near Lamar Stock trailhead and appeared to consist of a group of 4-6 bull bison. The second group of bison was approximately 1 mile north of the roadway at Soda Butte Flats up on the hillside. I did not observe any bison near the Lamar River confluence, either on the north or south sides of the roadway. No other bison were located or observed near the roadway or within sight between Old Lamar Picnic area and the Northeast Entrance. I drove back by where the bison calf had been released near Old Lamar Picnic Area, and it appeared that the bison herd that the newly released calf was in the process of crossing the Lamar River.

On May 16, 2016 I called Shamash KASSAM and he agreed to change his collateral fine to a mandatory appearance court date set for June 2, 2016 at 9:00 am.

I state that on May 9, 2016 while exercising my duties as a law Enforcement Officer in the District of Wyoming, in Yellowstone National Park;

At approximately 8:10 pm, while on patrol, I received a report from Yellowstone Dispatch that a visitor was at the Buffalo Ranch and had picked up a bison calf from the roadway. I arrived at the Buffalo Ranch and contacted two males in a maroon Toyota Seguoia (WY/2249006). I identified one of the males as Shamash KASSAM by his Driver's License. KASSAM stated that they had been on the road near the river a couple of miles east of the Buffalo Ranch and a baby bison was in the middle of the road, wet and shivering, and would not leave their vehicle for 20 minutes, while they waited to see if any bison would come back for the bison calf. After 20 minutes they still could not see any bison anywhere in the vicinity, the Bison calf would not leave their vehicle, appearing to be seeking warmth from the engine, and KASSAM stated he decided to pick up the bison calf, or it would have been road kill, and drive to the Buffalo Ranch and call law enforcement for assistance. I observed a bison call lving in the trunk of KASSAM's Toyota Sequoia. I advised KASSAM that bison, including calves, are wild animals and in Yellowstone National Park, people are not allowed to intervene with wildlife, touch, disturb or feed them, and that by removing the calf, he was preventing the mother from locating it and possibly altering its' ability to survive in the wild. KASSAM stated that he understood what he did was wrong and he would never pick up or disturb any wildlife again, and instead would wait at the scene and call for law enforcement.

A bison herd was located near where KASSAM had picked up the calf, and the calf was released back into the herd. I observed a mother bison with another calf, lick the bison calf and then walk towards the Lamar River with the calf following closely. NPS Bison management was notified.

I issued KASSAM a violation notice for Wildlife Protection, 36 CFR 2.2 (a)(2), for picking up and disturbing a bison calf.

contacted the party, released the bison and observed the bison reuniting with a heard.

and I contacted Ranger and learned that he had been in contact with YCR and the bison management team which included agreed that the behavior of the bison indicated that it was imprinting on vehicles and visitors. They determined that this could lead to a potentially dangerous situation for the visitors and vehicles using the roadway.

and I arrived on scene and observed the bison leaning on the weak we cleared the pullout of all visitors and attempted to haze the bison away from the road by shouting, clapping and using our bodies to pressure the bison off the road. This was not effective. We then tried using the patrol vehicles lights and sirens. This too was ineffective. We lastly attempted to shout at the bison and also use the Taser in drive stun mode on the bison. This was also ineffective. We then decided that we needed to dispatch the bison. We closed the road with the assistance of Park Ranger

I then dispatched the bison with two rounds of 12 gauge slug.
