Subject: Response to Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Request NPS-2016-00988

This letter is our final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated September 12, 2016, in which you requested records relating to 1.) the death of Gary Falk and 2.) a search and rescue operation that took place between August 4 and August 6, 2016. On November 7, 2016, Grand Teton National Park issued a response for the portion of your request for records relating to Mr. Falk. We are providing a copy of that response for your convenience.

Upon further review, the remaining portion of your request for records relating to the August 4-6 search and rescue is granted in part and denied in part. We are providing five files, totaling approximately 27 pages of responsive material. Portions of approximately 6 pages, however, are being withheld under Exemptions 3, 6, 7(C), 7(E), and 7(F) of the FOIA.

In accordance with 18 U.S.C. §5038(c) information relating to juveniles shall not be disclosed directly or indirectly to anyone other than the judge, counsel for the juvenile and the Government, or others entitled under this section to receive juvenile records. We are therefore withholding the redacted information under Exemption 3. Exemption 6 allows us to withhold information that if released would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. Exemption 7(C) allows us to withhold information from law enforcement files that could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

The information being withheld consists of personally identifiable information (PII) including name and pictures for an individual other than yourself. We have determined that the individuals to whom this information pertains have a substantial privacy interest in withholding it. You have not provided information that explains a relevant public interest under the FOIA in the disclosure of this personal information. Additionally, we have determined that the disclosure of this information would shed little or no light on the performance of the agency's statutory duties. Because the harm to personal privacy is greater than whatever public interest might be served by disclosure, we have determined that the release

of the information that is being withheld would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the privacy of these individuals and we are therefore withholding it under Exemptions 6 and 7(C).

The records you have requested are maintained within the Incident Management and Reporting System (IMARS), which is a Privacy Act System of Records (DOI-10). Therefore, although some or all of the information being withheld may be known to you through other means, we are obligated under the Privacy Act and FOIA to withhold that information.

Additionally information relating to radio frequencies is being withheld under Exemptions 7(E) and 7(F) of the FOIA. Exemption 7(E) allows us to withhold information related to law enforcement techniques and procedures, when its release could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law. Exemption 7(E) allows us withhold law enforcement information that if released could endanger the life or physical safety of any individual

If the frequency information were to be released it could cause serious harm to the National Park Service's law enforcement operations. If released to the public, the information could result in denial of service attacks. Additionally, these frequencies are used to coordinate and management helicopter flights during incidents such as search and rescue missions and wildfires, so the release of the requested information could endanger the lives of the individuals involved in those missions.

Observe & discuss changing conditions and <u>COMMUNICATE ANY CONCERNS!!</u> If at any time your safety, that of another employee, or the public is in imminent danger you have the right and responsibility to shut down the operation. Do not use a cell phone when driving a vehicle.

MAINTAIN SITUATIONAL AWARENESS!!!

Wildlife

- Must maintain high degree of bear awareness
- Bear spray is mandatory, must be at the ready
- Be sure to make noise in dense vegetation
- Be aware of any dead smell, it could be a kill/carcass, use extreme caution notify team leader/ Division Supervisor

Water

- Must use caution around marshy areas where wildlife could be
- Be sure to make noise
- Stay away from cut banks
- Stay 100ft away from moving water No wadding or entering moving water

Weather: Summer conditions could change rapidly: hot temperatures with the possibility of afternoon lightning storms. Seek shelter if there is lightning go to a vehicle or building. Plan another hot sunny day.

- Wear sunscreen
- Drink plenty of water should have 3-4quarts

Communication: Insure that a complete communication model is followed. Get and give feedback during conversations. After giving or getting instruction insure the information is repeated back to insure there are no miscommunications. Ensure radio communications are functioning properly

- Confirm Communications plan
- Team members must have operational radios, check batteries
- Keep in constant contact with team, especially considering possible animal threats

Team Leader: Review GAR with team members prior to departure. Perform tailgate safety meetings and after action reviews.

SA: Maintain personal and team situational awareness at all times.

At 1008 Teton Interagency Dispatch Center (TIDC) received a call of a missing had some missing from Groundworks USA, a youth work-group that was doing trails work near Triangle X Ranch in Grand Teton National Park. At 1020 I took the report of the missing person from TIDC and assumed the role of IC for the incident. I unsuccessfully attempted to contact the missing person via phone. I had TIDC have the phone company ping the phone. This was also unsuccessful. At 1033 Ranger Matt Wilber went to talk with the reporting party, confirm the point last seen and begin the investigation for the search. The 1st operational period consisted of ground teams, dog teams, roving containment along roadway corridors and aerial reconnaissance utilizing 38HX. An endangered juvenile alert was issued through WHP, with a BOLO and ATL from TIDC. ICP was set up at Moose HQ in the Teton room. An investigative unit consisting of ISB agents, FBI agents, TCSO detectives and Grand Teton park rangers was formed. Missing person's fliers with a tip hotline were posted in Grand Teton National Park, Yellowstone NP, Teton and Fremont County. Approximately 90 personnel worked the search in the first operational period.

On August 5th:

115 personnel including ground searchers, dog teams, civil air patrol and helitack, investigation branch and command staff. Search areas were covered by ground teams, dog teams and from the air. At the end of this operational period it was apparent that search areas were going to be expanded onto National Forest land, because of this unified command was implemented with Dr. AJ Wheeler filling the IC position for Teton County. After command staff had left for the evening LES Chris Flesch fielded a call from (b) (3), (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)

(b) (3), (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) Flesch instructed the Civil Air Patrol to search that area on their morning FLIR flight.

On August 6th

At 0630a the Civil Air Patrol spotted a point of interest, at Deadman's Bar. Patrol units from Grand Teton National Park who were still in-service from the night before responded. The patrol units could not locate the subject; it is thought that the reading could have been the heat signature from a rock. At 0706 an off duty park worker reported (b) (3), (b) (6), (b) (7)(C)3 miles south of Snake River Overlook. Park Rangers and Teton County Deputies established containment at Moran junction and at Moose junction on Hwy 89. At 0742 Ranger Flesch contacted the subject off of Hwy89. (b) (3), (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) She was taken to St. Johns Medical Center for evaluation and then taken into protective custody by TCSO.
