

Condition Statement

Much of the landscape has been altered and fragmented, leaving some essential features. The planned widening of Interstate 81, if not designed by preservation advocates and transportation planners to avoid or minimize impacts, will destroy areas of the battlefield landscape. The Core Area at Stephenson's Depot remains the last substantial piece of intact land within the battlefield.



by the City of Newport News and the National Park Service. Approximately 5,000 acres of battlefield are on water. Additional preservation efforts should focus on intact, unprotected lands outside the two parks.
