Safety Tips

Be careful out there—protect yourself and the park! Most accidents at Acadia occur while visitors are biking, hiking, exploring the shoreline, and driving. Keep these tips in mind to help ensure a safe visit to the park.



Watch your step and wear sturdy shoes. Carry a map, first aid kit, flashlight, and water and appropriate weather gear on all trips, long or short. Tell someone where you're going and when you'll return.



Yield to pedestrians and horses. Watch for loose gravel on road curves and hills.



Stay away from cliff edges. Watch for wet rocks and loose gravel near cliff edges and shorelines.



Drive safely, wear seat belts, and don't drink and drive. The speed limit is 35 mph in Acadia, unless otherwise posted.



Please do not bring pets on ranger-led programs. When in Acadia, all pets must be on a leash no longer than six feet for the protection of your pet, people, and wildlife.

When attending Ranger-led Programs—remember to:

- Contact park staff about accessible facilities, services, and programs.
- Allow ample time to arrive at ranger-led programs safely.
- Escort children on walks and hikes. Parents are responsible for the safety and behavior of their children.
- Not bring pets on ranger-led programs.

Tidepool Tips

The zone where ocean meets land—the intertidal zone—is one of the most fascinating areas in Acadia. Here you can see creatures with amazing survival skills that allow them to stay alive when, twice each day, the tide leaves them exposed. Marine organisms are not indestructible. Our careless handling and footsteps can do damage that the changing tides cannot. When tide-pooling, remember to:

- Keep three points of contact with the ground, watch for waves and where you walk—it's slippery by the sea.
- Animals are fragile—leave them be.
- Give the animals a moment. They love to hide.
- Explore the world around you and use your senses as a guide.

Program Descriptions

May 20 - June 2, 2012

Walks, Talks, and Hikes

Acadia's Birds

(3 hours; easy walk and drive)

Join a birding caravan to find, identify, and discuss some of Acadia's most fascinating migrants and residents. Bring binoculars. Ask about accessibility. Sieur de Monts Nature Center – Intersection of Route 3 and Park Loop Road south of Bar Harbor.

Cadillac Summit Walk

(1 hour; easy 1/2-mile walk)

Enjoy views from atop the highest point on the eastern seaboard and gain a new perspective on Acadia's beauty. Cadillac Summit parking area – Top of Cadillac Mountain.

Carriage Road Walk

(2 hours; easy 1 1/2-mile walk)

Follow tree-lined carriage roads to beautiful stone bridges as you experience the legacy of John D. Rockefeller Jr. Parkman Mountain parking area - Route 3/198 north of Northeast Harbor.

Headland Hike

(3 hours; moderate, rocky 2-mile hike)

Learn how to read the geologic and cultural story of Acadia's past, written within the park's dramatic landscape. Sand Beach parking area – Park Loop Road south of Entrance Station.

Mighty Migration

(1 1/2 hours; easy walk)

Witness the incredible persistence of spawning alewives as they return from the sea to the streams of their birth. This race against time and other obstacles is key to the survival of these fascinating fish. Somesville Historical Museum & Gardens parking area – Route 102, near the picturesque white footbridge.

Ocean Path Walk

(2 hours; easy to moderate 2-mile walk)

Discover stories of history and nature along the strikingly scenic Otter Cliff section of the Ocean Path. Gorham Mountain parking area - Park Loop Road south of Thunder Hole.

Peregrine Watch

(drop-in anytime, 9-noon; talk)

Weather permitting, help collect valuable data while observing a peregrine falcon nest on the cliffs of Champlain Mountain through viewing scopes. Precipice Trail parking area – Park Loop Road north of Entrance Station.

Secrets of the Summit

(30 minutes; easy walk)

Investigate the historic past of the park's highest peak. Cadillac South Ridge trailhead – Near Cadillac Mountain Summit Center.

Tidepool School

(2 hours; walk)

You're never too old to explore the shore! Practice tidepool etiquette and shoreline safety while investigating a part of the park only revealed at low tide. For adults and youth 5 and older. Fee: \$10 adults, \$5 ages 5–12. Make reservations no more than three days before the program date in person at Hulls Cove Visitor Center or call (207) 288-8832.

Junior Ranger Program

Activity books are available for free at the park's visitor center, nature center, and campgrounds.

Beaver Tales

(30 minutes; talk)

Find out what makes this animal architect so amazing. Followed by a short Junior Ranger Ceremony where your Junior Ranger activity book will be reviewed and you can join in a group pledge to take care of Acadia. Hulls Cove Visitor Center – Intersection of Route 3 and Park Loop Road, north of Bar Harbor.

Boat Cruises

Rangers interpret the park from three of the many commercial boats in the area. Make reservations with boat operators. Wear warm clothing and arrive 30 minutes before departure. Ask boat operators about accessibility and details about other cruises offered.

Dive-In Theater Boat Cruise (3 hours)

Be on the lookout for wildlife above and below the surface of Frenchman Bay. Watch real-time underwater video as a diver scours the ocean floor for marine life to bring aboard the boat for hands-on exploration. College of the Atlantic Dock. Fee: \$45 adults, \$40 seniors, \$35 ages 5-11, \$20 ages under 5. For reservations on the Starfish Enterprise, call 800-979-3370 or international 212-209-3370.

Frenchman Bay Cruise (2 hours)

Climb aboard a majestic 151-foot, four-masted schooner and hoist the sails in search of wildlife and history. Bar Harbor Inn Pier. Fee: \$37.50 adults, \$35 seniors, \$27.50 ages 6–11, \$5 ages 2–5, infants free. Group rates (15 or more) available. For reservations on the Margaret Todd, call 207-288-4585.

Islesford Scenic & Historic Cruise (2 1/2 hours)

Discover the enduring connections between people and the sea with a visit to the Islesford Historical Museum on Little Cranberry Island. Along the way, cruise by wildlife hotspots and explore the scenic fjord of Somes Sound. Municipal Pier, Northeast Harbor. Fee: \$28 adults, \$26 seniors, \$18 ages 5-12, \$7 ages under 5, infants free. For reservations on the Sea Princess, call 207-276-5352.
