

African Burial Ground National Monument visitor center is open Tuesday through Saturday, 10 am to 4 pm. The entrance is mid-block on Broadway between Duane and Reade Streets. The memorial will reopen March 1, 2016 and operate Monday through Saturday, 9am to 5pm. The visitor center and memorial are closed on Thanksgiving and Christmas Day.
